St. Paul Outreach, Hockessin Community Center, House of Joseph, West End Neighborhood, Ministry of Caring Child Care Center, Sojourner's Place, Holy Spirit Church, Bayard House, Immaculate Conception of Elkton, Emmanuel Dining Room, Latin American Community Center, and Christ the King. New this year is St Patrick's food pantry in Wilmington.

How can you help? Sign up will be added to Coffee Run Calendar.

- Collect food in your neighborhood, office, parties, associations etc.
- Donate money to Soup-er bowl through Coffee Run K of C (Can prebuy in bulk)



- Save packing boxes at your house approximately 18" Wide by 12" Deep and 12" Tall +/-2"
- Volunteer Help needed in Mid -January to collect boxes from local liquor stores
- Volunteer -- Help needed before and after each

- Mass Feb 3-4 to collect money and to move donated food to the basement (collect at cornerstone too).

#### **INSURANCE**


Only Having Insurance "Through Work" Doesn't Work Do you know anyone whose life or career has drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? It's very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family or group of friends is facing financial uncertainty. Maybe there's a possibility that you (or your spouse) could change employers, or even lose your job.

Too many people have often relied on group term life insurance as their only safety net. Often, this insurance is an employee benefit provided at low or no cost. The existence of this coverage might convince someone that personally-owned life insurance is not necessary.

But only having "through work" insurance can leave you and your family vulnerable. Most group life insurance policies are limited in amount, which may be tied to salary or some other benchmark. These numbers are often capped, and this cap may be dangerously low when compared to your family's actual needs. In fact, a detailed needs analysis that evaluates your specific situation, will likely show that any employer-provided coverage falls short.

In addition, the amount of group insurance offered is almost always reduced, sometimes dramatically, when you retire. You could one day find yourself without coverage, and if your health has changed (which it will as

you age), you might also find yourself unable to secure individual protection. At the very least, it will definitely be more expensive. While group life insurance can help, it does not replace the need for individually owned life insurance.
