# PATRIOTISM, ONE OF OUR FOUR PILLARS

While preparing for this month's column, it dawned on me to talk about the four pillars of the Knights of Columbus. So as I always do, I started looking around for inspiration (another way to say God lending a hand). And I ran across this quote: "Start by doing what's necessary; then do what's possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible." by St. Francis of Assisi. Actually this quote would apply to all our pillars, including patriotism.

Our nation started as a small colony of the nation of Great Britain. When first arriving on these shores, the Pilgrims worked hard to just not die. These religious people adapted to this new land, doing what was necessary to survive. They learned to grow crops, including some new varieties native to this land. They learned self governance. They thanked God. They were still subjects of the King of England.

When we gained our independence, we were finally able to govern ourselves. Our forefathers, unlike many other countries, started us down a road of liberty. They codified this through the Constitution and Bill of Rights. Without good people, we could easily be like any run of the mill country run by tyrants. Even countries that have elections, sometimes do not have liberty.

It is important to continue the hard and good work started over 200 years ago by the likes of George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Ben Franklin, John Adams and the rest. And that is the definition of patriotism in America. There is no requirement that we agree on all things, or even most things. We can live with respect for our brother citizens. Throughout my life, there have been a number of Presidents. Some I shared a common philosophy, others not so much. I do respect all these men for their accomplishments. We do not have to wildly follow these men, but respect is earned. We can question policies and motives, but unlike other countries we have bloodless revolutions every 2, 4 or 6 years. We believe in majority rule.

As Knights, we defend the Church and our country. We do good works, we set the example. Whether working a soup kitchen, or Felice Couers, or being a Rosary Warrior, or taking Communion to a shut in, or holding a free throw contest, or being a handy helper, or just praying; we set that example. We help our neighbors. We show love of neighbor. And that is how we defend our nation. Morality respects God, we need to be a moral nation.

We live in a country that has done the impossible. We helped free Europe from tyranny not once but twice. We landed men on the moon. We lead the world in fact and by deed. We are the "shining city on the hill" to quote Ronald Reagan. We ask not what our country can do for us, but rather what we can do for the country, to paraphrase John Kennedy. As Knights let us lead through humility and love.
