CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



I pray that 2012 has begun with blessings for all of you and your families; may they continue throughout the year. Just as we begin this new year of our lives, so too do we begin Ordinary Time in the Church's year. Ordinary Time is anything but ordinary; rather it gains its name from the word ordinal, as in to be numbered. So these are simply the weeks that are numbered and not part of the other five major church seasons. During these weeks we go through the Holy

Scriptures, especially following the life of Jesus in the Gospels.

This year we will go through Cycle B which will be taken mostly from the Gospel of Mark. January 15th, however, is taken from the Gospel of John and depicts the call of the Apostles slightly differently than the other accounts. It points out that when Andrew hears of the Messiah's arrival, he first goes to get his brother Simon, who we know as Peter, to meet Jesus.

This subtle detail points out two things I think worth noting. First, it depicts the humble spirit that we as brother Knights ought to have: that we should be trying to bring our brothers to Christ. In this light, an excellent goal for us in the New Year is to bring in new members and to bring all of our brothers to Christ. But the second point is also important. Each of the Gospel accounts of Jesus' life that we will listen to in the numbered weeks ahead, not only have a familiar story but, have specific details like this account from John, which we probably have not paid attention to in the past. I invite you to listen to what God is trying to tell you in the details. I pray that the details of the Life of Christ may help each of us in our day to day life.

ROSARY FOR LIFE – FEBRUARY 11

Witness the power of prayer! Join the Knights of Columbus on Saturday, December 10, from 8:45 a.m. to 10 a.m. on Bloomfield Ave. in Montclair, in front of the Social Security building, opposite the Pilgrim Abortion Clinic where abortions have increased from 100 to over 150 a week. We gather to pray the rosary that mothers will not abort their babies. We meet the second Saturday of every month. Come spend as much time as you have. Surely you have one hour to pray that the life of a pre-born baby be spared. Your prayers and presence will and have saved baby's lives! Bring your families.

ROSE SUNDAYS

In December and January at St. Catherine's and Our Lady of the Lake Churches, respectively, our council collected money by selling red lapel roses. The red rose symbolizes the blood of the pre-born babies that are killed by abortion. We asked for a donation of \$5 or whatever they can afford. We use the proceeds for:

- Nellie Gray's March For Life Committee in Washington DC (Nellie Gray is the principal organizer of the March For Life for 38 years).
- Birthright of Essex County in Bloomfield.
- To buy food for the joint bus trip to Washington DC with the Montclair Council.

This year we collected \$800 and 125 signatures from St. Catherine of Siena, and \$1175 and 214 signatures from Our Lady of the Lake. We are sending \$850 to the March for Life committee, \$425 to Birthright, and \$700 for the council food expenses for the bus trip (breakfast, lunch, & dinner).

SUPER BOWL XLVI POOL

Once again, our council will be running a Super Bowl football pool. This is a basic grid pool that many are familiar with. The grid has 100 boxes, set up in a 10 x 10 grid. Each box will be randomly assigned two numbers, one for each conference, from 0 to 9. If your box has the ending digits at the end of a quarter you win the associated prize money.

For example: You chose a box and it is designated as NFC 4 and AFC 7, at the end of the 1st quarter the score is NFC 14 and AFC 17, which means, you win.

Super Bowl XLVI Pool Rules

- 1. The cost to enter will be \$10 per box.
- 2. Put initials in box of your choosing and fill out entrant information.
- 3. All boxes must be sold prior to Super Bowl Sunday. If all 100 boxes are not sold, the remaining boxes will be bought by the council.
- 4. Numbers will be randomly picked when all boxes are sold.
- 5. Filled in grid and only initials and names will be emailed to all entrants. All other information will not be forwarded. (Those without email will need to make arrangements to obtain a copy of this information.)
- 6. Prizes will be awarded to the owners of the boxes matching the scores at the end of each quarter, and distributed as follows: \$50 for the 1st and 3rd quarter scores, \$150 for the half time and 4th Quarter scores and \$600 for the final score. If the 4th quarter does not end in a tie the 4th quarter and final prize money will be combined.
- 7. Checks will be mailed to winners.
