

My Dear People of St. Ann Parish,

I pray that all of you are well. Fr. Greg, Seminarian Kevin and I are all well and are continuing our prayers for you each day.

This has been another difficult week. Hearing about the numbers infected with the COVID 19 Virus going up, those who have died, and the necessary closing of businesses and places of work, leads us to a great sense of insecurity and worry. However, as people of Faith, we keep our trust in the Lord, Who guides all things and works all out to good for those who believe.

We received further instructions from the Bishop's Office which brought great sadness to our hearts. There will be no public celebration of Palm Sunday, the Easter Triduum or Easter Sunday this year. In fact, the Good Friday Solemn Liturgy and the Easter Vigil will not be celebrated at all. Those preparing to enter the Church, will be Baptized, Confirmed and receive the Eucharist at a later date to be determined. At St. Ann Parish, we have 19 people waiting to be received into the Church, an amazing number. Please keep them in your prayers.

The Priestly ordinations which normally occur on the First Saturday of May have also been delayed. Pray for the 5 men waiting to become Priests for our Diocese.

But perhaps the saddest news this week was the temporary closure of our Parish Office and the temporary lay-off of our Parish Staff. With the church and office closed and Masses cancelled, in consultation with our Finance Council, we felt we had no option. Pray for our staff. They are amazing people who serve our Parish wonderfully.

We look forward to the day when we are all back to work, serving God, His Church and His people.

Not wanting this to be all sad or bad news, we are happy to announce that the renovations to the church made possible by the One Heart One Soul campaign are continuing. The organ was moved to the loft this week, check out the video on our Facebook page. The new sound system will probably start being installed next week and the interior of the church will be painted starting April 20. We are still alive and active, filled with lots of hope for the future of our

parish. May God continue to bless all of us and the good work that is done in and through St. Ann Parish.

Even though our Parish Staff are no longer here physically to join us for the Rosary, Fr. Greg, Seminarian Kevin and I are continuing to pray the Holy Rosary each day for all of you, but now we are praying it at 4:45 p.m. Let us continue to unite together in pleading with our Blessed Lady for her motherly protection. Fr. Greg, Seminarian Kevin and I continue to be here for you. Call or email us, we are happy to stay in touch. Pope: COVID-19 teaches us we are one human community

In an interview with Italy's daily newspaper "La Stampa", Pope Francis describes the sorrow and pain caused by the coronavirus pandemic, and emphasizes the importance of prayer.

In the interview with "La Stampa", published on Friday, Pope Francis speaks of the sorrow and pain that "everyone" is experiencing due to the coronavirus. The only way to survive this situation, he says, is by sticking together. The Pope invites us to live this moment "with penance, compassion and hope". We need "humility", he adds, "because too often we forget" there are dark times in life as well. "We think they can only happen to someone else. But these times are dark for everyone", he says. Pope Francis explains that the season of Lent "trains us to show solidarity with others, especially those who suffer". Prayer

The Pope emphasizes the importance of prayer, recalling how the Apostles turn to Jesus to save them during the storm (Mark 4:35-41). "Prayer helps us understand our vulnerability", he says. "It is the cry of those who are sinking, who feel they are in danger and alone. And in a difficult, desperate situation, it is important to know that the Lord is there to cling to".

All are suffering

Pope Francis makes no distinction between "believers and non-believers". People are weeping because they are suffering, he says. "Everyone" is suffering. "We are all children before God", he adds. Those dying without loved ones

The Pope then speaks of those who are dying alone and without the comfort of their families. He says he was struck by the story of an elderly woman who said her final goodbye to her loved ones over a phone belonging to one of the nurses. "The pain of those who have died without saying goodbye becomes a wound in the hearts of those who are left behind", says Pope Francis. He thanks "all the nurses, doctors and volunteers who, despite their incredible exhaustion", offer themselves, "with patience and kindness" to stand in for family members who cannot be there.

Pope Francis also addresses the consequences of the coronavirus pandemic for our future. The current crisis will help to remind us "once and for all, that humanity is a single community", he says. It will teach us that "universal kinship" is important and critical. We should think about it like a "post-war" phenomenon, he says: "It will no longer be 'them'. It will be 'us'. Because we can only come out of this situation together". Pope Francis concludes saying: "We will need to look even more closely at our roots: our grandparents, the elderly". We will need "to build true kinship amongst us".
