CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



Advent can indeed be an <u>adventure</u> if you allow yourself to take advantage of these few weeks to prepare yourself for the coming of the Lord. But, did you know that we are actually preparing for 2 things during Advent? Most people know we are preparing for Christmas, however, this is only the later part of Advent, about the last week or two. The first three weeks of Advent are actually a time for us to prepare for the 2nd Coming of Christ as Judge of the living and the dead at the end of the world. The readings, from both the Old and New Testament at Mass, each day remind us of the coming of a Savior, with specific reference to the end of time. Only after December 17th will the readings begin to focus on the Nativity of Jesus, the Word made Flesh, the Light of the world coming into our darkness. This is symbolized by the Pink Candle on the 3rd Sunday of Advent; the light has penetrated the world and lightened the dark purple.

And so I ask you, are you preparing? Would you be ready if Jesus came today and called you by name? These are difficult questions. At first many might judge ourselves to be unworthy, calling to mind so many of our sins. Or we might we might at first not recall our sins but think of the charitable works we have done and believe ourselves worthy because of the good things we have done. But scripture reminds us Christ sees both the good and the bad we have done. He tells us, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." (Mk 1:15) Or in another place, "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the Kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven." (Mt 7:21)

As we make ready our homes for Christmas, I challenge you to take up the adventure of Advent. Consider attending daily Mass or at least meditating on the daily scriptures. You might find them online at http://usccb.org/bible/. Use them to prepare your heart, not only for the coming of the Baby Jesus at Christmas and His Light shining into your heart, but also that you may prepare yourself for His 2nd coming, that you might be deemed worthy to enter the Kingdom of heaven. Find yourself longing for reconciliation for the times you have not followed God's commands and bring yourself to the Sacrament where He shows His mercy and forgiveness. Allow yourself to be healed and strengthened to spread the Good News!

I wish you and your families a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! May God fill your lives and your homes with many blessings.

As of last month there were 4050 abortions performed this year at that facility with 139"saves". That is more than Verona, Cedar Grove, and West Orange high schools combined of kids that "could have been", with about 4 or 5 classrooms of kids that "will be there".
