CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



May is a month dedicated to Mary, the Mother of Our Lord and of each of us. Pope Francis has asked all of us to say the Rosary at least once during this month. Though some wondered why we praise Mary, for those of us who believe, it is only fitting that we give honor to the chosen servant of God, who in saying yes, has worked as his mediator to reveal God in all of His Glory to the world through Jesus Christ her son. As she learned from Him and followed Him through His Passion to His death on the Cross, Jesus gave to each of us Mary as our mother. She is now always working as an intercessor for us and truly a blessed model of holiness for us to follow in saying yes to God.

During this season of Easter as we continue to read, especially at Mass, the Acts of the Apostles and relearn what had happened in the early days of the Church after the first Easter on which Jesus rose from the dead, there are many characters and people we might choose to use as an example of holiness to model after. One lesser known character I might offer to you is Ananias. Ananias is a simple man whom we know little of except that he is mentioned by name, for it is written, "The Lord said to him in a vision, "Ananias." He answered, "Here I am, Lord."" (Acts 9:10) And it is at this point that God will ask him to pray and anoint Saul. Ananias is fearful knowing that Saul is persecuting and killing anyone who believes in Jesus. But, Ananias goes to pray for him anyway so as to follow God's calling. In this humble way, he has changed the world. For though buildings have fallen and nations have expanded and slipped away, indeed though the world has changed many times over in the past 2000 years, what has been steadfast in its growth is the faith of the world in Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church which owes everything to one of its earliest disciples Paul; whose letters and preaching went everywhere and continue to be the largest portion of the single greatest source of God's revelation to us. But, if Ananias is not open to God's calling, if Ananias is not humble enough to recognize the importance of such a small role in salvation history, and if Ananias is not courageous enough to say yes to God's call, to bring Good News and Prayers to someone who did not believe but persecuted the Church, then it is easy to imagine that we may have never heard the Good News.

Let us take example of the courage and humility of both Mary and Ananias who said yes to God no matter what He asks us to do. I hope we have all had wonderful examples of this in our lives through our mother's. As we celebrate Mother's Day let us be thankful for their examples and let us honor them and all mothers for saying yes to God's gift of life.

With this visible and prayerful support, many mothers have changed their minds over these past ten years. If the reasonable average number of turnarounds was one per month, 120 babies' lives have been saved. That is four classrooms of 30 children!
