Always rooted in a spirit of humility and faithfulness, Steve's honest style of ministry is born from who he is: a committed witness to the life and love of Jesus Christ.

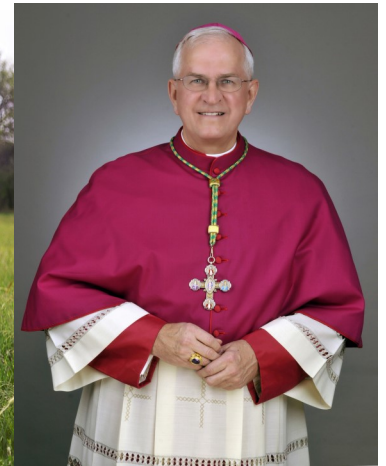

CATHOLIC MEN'S CONFERENCE

The Archdiocese of Louisville held its first Catholic Men's Conference March 31, 2012 at Our Lady of Lourdes Church. Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz opened the conference. The conference's keynote speaker was Deacon Greg Hall, whose drilling company was instrumental in helping to free 33 trapped Chilean miners in 2010. Deacon Hall spoke about "The Difference that Jesus Made." His presentation left many in the audience filled with emotion. **The event drew 430 participants.**

The next Catholic Men's Conference was held at St. Raphael Church on March 16, 2013. The title of that year's conference was straightforward: "It's Awesome to be Catholic: Growing and Sharing Our Faith." Archbishop Kurtz will open the second annual conference, and the featured speaker will be Jon Leonetti, a Catholic speaker who, as a testament to his faith, in 2009 walked from Ocean Park, Calif., to Ocean City, N. J. Again, the conference featured Breakout sessions. **The event drew more than 600 participants.**

The third annual Archdiocese of Louisville Catholic Men's Conference was held in the new St. Michael Church in Jeffersontown, KY on March 22, 2014. **The crowd of 800 attendees** was the largest in the event's history, and those who came were treated to addresses from both Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz and Jesuit Father James Martin, famous for his appearances on national television shows — both news and entertainment — and on National Public Radio.

The theme of the year 2015's Archdiocese of Louisville Men's Conference was a simple, concise statement — "Be the Light." **The nearly 800 men who gathered** for the conference, held March 21, 2015 at St. Michael Church in Jeffersontown, heard that such a declarative statement could be complicated and demanding. It is not easy to be a follower of Jesus Christ, they were told it is not easy to "become the light" of Christ in the world.

The Conference committee changed to an every other year format. Women would have their conference during even years and men during odd years.

On March 18, 2017, the event was again at St. Michael Church. Archbishop Joseph Kurtz opened the conference and the keynote speaker was Dr. Jonathan J. Reyes, executive director of the Department of Justice, Peace and Human Development for the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. The theme was "Go Be the Difference."

St. Michael Church is again hosting the Catholic Men's Conference. The Conference starts at 8:15 am until 1:00 pm. Check-in and breakfast is from 6:00 am until 8:00 am. A flyer is attached.
