STATE CHAPLAIN"S REFLECTION FOR MARCH:

Even though we are still weeks away from the end of Lent (Holy Thursday evening), there are already preparations being made for the Easter Triduum and its beautiful liturgies that begin on Holy Thursday evening and end on Easter Sunday evening with Evening Prayer. My question to my brother Knights is this: Have you set aside these days as the most important and unique days of your year as the Church says it is for all Catholics. The yearly celebration of the Paschal Mystery (the passion, death, and Resurrection of the Lord) has many purposes including strengthening our identity as disciples of Christ and ambassadors of his Good News. The liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil are unique and beautiful and deserve our full attendance and participation. At the Holy Thursday Liturgy, the focus is on three things that are certainly dear to Knights: the Eucharist, the Priesthood (both of which Jesus instituted at the Last Supper) and the call to servanthood which Jesus taught throughout his life and through the action of washing his apostles feet at the Last Supper. Good Friday gives all Catholics the opportunity to ponder Jesus' Passion and Death (through John's Gospel) and show reverence and even awe toward the instrument of our salvation, the wood of the Cross during the Veneration of the Cross. Finally, the Easter Vigil Liturgy through its powerful symbols of darkness and light, through listening to some key stories of salvation history in the Old Testament, and through the emergence of new life for some in the waters of baptism and our renewal of our baptismal promises, we are strengthened in our belief in the ultimate victory of Christ (his Resurrection) and the hope we have and share with others in our own Resurrection'l life with the Lord now and one day in heaven.

As our Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson is urging us as Knights in this fraternal year to be more connected than ever to our parishes in ministry and in our activities, I pray that you will not only plan to come to Church for the Easter Triduum liturgies, but they you will offer yourselves in any way the priest of your parish needs you for these liturgies. 
