CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



Peace and blessings to you!

As we come to the conclusion of May I'm drawn to reflect one of the greatest flowers in the garden of our Lord, The Blessed Virgin Mary. The month of May is dedicated to her in a special way.

Our parish school has retained the very beautiful tradition of doing a "May Crowning". That's the crown on the head of Our Lady on the statue in our shrine room. Giving honor and prominence to Mary is so important in our

Catholic lives. I stress the word "Catholic" as not all Christians are on the same page in our understanding, respect

and reverence for the mother of Jesus.

Dear Friends.

We all know that St. Joseph, her husband, is known as the silent saint in the scriptures and for good reason. He says nothing! Not exaggerating here. He literally says nothing. His actions speak louder than words. Mary's not too far behind. Although her words are very few, there are a few instances where Mary speaks. The encounter Mary had with the Angel Gabriel during the annunciation can be summed up in one word; "YES", or better in Latin "FIAT". Her fiat was more than just an agreement with the Angel. Mary responded to the angel Gabriel with the understanding of "let it be done to me as God wills". Our spiritual mother then journeys to visit her kinswoman, Elizabeth, at the angel's bidding and there reminds us that the Jesus that lives inside of each of us is meant to be shared. Upon meeting Elizabeth, Mary utters her great prayer of praise, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord". This "magnificat" gives us such a great insight into Mary's soul. She feels humbled, blessed and acknowledges God's power through her lowliness. When Jesus enters his pre-teen years, Mary and Joseph find him in the temple area speaking, debating, and challenging the religious leadership. After having been lost for a few days, Mary asks "Where have you been? I've been looking for you." And finally we hear Mary's last spoken words in the Scriptures at the wedding feast of Cana. When the wine ran out, Mary instructed the head waiter, "Do whatever He (Jesus) tells you".

YES/FIAT: Are we living our lives in a spirit of Mary's Fiat? Yes, not according to my will but His.

WHERE HAVE YOU BEEN, I'VE BEEN LOOKING FOR YOU: Do we realize that Mary is continually working to bring souls to her son? When we're spiritually lost, the comfort of our spiritual mother wraps us in her maternal mantle and carries us to Jesus.

DO WHATEVER HE TELLS YOU: Before Jesus tells us that He is the way, truth and the life, his mother and our mothers tells us to do whatever He tells us.

As Mary's month comes to an end can I make these few suggestions: pray a family rosary or at least a decade, make a family visit to the shrine in our parish church, research and study the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the patroness of our parish, learn about a new Marian devotion (how about Our Lady Undoer of Knots - Pope Francis' favorite Marian devotion), create a shrine dedicated to the mother of Jesus in your home - a statue or image of your favorite title of Mary or perhaps an outdoor shrine of Mary on the half shell, as I often jokingly say.
