SUPER BOWL XLV POOL

- 1. The cost to enter will be \$5 per box.
- 2. Put initials in box of your choosing and fill out entrant information.
- 3. All boxes must be sold prior to Super Bowl Sunday. If all 100 boxes are not sold, the remaining boxes will be bought by the council.
- 4. Numbers will be randomly picked when all boxes are sold.
- 5. Filled in grid and only initials and names will be emailed to all entrants. All other information will not be forwarded. (Those without email will need to make arrangements to obtain a copy of this information.)
- 6. Prizes will be awarded to the owners of the boxes matching the scores at the end of each quarter, and distributed as follows: \$25 for the 1st and 3rd quarter scores, \$75 for the half time and 4th Quarter scores and \$300 for the final score. If the 4th quarter does not end in a tie the 4th quarter and final prize money will be combined.
