My father was not a member and I did not join until I was in Austin serving as pastor of St. Edward's. It has been a great blessing to be associated with the Knights.

The first is the signs that were seen on store doors throughout St. Cloud stating that the store would be closed on Good Friday afternoon. Based on that youthful experience, I have been thinking about the viability of holding a Corpus Christi procession here in Owatonna. We'll see what comes of it.

I thank you for your warm welcome – as a pastor and as chaplain. I look forward to our continued collaboration in building up the Church and Catholic families here in Owatonna.
