DECEMBER 2023

BROTHERS, WE ARE now four months into the Fraternal Year. A third of the Fraternal Year is behind us. Tempus Fugit. We are off to a slow start. Membership growth is down about 20% from last year. ASAP donations are down significantly from last year. At the same time, Councils in Wisconsin donated over 7000 Coats for Kids this fall. We have one new Council and two more being actively worked on. 15 Districts and 42 Councils have met more than 33% of their Membership Goals and are on track for Star Recognition.

As we started the Fraternal Year, Councils were asked to put a plan in place to meet their Star Council goals. District Deputies were challenged to work with the Councils in their Districts to ensure that every District has at least one Star Council.

Is your Council on track to be a Star Council? Is your District on track to be a Star District? If you don't know, ask at your next Council meeting. In the 2022-2023 Fraternal Year, Wisconsin had 41 Star Councils and 9 Star Districts. This success is significant. Councils and Districts that earned these recognitions need to Celebrate their Success and Invite others to Join them.

Often, I hear Councils say that they just want to help people, and they are not looking to earn awards. The problem with this statement is that there is far more need in our communities than we are currently able to address with our programs. If Councils are really going to help people, we must start with prayer, identify programs that will meet the needs of their Parish and Community, help our members grow in faith and charity, and then invite others to join us with our programs. Archbishop Lori reminds us that "Faith leads to charity and the witness of charity leads to faith."

We all joined the Knights of Columbus to make a difference, and Star Council recognition is designed to recognize Councils that are making a difference and are growing to meet the needs of their Parishes and Communities. Star Councils are focused on Growth in Programs, Fraternal Benefits, and Membership. Star Council does not just happen, but rather happens by Councils having a Goal of being a Star Council, and then planning for success by putting together a calendar of Programs, Fraternal Benefit Events, and Membership Drives to support this Goal. Once this plan is in place, the Council must work together to ensure Success. Does your Council have a Plan for Success? Is your Council executing your Plan?

For Districts, Star Districts do not just happen, rather District Deputies must work with all of the Councils in their District to ensure that Programs, Fraternal Benefit Events, and Membership Intake occurs. In short, District Deputies work with Councils to create a Plan for Success, and then follow up to make sure that the plan is followed.

Circle of Honor Recognition at the State Level requires similar planning and working together to ensure that Councils, Districts, and Diocese all succeed in meeting their goals. Circle of Honor is not an award for the State Officers, rather it is a recognition that the State Council is functioning well and supporting its Councils in succeeding in growing in faith and Charity. The Wisconsin State Council received Circle of Honor recognition the past 2 Fraternal Years and is working hard to achieve this recognition again this year.

At all levels, success is a Team Effort. A Plan is put in place, and then everyone works together to ensure success.

Wisconsin got off to a Slow Start this Fraternal Year. That is OK, as long as we stay focused on Success. In sports, they frequently say that the last 2 minutes of the first and first few minutes of the second half are the most important. As a State Council, we are currently focused on the last few days of the first half by offering an exciting Incentive. For every 5 new members that a Council brings in between December 1 and December 25, the State



Council will provide that Council with a \$100 Per Capita credit. This incentive is not capped. If a Council brings in 10 members between these dates, they get a \$200 credit. The State Team hopes that this Incentive will help us to ensure more Councils are on track to be Star Councils this Fraternal Year.

Diocesan Meetings are scheduled again this December. These are scheduled early in the month to try to avoid conflicts with Holiday gatherings. Our Wisconsin Bishops have stepped up to support these meetings, and each of these meetings will have a Keynote Speaker. Every Council should work to get their Grand Knight, Financial Secretary, Program Director, and Membership Director to these Diocesan Meetings. Diocesan Meetings are open to any Knight that wants to attend. District Deputies will also be attending these meetings. We hope that these meetings will provide Councils with the tools that they need to Grow.

The needs in our Parishes and Communities continue to grow. Our Councils need to grow to meet these needs. As we enter the Advent season, let's make preparations for the second half of the Fraternal Year. As Knights, we can make this happen.

Working together, we will grow the Knights of Columbus in Wisconsin.



MEMBERSHIP GROWTH IS a

constant for our Order—not any different from any other organization that relies on its members for good deeds. Now—for some of our Councils, a comment that I often hear is that Membership Growth is a struggle, as individuals aren't interested in joining or making a commitment to a group. This statement hit home for me this past month at my home Parish. As a Parish that is growing, our Council has struggled to keep pace over the last few years. At this same time—a new 'Men's Group' was formed at my Parish. Many of these members are Knights, but many are not. At a weekend Mass, following our Membership Drive that occurred the prior week, the Men's Group had an opportunity to seek out members and were given time to speak after Mass. The individual that spoke made a 'direct' statement—that this Men's Group wasn't a 'secret society' or 'fraternal organization.' At this same time—our council's program leader who is trying to help launch the 'Cor Initiative' met with the Deacon who runs this Men's Group, to try and help educate on how we have 'resources' that could assist this group, he made a statement that they were not wanting our help. This bothered me immensely (mind you, this Deacon is a Knight) as it makes me wonder: What Message Are They Hearing?

Are our own members aware of all of the resources that the Knights can provide? If not—how can we 'share' and 'promote' the great benefits of belonging to the Knights to potential new members? Are our own council leaders aware of all the benefits of membership in the Knights—or do we treat 'inviting' new men to join the Knights as an arduous task instead of one we are excited to do? If our attitude is 'negative'... then why would others want to join our council? What Message are They Hearing?

In my time as a District Deputy, and as a State Officer, including time as a State Deputy—in my communications with council Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries I often heard that Church Drives don't work or that they run into obstacles with Parish Leaders allowing for the Knights to give a speech to invite new members. I would often hear that they have invited every man in the Parish. This makes me wonder: What Message are They Hearing?

The Knights have evolved immensely since I joined, roughly 15 years ago. The 'COR' Initiative wasn't even a talking point among our councils a little over a year ago! E-membership, an opportunity for men to 'try out' being a member before joining a local council wasn't an option roughly 5 years ago. Around that same time, we still required men to go through their 1st degree and then the lessons of the 2nd and 3rd degree at separate times. From the ASAP Program—to the Knights of Columbus donating over 1 million Coats through our Coats for Kids program—to our involvement with helping each of our Diocese with the Eucharistic Revival—the Knights are men of action in both our charitable efforts to our impact helping evangelize and grow men in their Faith. What Message are They Hearing?

Is our Membership even aware of all of these changes? So it makes me wonder—how do we overcome these obstacles and how do we 'grow' in ways that we invite men to join our Order?

Fraternal Benefit Nights are a great resource to 'invite' non-members to learn more about the benefits of being a Knight. Are we fully utilizing these resources? I encourage each of your councils these remaining 7 months of the Fraternal Year to conduct at least 2 Fraternal Benefit



Nights—but at these, to invite both 'members' and 'non-members' to join. Along this same line—are we engaging and inviting the 'Wives' to these events? What a great opportunity for them to become aware of all of the great benefits of their husband being a Knight—but also making them aware of ways that the Knights could potentially assist their family. As we so often hear—families that are 'engaged' with the Fraternal Benefits of the Knights are often not just 'lifetime' members, but also when insuring their Kids, their Kids often become members of the Knights in the future (sons or their daughter's husbands). What Message are They Hearing?

What is the benefit of 'engaging' the Family for the Church? As we often hear another 'objection' from some of our Councils is that they don't have any 'young members' to engage to invite to their council as they are leaving the Church. We play a direct role in helping work with the youth as well as trying to keep the youth in the Faith (such as with our YouCat Bible initiative). Are the families of our Churches aware of our role in this? Are we 'promoting' this as a role the Knights play directly in helping build the Church now and into the future? What Message are They Hearing?

Now—to fully evolve, we should ask the question: Who Should be Receiving our Message? *Continued on page 5.*

State Incentives: 2nd Quarter Incentive

For the 2nd Quarter incentive, the State Council is offering a unique 'Diocese' incentive. The goals set by Diocese are based off the year-end goals for each Diocese.

If a Diocese achieves its monthly intake goal, then its Bishop will receive \$1,000 for each month that the goal is reached. These checks will be delivered to the Bishop personally at the Diocesan meetings in December—so that all the councils attending can share in this presentation.

- Milwaukee ArchDiocese Goal: 50 new members each month
- ▶ Green Bay, Madison and LaCrosse Diocese Goal: 35 new members each month
- Superior Diocese: 20 new members each month

As an added incentive—any council that brings in 5 new members between December 1st and December 25th will receive \$100 off their April 1st per capita invoice. Please work towards achieving this incentive as an extra opportunity to receive funds for your council to use for Charity.



For those councils who feel a struggle 'inviting' men to join, as they feel that they have asked them before only to be rejected—then I must ask: Have you approached and asked the wife if the Knights could be a benefit for their family? Have we approached the priest and parish administration with reasons why membership growth in the Knights is a direct positive result for their parish?

When the Parish Staff, including the Parish Priest is supportive of the Knights—we will grow. When the wives of our Parish want their Husbands to be a Knight—we will grow.

So—what is a possible 'solution' to these suggestions? How many of us take a few hours every Advent to send out Christmas Cards to friends and family? Why can't we take a look at our Parish Rosters or Parish Directories—and review all of those men that are not Knights—and send a 'Christmas Card' letter to each of these families-more directly to these wives and help 'message' them on all of the wonderful things that the Knights do in the Parish and your Community, and how membership in the Knights can help their spouse with faith development as well as becoming a better husband, a better father, a better man? This is a message that we need to send to every wife to help inform them of the benefits of the Knights-and maybe we will find fruitful success in the coming new year!

The Parish Staff, including the Parish Priest, should be aware of the struggles that our Councils possibly have with an 'aging' membership and if struggling to find new members. Each year we are constantly struggling to replace the Members we lose to Death. How many of our Members are not able to do the activities that they possibly did in the last few years? If we can't continue to do these same programs, that means we will have less of a Charitable impact in the Community and possibly the Parish. What impact will this have on the Parish in the future? Making them aware of this, may also help get their 'support' to help you further grow in the future.

PHOTOGRAPHY

I thank everyone who participated in the 'Coats for Kids' events by sending in their photos. We have received some fantastic pictures, and while some may not have been the best, we appreciate your effort. Most of these photos have already been shared on our Facebook page or in the Badger Bulletin. We encourage you to keep sending us pictures of all your events to pr@wikofc.com.

I want to share some photography tips that I've learned over the years to help you take better pictures in the future. These tips include:

- Capturing horizontal photos with your smartphone to get a better view.
- ► Taking numerous photos from different angles to capture the best shot.
- Focusing on the subject and deleting the rest of the photos.
- Getting closer to the subject.
- Using natural light and avoiding the flash.
- Getting action shots and creating your actions.
- Avoiding the "You! Up Against the Wall!"
- phenomenon.

When taking photos, it's important to remember that they should tell a

story on their own, without any need for words. Out of a hundred photos, if you pick the best ten, they should be able to convey what happened and the general atmosphere of the event. To make your photos look more appealing and well-composed, you should follow the "rule of thirds". This means placing your subject in the left or right third of the image and leaving the other two-thirds more open, creating a balanced composition. To apply this guideline, imagine dividing your camera's viewfinder into nine equal zones with horizontal and vertical lines to form a grid. You can enable this setting on most cameras and smartphones by going to the camera settings and turning on the "Grid" toggle under the "Composition" section.

We hope these tips will help you to take better photos and create a more compelling story. We appreciate your support and look forward to seeing more of your photos in the future.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT

It is important that you continue to review your council's status regarding who has completed the Safe Environment training.

Who needs to complete the training? Grand Knight, Program Director, Family Director and Community Director. The Family Director and Community Director will also complete the background check. This is a second email from Praesidium Academy. If your 185 and 365 are in and correct, then the Praesidium Academy sends out the email to complete the training. They get email information from Supreme from the 365 and 185 forms. If you are listed on the forms correctly and still have not received your email, then you need to contact:

They will track the issue down and resend the email to complete the training and if needed another email for background check on FD and CD.

RAFFLE TICKETS

There has been a lot of discussion on mailing raffle tickets. Please know that the mailing and return of raffle ticket stubs using the US Post Office mailing is illegal per the Federal law on Post Office mailings. The State could lose our license for raffles.

GUIDELINES FOR RAFFLES

Federal law prohibits depositing, sending, or delivering raffle tickets by United States mail. The law is designed to protect the integrity of raffles and other gambling activities, and to guard against illegal gambling schemes that may be carried out through the mail. Many states have similar laws. It is legally permissible to advertise raffles or send out promotional information by mail, but the raffle tickets should be delivered in person. Ideally, raffle tickets should be distributed to members during a council meeting or related council event. *Before conducting a raffle, the council should review all relevant laws and regulations and should take steps to ensure compliance.*

WHAT TO DO?

Several suggestions came through about using FedEx/UPS/Spee-Dee or other such services.

Another suggestion is to hand them out at meetings or church get together.

Some councils are going to put the raffle tickets in an envelope and put the name address on the front, (using the address labels). Hand out at membership meeting and then have several members take about 5-10 each and deliver them. This might be a great way to reconnect with members who have not come to meetings lately. Remember to put in the contact info on who is picking them up.

Please share with all of us any other suggestions.

ID / Tootsie Roll checks were sent last month. If your Council did not receive your check(s) please email or call me so I can dig into that for you. I am happy to investigate and correct.


Charity checks have been disbursed. There were several Council Leaders that contacted me stating that, in years past, they never had to complete a form to get their check. I am guessing that another Officer on the Council submitted the form previously and they weren't even aware it was completed. The form isn't new, and it is required. The requirement doesn't come from me, or Bernie, or even the Knights of Columbus. This requirement comes from the Wisconsin Department of Administration, the Division of Gaming's, Office of Charitable Gaming and they are responsible for the licensing and regulation of raffles and bingos conducted by charitable organizations as part of \$563.907-563.99. It is our regulatory

responsibility is to protect the public interest and the integrity of the raffle and maintain our license. Therefore, the



completed form must be on file before a check can be prepared.

I wish to express my appreciation for your patience during my transition to State Treasurer. Your kind words and encouragement have been a blessing and I very much look forward to the remaining good we will do as 2023 comes to an end.





BROTHERS, IT IS a busy time of year. The Holiday season is upon us and you should be planning for the third and fourth quarters. Keep in mind that the five P's. Propper planning prevents poor performance. Now is the time to determine if your council is on track to attain the Columbian Award. If needed make adjustments to the plan so you are not scrambling in May and June. Below are some ideas for you to consider including in your plan.

Consecration of the Holy Family Keep Christ in Christmas

It's not too late to plan a Christmas event such as Consecration to the Holy Family or Keep Christ in Christmas. Invite all families of the parish to participate and identify new men who could strengthen your council. Talk to Father today to determine how your council can best support you.

Food for Families

As the holidays quickly approach, let's make sure families don't go to sleep hungry. The Food for Families program has donated millions of dollars and pounds of food toward this cause. Continue to get your councils involved with their local food pantries or soup kitchens and let them know that for every \$500 or 1,000 pounds of food donated, the Supreme Council will refund \$100 back to the council – up to a maximum of \$500 per council per fraternal year. Spiritual Reflection Our Lady of Guadalupe Resources

What are we doing to keep our youth active and engaged? Encourage councils to participate in a Free throw competition.

Since 1972, councils have sponsored the Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship for boys and girls from 9 to 14 to provide an athletic outlet and encourage the values of sportsmanship and healthy competition. 

That equates to an average goal of **35 new E-members per month.** As of Nov 17th, I have assigned a






SACRAMENTAL GIFTS

The Sacraments stand for the most significant events in the life of the domestic Church. The Knights of Columbus need to be there to support and embrace the members of our parish family at these essential moments in our faith. As both children and adults become more integrated into the church and our parishes, they need to know that the Knights of Columbus support and will continue to in a tangible way.

The first Sacrament that we all received was Baptism which was the start of our Faith journey. As a child many barely remember this event that put



First Communion is normally the second sacrament that children receive in their journey of Faith. This is probably the first big step that they will remember for the rest of their lives. As Knights, we need to support them on the way by gifting them something that will help guide them in their faith. Regardless of the Sacrament, your gifts should not be restricted to one or two physical items. If the recipient of the sacrament is an adult male, include an invitation to join our order. Let them know that we are praying for them. Include some prayer cards for them to use as bookmarks especially the Prayer of St. Francis, and the Prayer for the Canonization of Father McGivney. A FAITH PROGRAM



Intro

I will start with a quick introduction of myself. Some of the key positions I have held since joining the order were Deputy Grand Knight and Grand Knight followed by all the Offices in the 4th Degree Assembly, District Deputy supporting 9 different Councils over 5 years, Milwaukee Diocese Program Director, Silver Rose Chairman, and

Currently, I'm both the Commander and Comptroller of my Assembly as well as the newly appointed Faith Director for the Wisconsin State Council. I've been married to my wonderful wife Linda for nearly 49 years with whom I have two children and 4 grandchildren. Educationally I have degrees in both Cinematography and Electronics. I have been involved with religious education intermittently for the last 30 years. I'm also a retired Master sergeant from the US Army, where I spent most of my time as an instructor.

As Faith Director, I believe my job is to help every one of the Councils in the State of Wisconsin grow in their Faith. While I'm new in the job and it has been vacant for several months I believe it will be both a learning experience as well as a catch-up period for me initially. Having worked with the Pilgrim Icon and the Silver Rose has given me some experience in coordination with our councils and the uniqueness of every individual council. As a knight working with the Supreme Faith in Action Program, it is also my goal to help every Council earn the Columbian award and become eligible to become a Star Council.

Currently, the most visible sign to me is the lack of filing Forms #10784 with Supreme. This was extremely noted from the reports I received from Supreme. Even today, 3 months after the Silver Rose was transferred to Illinois less than half the hosting Councils filed the required forms. I saw this same thing with the Pilgrim Icon that is only 8 months away from being returned to Supreme. If you need help filing these forms please start by reviewing the <u>Supreme Video</u>. If you are still having issues please email me and I will see how I can support you.

Faith Programs

Supreme Lists nine programs under the Faith Category of the Faith in Action program. All of these programs are designed to strengthen both the Knights and their Families in faith. A quick reminder of the programs that Supreme lists: **Refund Support Program (pg. 13)**, Into the Breach, **Pilgrim Icon Program (pg. 21)**, Building the Domestic Church Kiosk, Holy Hour, Rosary Program, **Sacramental Gifts (pg. 14)**, and Spiritual Reflection. Remember this list is not all-inclusive, most of these items found their way to the list because Councils have already done them and Supreme found them valuable enough to encourage all the other councils to participate. Each month, I will try to highlight at least two of these programs.

RSVP Refund Support Vocations Program

As the strong right hand of the church, the Knights of Columbus are committed to supporting our seminarians. These young men will be our priests tomorrow and need our support morally, spiritually, and financially. To encourage our councils in support of our seminarians, Supreme initiated a program where for every \$500 your council donates to a seminarian they will refund the council \$100, up to a maximum of \$400. To receive this refund, the Council must complete Supreme form #2863 and email it to the Supreme Office with a copy of the canceled checks.

Forms Reminder

As a final reminder this month I cannot emphasize the importance of getting forms filed on time. This is especially true of the program's form #10784, which should be filed immediately after an event. While we suggest the program chairman fill out the form it is often easier for the Grand Knight or Financial Secretary to fill them out, because they have the forms readily available to them from the Officer's online menu. Please whenever you file any Supreme Forms send a copy to forms@wikofC.com which is an automated program to identify forms and send a copy to those within the state structure that need access to your forms.

If you still have issues filing the #10784 forms, Supreme has an informative video accessible online that walks you through the process. You can fund the program by following <u>this link</u>.



AS WE CLOSE out 2023 and the first half of our '23-'24 Fraternal Year, a few thoughts as we plan for the weeks and months ahead.

Given the terrible situation in the Middle East, Ukraine and earthquake ravaged regions throughout the world, the need for wheelchairs is greater than ever. Why not use December and January to initiate a new fundraiser for that purpose in your parish, community, or district? You can get all the information you need from the Supreme website and the Global Wheelchair Mission.

Since this same period is a somewhat quiet time for weather disasters, why not use it to initiate that long put off effort to form or update the plans for disaster resolution and relief as well as the supplies needed for your Council, parish, school, cluster, community, etc. Consult with our Disaster Preparedness State Coordinator or check the Supreme website for ideas on getting started.

Now is the perfect time to contact an organization in town you've worked with in the past or one whose mission you feel strongly about and see what project in town you can work on together to resolve. This networking is something you won't regret and may lead to further charitable outreach opportunities from there. Working with Habitat for Humanity may well develop the same way!

> You can still do a Coats for Kids or Jackets for Kids Drive in the weeks and months ahead. Or, start working now

on setting the wheels in motion for next fall's or winter's drive by nailing down sites, clothing supplies, school supplies, volunteers, etc. to make the operation a success up the road.

For the youth programs, the Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest should now be wrapping up and Councilwinning essays should be in my hands by year's end. The Culture of Life Essay Contest should be run at the schools in January and February with Council-winning essays to your DPCs by March 31. All the needed information can be downloaded from the State website.

Plans should already be in motion for your Free Throw and Knowledge Contents. Councils can already operate the contests from December through the end of February. Obtain Free Throw information from the State and Supreme websites, materials from Supplies online. Knowledge Contest information download from the State website, including the 2024 Math and spelling tests (unchanged from 2023).

Soccer and Hockey Skills Contest information can also be downloaded from the Supreme website, along with supplies ordered from Supplies Online. Some information is on the State website also. Both contests can be run indoors December-February and outdoors (March-May). Plan to do your contests now by lining up schools, gyms, volunteers,



contacting soccer and hockey teams, clubs, coaches, etc. Finally, my



This completes the Pilgrimage of the Silver Rose for 2023. Supreme begins its final evaluation of the Running of the Rose from the submitted form #10784 that were submitted. Please get your forms submitted if you hosted the Rose this year.


Supreme has released the dates for the pilgrimage of Silver Roses for 2024. The eight Silver Roses will start their 2024 journey on February 24th, 2024 and will be in Wisconsin from July 14th to August 10th. With this information, I am now accepting requests from Councils that desire to host the Silver Rose in Wisconsin next year. Requests can be sent to my email and need to include your Council number, parish name, parish city, and the information of the individual who will be parish contact for this event.

While we will have the Rose for 28 days there will be more requests than what I can schedule, therefore a precedent needs to be established.

At the top of the list will be the Councils that have not hosted the Silver Rose in 2023. The second priority will be the Councils that have hosted the Silver Rose in 2023 and that I have received form #10784 from before the end of this year (these will be prioritized by the largest attendance first). Other factors that I will consider, are if two Councils are close together and if they can share the Rose on a single day with either 2 separate services or a combined service.

Believe me, establishing the final route takes time. Many Councils demand a specific date, but I do not have 14 Saturdays and 14 Sundays. In establishing the route, in fairness to everyone I need to ignore special date requests. Since this does create issues, I will release an initial schedule for the Councils. If councils have an issue with the initial schedule, I'll try to resolve it as best I can, which may include changes to councils or dates. The final schedule will be released at the 2024 State Convention giving councils at least 3 months to prepare to host the Silver Rose.
