## Dear Pastors:

Saint Teresa of Calcutta said, "If you can't feed a hundred people, then feed *just one*." The Knights of Columbus and the Center of Family Love are challenging Catholic Churches across Oklahoma to adopt, *just one*, intellectually and physically disabled friend who lives at the Center of Family Love, and for each church to raise money on behalf of their friend. This appeal will be called *The Joy of Mercy Appeal* also known as *The Love Challenge*.

We are proud to be the founders of the Center of Family Love where they have been serving those who cannot care for themselves for 35 years. The Center of Family never charges their residents or their families for the care they provide in the event the resident's cannot afford to live there. Incidentally, the Center of Family Love must raise \$10,000 annually to meet each of their needs.

The Love Challenge is an appeal that will run through the end of June 2017. The Center of Family Love will work the Knights of Columbus at each parish to designate a "Team Champion" who will accept *The Love Challenge* on behalf of their church.

The Center of Family Love will provide the "Team Champion" with their own website where donations can be accepted on behalf of each friend and a video explaining how *The Love Challenge* works. The Team Champion will work to assemble their "Team of 12" and together they will set a parish goal and run a campaign challenging their friends and parish family to be the difference in their disabled friend's life.
