# Council Events:

**35th Bishop's Dinner Dance :** This event will be on Saturday March 07, 2020. As In the past, if a member purchases a ticket for \$70.00 the spouse's ticket is free. If we cannot sell all the tickets we are able to return the unsold tickets. A total of 13 tickets sold to date. Now is the last chance for any member to purchase tickets. Please contact Henry Van Vroenhoven asap if you are interested in attending.

**Good Friday Fish Fry:** We are looking into more information in order to schedule this event for April 10th 2020. Since the Lake Erie Hotel no longer provides this service, we are exploring alternative suppliers.

We made contact with The Sherwood Restaurant and Catering in Brantford who will provide the service if approved by our council. Our cost for Pollock is \$14.95 each and for Haddock \$16.95. We will need to add our profit on to that number. All dinners include, fries and cole slaw and anything else (bread rolls and salads) we may wish to include. The event will be held in the church hall and Sherwood will provide the trays and chafing containers and we will provide the utensils, disposable plates and glasses. All the cooking will be done outside by Sherwood personnel.

Initially, the intent was to have two sittings for approximately 115 to 125 per sitting. Tables and chairs which we have will be required plus 2 extra refreshment tables to serve water and soft drinks and possibly alcoholic beverages such as wine and beer (currently under consideration only). The Church Services are at 3:00 pm and 7:30 pm. The times recommended for the fish fry was for 4:30 pm and 6:00 pm to accommodate those attending the church services.

Todd Hornby and Alan Wong have volunteered to head this event and further planning will be required to set this up in a timely fashion.

It was determined that the time allocated for the events may be too short to effectively accommodate all parishioners attending masses. Our current thought is to now have only e 1 sitting for up to 125 people (time to be determined) and have a robust **take out service** capability, during and after both church mass celebrations. All this will need to be discussed and debated with the committee.

**Tastes of Ancaster:** A committee has yet to be formed. The date is changed to Thursday April 30, 2020 To make the a successful event, we will need approximately 25 volunteers including committee members. Tickets to sell for \$50.00 per person but a \$45.00 Early Bird price will be provided. Scott Rastin

and Mike Reilly are the only committee members at this time and more members are encouraged to volunteer for an expanded committee.
