This begins with the Department of Health and Human Services demanding that all employers, including Catholic employers, offer insurance coverage that includes sterilization, abortion-inducing drugs, and contraception. But what it can mean going forward is that even though we might have a belief and teaching, the Government will decide what we can and cannot do about those beliefs. Do not allow your freedom to be taken away. Please take the time to be observant in prayer and speak out against this legislation. Write to your elected representatives. And inform others of why this is so important. The Fortnight for Freedom prayer occurs as we celebrate in our liturgical calendar, many great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution including: St. John Fisher, St. Thomas More, St. John the Baptist, Ss. Peter and Paul, and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome. Let us take courage from these great men and women and in their name let us stay true to our faith as we seek the freedom to continue to express it.

# **NJ STATE K OF C CONVENTION 2012**

The weather for the weekend was lovely. The temperature was in the 70's with a light breeze blowing. Our council was honored with two plaques. The first one was for collecting \$5300 for Alzheimers, which garnered us the distinction of #1 in the state. The second plague was for once again collecting over \$10,000 for the Special Citizens/ Mentally Challenged Drive. There are 360 councils in NJ. Out of these, 215 councils collected \$683,004.77 Only twelve councils collected over \$10,000. We were #12. The highest amount collected by one council was \$20,000. Congratulations to our council.

The hospitality room was hosted by Fairfield council this year. They did a wonderful job and didn't run out of anything.

#### SPECIAL CITIZENS DRIVE

Our council has reached the \$10K plateau 9 out of the last 10 years, for a total exceeding \$1000,000. This year's total was \$10,135.
