Unfortunately, the Supreme Court led by John Roberts in a 5-4 decision struck down a Louisiana law that would require abortion doctors to having admitting privileges at a nearby hospital in case of life threatening complications.

Even though the law was sponsored by a democratic state senator Katrina Jackson Joe Biden said" Today's decision reaffirmed that states can't put in place laws that unduly burden a woman's right to make her own health care decisions—but the fight isn't over," Biden wrote. "As President, I'll codify Roe v. Wade and protect a woman's constitutional right to choose"

In dissent, Justice Clarence Thomas wrote, "Today a majority of the Court perpetuates its ill-founded abortion jurisprudence by enjoining a perfectly legitimate state law and doing so without jurisdiction."

"Our abortion precedents are grievously wrong and should be overruled," he added, saying that the high court has "neither jurisdiction nor constitutional authority to declare Louisiana's duly enacted law unconstitutional."

Clearly we need another Justice Thomas on the court and Joe Biden is in direct opposition to Catholic teaching on respecting the sanctity of life of the most innocent and vulnerable....the unborn!

You only interface with the staff not the residents and you only hand off the food. The requirement for a driver is once in about every 6 weeks and the schedule is very flexible.
