## Readers Review

#### Biblical Literacy: The Essential Bible Stories Everyone Needs to Know by Timothy Beal

Tim Beal observes that, in our day to day lives, we use phrases and hear stories that are rooted in the Bible. These biblical stories have cultural, historical or literary significance to our world today. He showcases the Bible stories that have most shaped history and provides information on how to understand these stories and the impact they have on our society today.

Beal takes dozens of stories from the Hebrew Bible and the New Testament. He begins with an easy to understand explanation and then presents the actual Bible text. This is another one of those great reference types books, where the author breaks down the text into small chapters, that make it a 'daily reader' type of book. Also, the table of contents is nicely formatted to easily find the biblical story you'd like to refer to.

Biblical Literacy features a nice 'extras' segment at the end of the book. There are familiar biblical phrases and images, which give the phrase as you hear it today and what book of the Bible it hails from. This section is followed by a glossary of biblical key words that includes names and who they were and other biblical terms defined. Finally, Beal has a 'suggested' reading list, recommending books that will further the reader's knowledge of biblical stories.

YOUTH- Breakfast With Santa; Youth Lenten Fish Fry




#### Many Thanks!
