Members of Coffee Run Council held our Annual Donation Meeting on August 1st at which time we proposed donating \$24.800 among our Parish and 16 other worthy Charities & Programs. This represents a 33% increase over the previous year mainly due to the great success of our Council Golf Outing last September. The proposal was approved at our August Council Business Meeting and checks have been issued.

On the topic of charitable giving and volunteer hours, I attended the Supreme Convention in Baltimore this year, where the Supreme Knights Carl Anderson, share total charitable contributions and volunteer hours for Fraternal Year 2017/18:

Total Knights of Columbus Charitable Contributions were \$185 million. This was a 5% increase over the previous record of \$177 million set last fraternal year. And Knights provided 75.6 million volunteer hours, an increase of 500,00 hours. Last year, each Knight donated an average of 38.76 volunteer hours. Based on an independent source estimating that the value of a volunteer is \$24.69, this would mean that Knights gave nearly \$1.87 billion of their time.

This shows our strength in numbers and something we should all be proud of.
