Lecturer's Talk: Michael Creaghan - Blessed are the Peacemakers, December 2020

Over 70 million people voted for Trump in the last election. No matter what information was given to them they either didn't believe or didn't care. This electorate is so polarized that it supported Trump regardless of what he did or said. Trump has a narcissistic personality as shown in his total disregard for truth, moral values, human rights, racial justice, the family and the environment. Among those 70 millions who supported Trump many are Catholic. And many of these are single issue Catholics who oppose abortion. Since Trump, supposedly, opposes abortion they voted for him along with the fundamentalist Christian right. He attracted all the self interest groups such as ultra right, the NRA, Americans for Prosperity, the Kato institute, racists and white supremacists. Trump found millions of new voters as well as driving millions to the other side. Polarizing risks repelling more than it attracts. The GOP is now in shambles controlled by self serving factions. Hopefully, Joe Biden can unify Americans with renewed hope and opportunity. And hopefully, those single minded Catholics will now open their minds and hearts and see the Church as universal and welcoming to all.

Abortion is on one side and Pro Life and Pro Choice is in the other side. The right to abortion is the law and is is not going to change. All the rallies and marches opposing abortion have done more harm than good, for all they have done is polarize each side. Pro Life supports life in all its stages from conception to natural death. Pro abortion says all women have control over their body and a bunch of foolish old men are not going to tell them otherwise. These positions are presented as black and white, right and wrong, good and bad , vice and virtue with no compromise.

Pro Life and Pro Choice are not opposites or at least they should not be opposites. The foundation for all societies is the family and children. This is natural law. It is not a moral issue. Western societies are in serious trouble because the birth rate is dropping. Consequently the population is aging and will soon not be able to sustain itself.

Women in our society are having abortions because they believe they have no choice. In their minds it is not Pro Choice but no choice. Their decisions appear rational, for bringing a child into this world could be raising a child with no hope and no opportunity for either mother or child . She is condemned to live a life on welfare and in poverty. Many in our society and our churches have made this a moral issue. It is wrong to have an abortion and yet on the other hand we don't want to look after you if you have the baby. It's condemning the poor.

Post second world war was the baby boom. There was lots of work and the economy was growing. There was a large middle class where families could afford a house on one income. Most mothers stayed home while their children were young. Food was relatively cheap as there were few expensive prepared foods. Education was free, health care was affordable, kids played outside and were on lots of teams. Churches were full and church related activities were strong. The result was having families of three or four children was the norm. Children were desired and were the most precious element in our society. What has changed? Rural communities are disappearing and cities are growing. The result is that affordable housing in large municipalities is out of range for many families. To afford a home requires two incomes. Success today requires more education which increases student debt which in turn delays having families. Women are more career oriented and having children may inhibit their progress. The result is a delay in having their first child and rarely having more than two children. There is a difficult and unfair decision placed on women now, who are having to balance having children and/or having a career. The other reality is excessive consumerism of wanting everything now. This has greatly increased personal debt. The result is that people cannot afford to have children.

The total fertility rate (TFR) for women (according to Stats-Canada) in 2019 was 1.47 births. In comparison the TFR for women in 1959 was 3.94 births. The maintenance rate is 2.1 births. The average age of women having their first child now is between 30 and 34, where in 1959 it was 20 to 24. To have a thriving economy we need children. Priorities have to change. Our society has to put families and children first. Canada is a wealthy country yet it has 1.3 million children living in poverty, that is 1 in 5 . In single parent families it rises to 1 in 3. In our First Nations the poverty rate is even higher. Certainly, this is not putting families and children first.

There are no simple solutions, but there are solutions. Families, neighbourhoods, communities and all levels of government have to make children their number one priority. This may appear to be a socialist agenda but in the long run it will create wealth. Every child is entitled to healthy food, shelter , education, play and health care. Having a child shouldn't automatically put the mother and child into poverty which is too frequent now. She needs support from her partner and extended family. She will also need the help of community and outreach organizations. She needs affordable housing, food and daycare. She needs the opportunity to work and/or continue her education. Her children need places to play and grow. In future owning your own home may not be possible for most Canadian families, but affordable housing should be available. There should be a minimum family income where people are not dependent on food banks. There should be affordable day care. In Quebec, for example, where daycare is very cheap mothers are able to go back to work and this has created wealth.

Pro Choice is choosing to have and raise children in a community that welcomes, cares and values children. Remember "It takes a village to raise a child".
