The virus that grips the world has, for the most part, turned human interaction into a virtual affair, while we struggle against a potent and silent enemy. COVID-19 has affected neighborhoods in cities and towns throughout the world.



The first known case in Meridian/Lauderdale County was announced last Wednesday and, as I write this article, there are now 6-10 known cases. I anticipate that number will rise in the days and weeks ahead. Please don't let the number of cases scare you. As availability to testing increases, the number of confirmed cases will also increase. That's not necessarily a bad thing... sometimes "not knowing" is worse than knowing and taking action!

As in all struggles, coronavirus brings out the good and bad in humanity. Doctors, nurses and first responders are engaging in great sacrifices to protect us. Others rush out to help by donating services and goods to those in need. Teachers and school administrators go the extra mile (and more) to help in the homeschool transition for children, I could go on, and on. Our Chaplain, Father Augustine, has established a daily phone conference prayer session Monday through Friday beginning at 4:45pm. We begin with Vespers (Evening Prayer) followed by the Holy Rosary on Monday through Thursday and Stations of the Cross on Friday's. Simply put aside any distractions, dial: (769) 206-1927 and join Father and others in concerted prayer for all who are being touched by COVID-19.

As you know, all of our (in-person) business meetings, Bingo and other events are cancelled indefinitely. Without Bingo we are not generating any revenue so, I will be working with our Trustees, other Officers and Past Grand Knights to navigate through our expenses and budget items. We are looking at options to conduct a virtual business meeting, to include voting, and hope to have a way forward very soon.

Supreme hosted a webinar Thursday, March 26th to address some of the challenges we are facing. We were already doing most of the thing that were addressed during the webinar, i.e., mass email notifications; phone trees to members/widows who are most vulnerable; telephone Rosary groups, etc. Items that were new to me and worth sharing include:

- Supreme initiative in work to allow ballot (secret) voting for people specific vote, i.e., elections.

- The Marion Icon is in a state of "pause." It will stay where it is now and when the "pause" is lifted, will go to where it was scheduled to be at that time. We were scheduled to have the Icon during Easter, but unfortunately, I anticipate it will pass us by this year.

- Supreme is looking at options for digital/virtual State Conventions to allow for elections of new State Officers, among other things.

CONTINUE TO PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE

Per the CDC, the best way to prevent infection is to avoid being exposed to this virus. We can reduce risk from respiratory viruses by:

- 1.) Appropriately washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
 - 2.) Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol
 - 3.) Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
