As we store away our Christmas decorations and enjoy the last of our holiday treats, we take with us the beautiful memories that God has bestowed on us when we celebrated the birth of Emmanuel, God with us. Other than a few poinsettias in front of our Altar and the last of Panettone I have in my refrigerator, I can see there are constant reminders that God is with us as He promised and the

birth of His son is the birth of the light of the world. As a side note, however, keep this in mind; in many countries and cultures the Christmas season extends till Mardi Gras or the feast of the presentation of the Lord, Feb. 2. But, as this Christmas season does come to a close, perhaps we can reflect on some words, insights and reflections of our Blessed Mother Mary.
