



 <u>TEXAS magic number is 5 the average number of men</u>

- Manage to this number!
- *Promote degrees through all available media.
- *Challenge your councils that haven't recruited to rekindle the vision and mission.



Online Member to 1st Degree member

- Prospective member identified including online members(blitz, drive or referral).
- Prospect completes admissions committee questionnaire (form 391) and form 100.
- Admissions committee meets with prospect. Completes admissions committee report.
- Form 100 is read at Council meeting with Admission Committees recommendation.
- Secret ballot is held.
- Prospect pays Initiation fee and prorated dues to FS. If the Prospect is an e-member calculate dues credit to next billing cycle.
- Prospect is taken to a 1st Degree.
- The Form 100 is sent to Supreme ASAP or enter e-member 1st degree date for Prospect in Officers online (no later than 24 hours).



Member Management

DISABILITY RENEWAL LETTERS

With the change of Disability to Exemption status earlier this year, the process to renew Exemption status has changed.

A letter to councils will no longer be generated for the Financial Secretary to attest to the renewal of Exemption for a member.

If a member is no longer eligible for Exemption – Disability, Seminarian, or Active Military – the grand knight or financial secretary will need to remove the Exemption status of the member in Member Management or Member Billing.

Additionally, the annual job to remove members from Exemption that are not renewed will no longer be run, the only way to remove a member from Exemption is for the grand knight or financial secretary to update the member's record, when they no longer are eligible for Exemption Status.



Programs & Visibility

- Engaging Non-Knights is Key
- Visibility in the Parish is a Must!
- Public Events/Programs, Tabling, etc.
- *KofC Shirts, apparel, name tags
- Recruitment Events Programs
- Invite Everyone! (Even Ladies)
- Don't focus on KofC
- Provide food!



Working with Parish Ministries

- Work with, not against Parish Ministries
- Parish Masses are a great time to recruit!
- Ask to make pulpit announcements
- Have Knights serve as Ushers or Eucharistic Minister
- Co-Host Events with other Parish Ministries
- You Attract your Knights, Parish Ministries Attracts others



Executing a Program/Event: Assigning Leadership

- Appoint a Program Director, if you don't have one already
- Assign 2 Knights, one older and one younger, to lead event planning
- *Pick two who may not otherwise work together
- *Keep an inventory of all owned supplies
- Order your kits in advance
- *Prepare alternates for weather and higher than expected turnout



Executing a Program/Event: Communication

- Start a group text/line app comprised of only those helping plan the event
- Use your meetings to update the council and gather volunteers if needed
- Create a Facebook Page and publicize, and invite every council member
- Split the task up among officers



Executing a Program/Event: Challenges

- Lack of volunteers
- Text people personally, encourage them to come with a buddy (non-Knight)
- Scheduling Conflicts
- Coordinate calendars with Parish Ministries
- Marketing Struggles
- Ask other groups to share your events on their social media pages

CHARITIES Special Olympics Carlos Ortiz - Chairman

- Form 4584 details our council's involvement
- Those Councils who participate in State Charities can also add 25 cents per member of State Charities to donated amount (Section IV, line 1).
- Forms are to be submitted to State, Supreme and Special Olympics Chairman by January 31st of each year. Supreme Council awards a maximum of \$9,000 annually to each qualifying State Council.



CHARITIES Special Olympics Carlos Ortiz - Chairman

- To enhance participation from councils, an award program has been initiated for Diocesan and District Deputies. To qualify, each District Deputy must have 100% of assigned councils submit the Form 4584, with all indicating activity by December 31, 2019. The 4584 form can be found in the Star Guide.

Infirmed Priests (License Plate Program) Joe Govea – Chairman

- *Purpose of the License Plate Program is to sustain an Infirm (Retired) Priests Fund.
- *Each plate costs \$30 annually, \$22 is returned to the Knights of Columbus Texas State Council
- Money is distributed once a year equally among the Diocese' to assist retired/infirm priests

Wheelchair Mission Bill Weber – Chairman

- *It is estimated that over 100 million people worldwide need a wheelchair and cannot afford one.
- *Wheelchairs allow children with physical disabilities to go to school for the first time, adults to go to work to provide for their families and the elderly to get out of a bed that they may have been confined to for years at a time.
- Wheelchairs are life changing gifts of mobility that deliver hope, dignity, freedom and independence and allow people to do everyday activities that we probably take for granted. They also are a tremendous help to parents, who must carry their children around the house and everywhere they go.
- For each \$150 donation that a person gives, a wheelchair is delivered and the donor is sent a folder with a certificate of thanks that can be personalized as a gift in honor or memory of a loved one, and a photo of a person that has received a wheelchair.



Educational Grants

The Texas State Council will award at least one \$1,000 Educational Grant per diocese and two more \$1,000 Educational Grants to members of the Columbian Squires. The total number of grants for each Diocese will be determined using a formula based on the number of Knights in each Diocese. Applications for these grants are due March 1, 2020. Winners will be announced after the State Convention.



Educational Grants

- An applicant must be sponsored by a Knight of Columbus Council in good standing located in Texas.
- ♦ A Brother Knight, his wife, child, or grandchild is eligible. Descendants of deceased members or grandfathers who were in good standing are also eligible. Any graduating senior of a Catholic High School in Texas is eligible when sponsored by a local Council in Texas even when the student's parent or grandparent is not a Knight.
- Educational Grant money is to be used for education in a University, College, Junior College, Technical School, Business School or Seminary.
- The application must be complete and received on time. The sponsoring Council's Supreme and State per-capita must be paid in full and the Council may not be suspended by the Supreme Council.



Educational Grants

- The application form and all supporting materials must be correctly completed, and received by March 1 of the Grant Year. All applicants will be notified by e-mail of the status of her/his application.
- The sponsoring Council's Supreme and State per capita statements must be paid in full as attested by the Council's Grand Knight to validate the applicant's application.
- The application is available as fillable forms on the website: tkofc.org and submitted via email to giacleone575@gmail.com. Your essay may also be scanned and submitted in pdf format. All materials should be submitted in one email, the possible exception is transcripts.




Knights Emergency Response Mission Statement


