Lecturer's Talk: Michael Creaghan WILL YOU BE MY FRIEND?

When my children were very young they always watched and listened to Mr. Rogers Neighbourhood. They probably listened more than watched as they played. It was just comforting hearing his voice. Mr. Rogers always started by saying, "Will you be my friend?"

While walking in the Dundas Valley, I pass people, smile and wish them well. They always smile and wish me well. It is the only time now that I see people without their face covered as they are outside and at a distance. I realize how important a beautiful smile is. It is a very simple statement of our humanity.

Loneliness is now the plague in our society. The Coronavirus has accelerated and accentuated this loneliness. So many people in nursing homes are more lonely than ill. They believe that they have been abandoned by their family and given into the care of someone else. And, now, even when dying, they cannot see their loved ones. This is the way our western society works.

In most other societies the elderly stay with their children. Jean Vanier has been a great influence on me. He is a man of empathy and spirituality. He recognizes God's love for all humanity. When I am selfish and inconsiderate, which is often, his spirit stings my conscience. Information has recently been revealed that for a long time he had a double life. He had sexual relations with several of his staff. He was in a position of power and authority which he abused. The executives at l'Arche were very proactive and did not sweep it under the carpet. There is no justification for Vanier's actions. But I ask, if God's judgment on him is harsh, what chance do any of us have. Please, let us celebrate all his wonderful accomplishments. Vanier did so much good, founding l'Arche communities all over the world (147 in 35 countries with 2 in Hamilton). He was a brilliant motivator and author of several books. He cared for the mentally challenged and disenfranchised who everyone else had abandoned. In 2015 he received the Templeton Award for Humanitarianism and Spiritualism (approximately \$3 million). This is what he accomplished but the man was much more. Vanier had a genius of spirit, an open minded and caring spirit of humility. He lived the belief that even the most humble tasks can be truly extraordinary. You perform these everyday tasks as acts of compassion and joy. The emphasis is on joy. The joy of loving and caring for the dispossessed in our society and doing this as a community. Now, please, let us re-evaluate and appreciate the front line workers in our nursing homes.

Vanier's emphasis for all of us is that we are social beings needing love, both to accept and to give. And as social beings we give love and receive love through family and community. His underlying principle is that all humans are sacred and loved by God. Today, loneliness is so much a part of our society.

You can listen to Jean Vanier's talks on our common humanity and our loneliness on the internet. In 1998, gave the Massey Lectures at the University of Toronto. Listen, you will really enjoy and come away with a spirit of hope. What was relevant then is even more relevant now. Google CBC Massey Lectures, Jean Vanier. 3 parts each about half an hour each.

And from his sister Teresa who began Palliative Care hospices all over England her prayer;

May oppressed people, and those who oppress them, set one another free May those who are disabled, and those who think they are not, help one another

May those who need someone to listen to them, move the hearts of those who are too busy

May the homeless give joy to those who open their doors to them

May the poor open the hearts of the rich May the dying, who do not want to die, be comforted by

those who find it hard to live

May prisoners find true freedom and free others from fear

May those who sleep in the streets, share their kindness to those who do not understand them

May the hungry rip the veil from the eyes of those who do not hunger for justice May those who live without hope, purify the hearts of those who are afraid of living

May the weak confuse the strong May hatred be surrounded by compassion

May violence be neutralized by men and women of peace And may we surrender to those who are totally vulnerable, so that we may be healed
