Dear Brother Knights,

Greetings from Fr Augustine Palimattam. Just want to say THANK YOU all for your support and prayers. I am glad and blessed to be the Chaplain of Council 802. Thank you for all that you do. May God continue to bless you.

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart. Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not adored as is the Sacred Heart of Jesus) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue.

I would like to remind you the Catholic Tradition of Consecration to the Immaculate heart of Mary. Pope Paul VI, on the floor of the Vatican Council at the close of the third session, renewed publicly the consecration of the Church and the world to Mary's Immaculate Heart.

The most essential thing is not making an act of consecration, with or without some solemnity,

though that is important. The essential thing is to live that consecration. Living a consecration could be described as following three attitudes or spirits:

- 1. Union Imitation of Jesus and Mary, so as to become like them, and trying to develop as constant as possible a realization of His and her presence.
- 2. Dependence Give to Jesus and Mary the right to dispose of everything we have, temporal and spiritual.
- 3. Obedience Jesus and Mary have the right to ask us to do anything at all, even without reward. In consecration, we recognize that right, give it on a basis of love, and plan to carry it out with fullest generosity.

Consecration is the fullest kind of response to and carrying out of these promises. (Curtesy to the Catholic Culture).

WTOK recently aired "On the Record" a disturbing topic "Suicide Awareness and Prevention". Suicide is becoming a big problem across the country and here at home. It's the 10th leading cause of death in the United States.

It's also the third leading cause of death for Mississippians age 15 to 34. Newscenter 11's Pat Peterson sat down with Dr. Lin Hogan from Weems Mental Health Center "On the Record" to talk about what we can do to reduce those numbers. He says one of the best things you can do is be watchful for depressed behavior and speak up.

"If you see that someone close to you, a friend, a family member or someone you're just

around, a coworker, is having a tough time, you may want to pull them off to the side and just say, 'you know what, why don't we talk for a second? I noticed that you're not handling some stress real well," Dr. Hogan explains.

If someone you know is struggling emotionally or having a hard time, you can be the difference in getting them the help they need. It's important to take care of yourself when you are supporting someone through a difficult time, as this may stir up difficult emotions. If it does, please reach out for support yourself.
