ENTRUSTED WITH THE FUTURE

The Knights of Columbus Organizational Meeting of State Deputies was held June 4-8 in New Haven, Conn. During his opening address, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson emphasized the importance of councils working closely with their pastors and parishes. He also stressed the new Faith In Action program model and its connection to our Building the Domestic Church programs.

OUR NEW PROGRAM MODEL — FAITH IN ACTION

"What the Knights of Columbus is doing in thousands of different ways every day is putting our faith in action. Putting our faith in action in ways that people see and understand and know bring value to people's lives, bring value to our communities, bring value to our country — whichever country we are living in."

BUILDING THE DOMESTIC CHURCH

"Pope Benedict told us that the Church has three missions. It has a mission to pray, it has a mission to evangelize, and it has a mission of charity. Our domestic church program simply says the Catholic family has the same mission. It has the mission to pray together, it has the mission to build up each other in the faith, and it has the mission to practice charity among the members of the family and for the family to reach out to other families. How many fewer individual Catholic families would be broken and suffering if we could get our families to pray more, build up each other in the faith, forgive, reconcile and practice charity?"

BUILDING CATHOLICISM, NOT COLUMBIANISM

"What Father McGivney laid out was not the principles of a men's club or the principles of a secret society. It was a principled way of life for men to live their Catholic faith. We are not just building Columbianism, we are building Catholicism. ... Is that not the spiritual genius of Father McGivney? To understand how to build a way of life for men that goes to the central core of what it means to be a Catholic."

Last week our Holy Father Pope Francis made a ground breaking statement regarding our Catholic understanding of Life. The official catechism of the Catholic Church will now read that it is inconsistent with a pro-life stance to allow for capital punishment for any reason. Although this statement seems new and "cutting edge" the meaning and concept is nothing original. Our two previous Holy Fathers, Pope St. John Paul II and Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, preached the same message. The only difference is the incorporation of what's been previously into the official catechism.

My first reaction to this news was a greater appreciation for our current Holy Father as the "pope of mercy". Pope Francis dares to ask us difficult questions and fine tunes what we believe, preach and practice in such a "real" and "pastoral" way. In my role as director of prison ministry for the Archdiocese of Newark, I receive this news with great joy. I often pray with and minister to individuals with life sentences and have been inspired by many who have found God in the lowest points of their lives. As Catholics and Knights of Columbus we often preach and teach the sanctity of all human life from conception to natural death. Now Pope Francis makes it official!
