CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



This January marks 42 years that abortion has been made legal in this country, and more importantly 42 years of prayers, rallies, fundraisers, protests, and other efforts to help people to realize the value of human life and the importance of countering this and other decisions that have been an attack on human life. In these past 42 years, we could chose to focus on the negative, meaning that there have been more than 56 million abortions since 1973. Or we could choose to focus on the positive. Yes, by positive I mean the work done by our council and others like us,

working in many areas with other groups to promote life and yes even to have a few saves each year. I refer to the overwhelming tide of public opinion, which seems to be changing as the latest statistics show that more than 84% of people believe it should be restricted to some degree. As we start to see that this is a war that is far from over and a battle with no more noble a cause than to fight for the life of the unborn, we see that we need to recommit ourselves, not only as a council but individually. What steps have you made to help spread this Good News about Life? Have you been to pray with our group to Montclair to pray for saves? Have you been wearing your Rose and telling people about its meaning? Have you prayed mothers and fathers? For the babies? Have you recently or ever joined us on the bus trip on Jan. 22nd to Washington DC to stand up and march with others in support of the cause? Have you ever been to Trenton? Have you gone to the Cathedral in Newark for the Pro-Life Mass, this year on Jan. 18th at Noon? All of these and there are many others are ways that you can support this important effort to help turn that 84% into 100% support. Important ways to slow and eventually stop the more than 1 million murders each year.

It is also important to remember that this is only one aspect of what it means to Respect Life. Life is precious at every stage of development from the moment of conception until natural death and beyond. Our efforts need to be focused on such a wide variety of efforts that include these but so many more like fostering those who chose to have their children even in difficult situations through efforts such as Several Sources Shelters. By collecting and volunteering to help those who are unable to take advantage of all that life has to offer. And yes, for defending life until its natural end and allowing death with dignity that allows one to come to their natural end, rather than disguising it as suicide or murder.

You my friends and brother knights are fine examples of what it means to uphold and work for important causes like this that effect unjustly so many. I know that you will rally to push this cause forward and pray that more will come to the same Respect for Life that we share as Knights of Columbus and as Catholics.
