December in the Catholic Church is special, and it is no different here at St. Joe's! Whether it is the start of Advent, or the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th or Christmas and New Years at the end of the month, it promises to be a busy month.

One of the joys is that of pro-life. Since the Supreme Court legalized abortion, untold millions of children have been ripped from their mother's womb. The joy is not in abortion, but rather Mary's acceptance of her child. Think of it, here you had a young Jewish, unmarried woman who is pregnant. This baby would turn her life upside down.
