CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

This morning I was reflecting on God's beautiful creation and as I contemplated the snow on the ground in some areas, melting and muddy in others, I noticed a small bush trying to bud. This seemingly dead group of sticks growing from the ground was bringing new life into the world and becoming a new creation in God. Isn't this the perfect image to reflect on this Lent? Not only are we called to examine our own way of life and recognize what is in need of being shed, but also we need to see in what ways we may bud new life and form ourselves anew in the image and manner which Christ Himself has shown us. As we are now more than half way through our Lenten pilgrimage, I pray you have been strong in your resolve and that you commit yourself even more now in this little remaining time we have left.

That you might be assisted in your journey, I encourage you to take advantage of something Archbishop Myers has begun new this year in the Archdiocese of Newark. This year, parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Newark, which consists of the counties of Essex, Union, Hudson, and Bergen, have been asked to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Wednesday evenings throughout Lent from 7 to 8pm. I know both Our Lady of the Lake and St. Catherine's are participating in this program. Just as St. Paul urges us, "Be reconciled to God," I encourage you to take advantage of the healing power of God in this Sacrament. May it assist you in becoming a truly new creation and bring with it the joy God promises. The Diocese of Paterson (Counties of Passaic, Morris, and Sussex) has already begun a practice of offering Reconciliation on Monday evenings throughout Lent if you find yourself more conveniently located.

In addition to preparing ourselves this Lent, Holy Mother Church will be going through a process of renewal as she finds herself in this place known as "Sede Vacante," or "Vacant See," following the resignation of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. This is the first resignation of a Pope since Pope Gregory XII in 1415. Though resignation may not be common, the process of electing the new Pope is the same in the case of resignation or death of the Pope. The process has become known as the Conclave since 1271 when 18 Cardinals gathered to elect the new Pope, who would be Pope Gregory X. During their gathering, they were locked in by the townspeople after they became frustrated that there had been no Pope since the death of Pope Clement IV two years and nine months earlier in 1268. No worries on the 117 Cardinals gathering this year taking that long though, 20th century elections have averaged only 3 days and the longest was 4 days in 1922. This is certainly encouraged by the rationing of food and provisions provided to the Cardinals should it go beyond 4 days. Let us pray fervently, that the Holy Spirit will be on fire in the hearts of the Cardinals as they vote for the next Pope. As they gather for Conclave beginning March 12th, may God guides them and provide for us a truly Good and Holy Shepherd after His own heart.

Many of you have probably lived through several Conclaves including: John XXIII in 1958, Paul VI in 1963, John Paul I in 1978, John Paul II in 1978, and Benedict XVI 2005. As we live through this exciting time, I invite you to look at this process of electing the new Pope as a process of renewal. Just as you yourselves are journeying through Lent, humbling and refocusing yourself on God and His love, so also see that God, through the humbling of Pope Benedict XVI, is inviting the Church to stand strong. With all of the news and publicity, the world can't help but hear about the Catholic Church, may it true that there is no such thing as bad press. Despite those who will try to convict the Church by the actions of the few, see the promise of God's providence in this journey. That together in this Easter season Holy Mother Church and each of us through our own Lenten journey, will have great reason for rejoicing in the Lord who promises us all eternal life.
