LENT

We just finished with the Christmas season and it's already time for lent? That's right. Ash Wednesday is February 6!

Most people are surprised to learn that the "Forty Days of Lent" begin on the first Sunday of the season, not on Ash Wednesday. The 40th day is Holy Thursday, the day on which Lent ends and the Paschal Triduum begins. This method of counting 40 days comes from the earliest history of the Church.

But there is another 40-day period to consider — 40 days of fasting. Because Sundays are never days of fasting, the "Forty Days of Lent" (from the First Sunday to Holy Thursday) include only 34 fasting days. In the sixth century, the day we know as Ash Wednesday and the three days afterward were "added to this Lenten fast so that there would be 38 fasting days before the Paschal Triduum. The fasting days of the Triduum — Good Friday and Holy Saturday — are counted with Lent's 38 to total 40 day's of fasting before Easter Sunday.

Christian poets have called the 40 days —almost a tenth of the year — as a "tithe of days we offer to the lord. Poets have also described lent as quarantine — which literally means "40 days" — as a time for the Church to seek the appropriate therapy for whatever ails it. Saint John Chrysostom called fasting a "medicine." It keeps us healthy in body and soul.

Observing a 40-day fast models our lives after the lives of the Lord Jesus, of the Prophet Elijah, of the lawgiver Moses — each of whom fasted for days at the onset of their life's work. Each year we are invited to enter more deeply into a holy life. And even if we fail in our attempts — or especially if we fail — we can be sure that God will not.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION

Keep praying daily for the pre-born baby that you spiritually adopted who is in danger of being aborted.

Four Month Developing Baby

Well, your little baby now weighs 6 ounces. He has fingernails and eyelashes. He has his own unique fingerprints which will remain unchanged until he dies. His taste buds are working.

His sense of hearing is present at 14 weeks. There are no major body developments anymore. Your spiritually adopted baby is already well-formed, internally and externally. All he needs now is time to gain weight and grow strong.

Five Month Developing Baby

Your spiritually adopted baby weighs one pound now. His mother can feel him moving now. Before he was too small for her to feel. Although he swam with ease before in his watery world, he needed to be big and strong enough to kick hard against the outside uterine wall and dent it - the inside wall of the uterus has no feeling.

We are mid-way through the pregnancy now. Your prayers have helped your baby's mother continue with her pregnancy and seek the help she needs.

RESPECT LIFE NEWS

Abortion Advocates Drop House Provisions To Promote International Abortions

Abortion advocates in Congress have officially given up their fight to over turn President Bush's Pro-Life limits on making taxpayers fund groups that perform or promote abortions overseas. Democratic leaders in the House have removed a provision from their spending bills that would have weakened the Mexico City Policy. This policy has been in place since the Reagan administration, with the exception of the Clinton years. It insures the State Department doesn't reward the abortion business or pro-life groups with family planning gifts. They removed the pro abortion language from the 2008 foreign aid budget.

This victory was credited to Congressman Chris Smith, Senator Sam Brownback, and pro-life Democrat Representative Pat Strupch and other pro life congressmen.
