DIAPERS AND WIPES NEEDED

Did you know that 40% of woman who choose abortion do so for financial reasons? They feel they are unable to financially provide for a baby. Pro Lifers are often accused of only caring for the unborn while not providing support once the baby is born. Nothing could be further from the truth. As Knights, we must also care for the new mother and her child.

Lighthouse Pregnancy Centers in Hackensack, Hawthorne and Paterson are very low on baby wipes and diapers at their centers locations. These are very important to have available to mothers who've kept their babies and need some help with diapers and wipes. The Hawthorne facility is only open once a month to accept donations - but they moved their center to 2025 Hamburg Turnpike, Suite L (in back section/lower level) Wayne, NJ 07470 and they too are in real need of wipes and diapers as they give out to each mother and or father who come into the center. Please also note that they have different hours at each facility and only Paterson and Hackensack have Saturday hours.
