Advent: Waiting in Hope

GIVEN THE CONTOURS OF OUR

American lifestyle perhaps one of the most difficult things we do is wait. Why? Because everything is instant. We can cook a hot dog in seconds. We can see a website load with great speed. We can use the express checkout line. We can click a button and choose same day delivery. We can use TSA lines at airport security. We can see a printer spit out a sheet of paper in no time at all. We are doers, getting things done, checking things off the to-do list. This is why we find it difficult to wait.

But we still have situations where we just have to wait, don't we? Waiting in a drug store for a prescription to be filled. Waiting to see your doctor. Waiting in group eight to board the airplane. Waiting for the results of a medical test. Waiting for someone to give us a ride. Waiting for the elevator. Waiting for the clothes dryer to finish its cycle. Waiting at an intersection with long traffic lights. We wait only when we have to. But how well to we wait?

It would appear that many Americans don't believe that the sun is the center of the universe. They believe that they, themselves, are the center of everything. This means that everything has to be their way. No one and nothing else are important. They want to control things... even the uncontrollable. Waiting to get their way is agony. This is what happens when they take God out of the center and put themselves in that place.

When we look at the readings presented to us by Mother Church during the season of Advent most are about waiting. Noah had to wait until the water subsided at the end of the flood. Jonah waited in the belly of the fish for three days and three nights. Abraham and Sarah do not conceive their only child until they are in their nineties. The Israelites endure 400 years of slavery before Moses brings them to freedom. The people of God wait for generation after generation for the arrival of the Messiah. Mary had to wait for nine months before giving birth to Jesus. The apostles waited three days before the discovering the resurrection of Jesus. All of these people in the Bible had to wait. However, they waited with hope. Implicitly they understood, even during difficult times, that God had something great in store for them.

The goal of Advent, therefore, is hopeful waiting. Wouldn't it be wonderful if all of us could go to a retreat center for all twenty-four days of Advent? Distractions would be minimal. In this time of waiting we could come to understand our place in the world anew. We could renew our understanding that we are not at the center of everything. We could let God be God, placing God at the center of our lives. We would understand ourselves as creatures loved by God. This was that stance of all the Biblical characters that will be presented to us through the readings in the season of Advent. It should be our stance, too.

But how do we arrive at hopeful waiting? Could we add something to our Advent prayer sessions? Could we add sitting in the quiet. Yes. Just sitting in the quiet and wait like all of the great believers in the Bible did. And in time can we discover, as spiritual author Richard Rohr states, "Your life is not about you. It is about God. It is about a willing participation in a larger mystery." Then we will be ready to welcome the birth of Jesus in history and in our individual lives.

At the Convention they will be asked to elect State Officers, elect the Wisconsin delegates to the Supreme Convention, receive the reports the State Officers and Committees and adopt policies and programs for the good of the Order as well as transact other business as needed. Please take this first step seriously so your Council is appropriately represented.

NOVEMBER WAS A FANTASTIC month for Online Membership. As of November 19, 76 e-members joined the order in Wisconsin. Since July 1, we have brought in 321 e-members in Wisconsin. This is an increase of about 90 e-members compared to the same time last fraternal year. Thank you to all of the Councils that are consistently using the e-membership to bring new men into the order.

Now that we have all of these e-members, we need to make sure that we are getting them Exemplified and into Councils. Since July 1, we have about 160 e-members that have been assigned to a Council, but have not yet taken an Exemplification or joined a Council. While in person exemplifications are preferred, if schedules are not working out, please use the On-Demand Online Exemplification to get these brothers into your Councils and then invite them to get involved.

Cards with the QR Code to join online are available from Supreme. These can be very helpful when inviting men to join. Your Diocesan Membership Directors and District Deputies should be able to help you get these cards if you need them.

WGK & WFS please frequently review your councils PROSPECT tab and if you are having difficulty in making contact, or any other issue, please email me regarding these outstanding assigned e-members and I will gladly assist you with reaching a remedy.

REMINDERS

WGK & WFS please frequently review your councils **Prospect** tab. Should you experience any difficulty with this process, please email me regarding these outstanding assigned emembers and I will gladly assist you.

Supreme presented a Webinar in December on Transferring online members to council membership which you can access <u>here.</u>

Do not send Form 100's to Supreme for new members, keep them for your council's records. If you must use a Form 100, scan it and email it to Supreme, keeping the original for your council records. Since Form 100's must be manually processed at Supreme, they can lead to data entry errors and delays. Utilizing e-membership or the Candidate tab for new members are the preferred ways to bring in new members. The date field is the date they were exemplified by your council. Once you enter those dates in either tab, the members will be automatically transferred to your council's roster within the next week.

PROSPECT TAB

Shows you e-members that have joined online via the Supreme app. The date field is used to transfer them into your council when they have completed their exemplification. With their own data and confirm their membership, and then they receive an e-mail from Supreme. These emembers are then part of the state council, and get assigned to a local council. Until the local FS enters the exemplification date, these members remain part of the State Council. Local councils get credit for them when the exemplification date is entered by the FS to transfer them into your Council.

Clicking on this blue box will take you to the Prospect training.

CANDIDATE TAB

Used when you recruit a member locally or are handling a member transfer request or a reinstatement of a prior member. The Candidate tab can best be described as an online Form 100. The candidate tab training covers new members and transfers into local councils.

Clicking on this red box will take you to the candidate training.

PASSING THE TORCH

Building Tomorrow's Leaders. Together.





AS THIS YEAR WINDS DOWN, I find myself thinking about what keeps our Order strong. It isn't the number of meetings we attend or the reports we submit — it's the men who step forward, answer the call to serve, and inspire others to do the same. Across Wisconsin, in both our Eastern and Western Districts, I see that spirit alive in councils and assemblies alike.

Everywhere I go, I meet Knights who are the backbone of our parishes — the ones who set up the fish fry, run the food drive, stand watch in the Honor Guard, or quietly mentor a younger member. Yet too often, it's the same handful of men carrying the load. Our challenge isn't that we lack good men; it's that we haven't always asked them. The next generation of leaders is already among us — in our pews, in our councils, and yes, in our own assemblies.

I still remember my first invitation into the Fourth Degree. It wasn't a sales pitch or a checklist. It was a brother Knight who saw something in me and said, "You'd be good at this." That one personal invitation changed my life in the Order. It gave me a sense of belonging and a deeper way to live my faith in service to God and country.

That same opportunity exists for every council in Wisconsin. Our Patriotic Exemplifications are more than ceremonies; they are moments of renewal where men rediscover why they joined the Knights in the first place. This winter and spring, we'll be hosting exemplifications in Manitowoc (January 17), De Pere (April 11), and Marshfield (April 25). I and Western District Master Duane encourage every Grand Knight, Faithful Navigator, and District Deputy to work together in inviting Third Degree members to take that next step. If your council or assembly sponsors even one new Sir Knight, you've helped secure the future of the Fourth Degree.

For our council leaders, consider this: every new Knight should see the Fourth Degree not as a "someday," but as a goal to strive toward. Talk about the honor, the service, and the public witness of our Color and Honor Guards. Show them that patriotism and faith are not separate virtues. Show them that they are one expression of Catholic manhood.

For our assembly leaders, remember that recruitment isn't about numbers — it's about example. When a Sir Knight appears in uniform at a parish Mass, funeral, or civic event, he sends a message without saying a word: ...We serve with faith and dignity." That kind of visibility draws others in.

As we now move through this Advent season, let us take seriously its call to prepare — not only for the coming of Christ, but for the future of our Order. Advent reminds us that renewal begins with invitation and grows through accompaniment. This is our moment to recommit ourselves to forming new leaders: to mentor, to encourage, and to entrust real responsibility to the men who are ready to step forward. If each of us invests in even one new brother, our councils, assemblies, and communities will enter the new year stronger and more vibrant than ever.

As you are reading this we will be in the Advent season of the Church. The Advent season is the preparation period for the coming of the Lord or Christmas celebrating the birth of Our Savior. During this period of preparation Supreme has made two new programs for our Councils and our Families to help prepare for the coming of Christmas. Last month I introduced you to Imitating Saint Juan Diego . this month we will look at another new program ¡Viva Cristo Rey! As our next newsletter will be in 2026, I want to wish all our Knights and their Family a holy and merry Christmas season and trust you will keep Christ as the center of your celebrations.

IVIVA CRISTO REY!

Translated to English Long Live Christ the King which was the battle cry of the Catholics in Mexico when the government was trying to eliminate the Catholic Church in Mexico. In 1905, the first Knights of Columbus council was established in Mexico. and within five years, it had become *the* symbol of all things Catholic in Mexico. In 1917, the new constitution set the stage for the persecution for the Catholic Church and began a revolution. By 1918, Mexico had 400 Knights, which grew to 51 Councils and 6,000 Knights by 1924. Some 200,000 people were killed or martyred by the government by 1930, On May 21, 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized 25 of these martyrs, including six Knights from this time period from Mexico.

This program celebrates the sanctity of the Mexican Martyrs including many Knights who fought against religious persecution. Councils are encouraged to ask for the intercession of the Mexican Martyrs by going to Mass, praying the nine-day novena leading up to their feast days, and spreading devotion to these saints and blesseds throughout your community. Please consider this program centered upon May 21st the feast of the Mexican Martyrs, The Feast Day of Christ the King, or November 20th the feast commemorating the Martyred Knights in Mexico. However this program can be done at any time to fit into the Council and Parish schedule. For more information see the <u>Supreme website</u>.

THE PILGRIMAGE OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

We are continuing with this program but repeated issues have been reported, seeminly related to communication. Just this week, I received a call from a troubled new Grand Knight. He wanted to know what to do with the **icon** he just received. The first question I asked him was if he received flock notes. The second question was if he received the state newsletter? The final question was if he had a District Deputy? The answer was no to these questions, a situation that has not been uncommon in my experience.

Please help each other so we can solve this as a team, like we learned in the lesson of Unity. If you are scheduled to have the **icon**, please contact the council **before** you and **after** you at least a month in advance. Also, contact the council that currently has the **icon** to get an idea of what supplies you probably will need to order. This assures you the **icon** is on its way and acts as a reminder for everyone to prepare for the Icon and get questions answered before the last minute.

Review the <u>Supreme Council's web page</u> on the **icon** to start your preparations. Determine what your council's needs will be. Some councils have gone through over 500 prayer cards while others barely went through 100. While the prayer booklets should be returned at the services they are still vanishing quickly. I strongly suggest you order as many Prayer Booklets #5050 as you expect at your services as well as the Sacred Heart of Jesus Prayer Cards #11520. You may also want to purchase the Sacred Heart Litany Prayer Card #613.

Finaly if you have questions do not hesitate to contact me. My contact information is in my signature as well in the State Directory.

I was getting my oil changed. While I waited, I remembered something I heard in one of Matthew Kelly's presentations. He spoke of the importance of regular confessions.

To present a rough paraphrasing of his talk, he gave an analogy of a car wash. Once your car is washed, you avoid puddles, you keep more distance from other vehicles and, in general, are more careful driving. You also how frustrating it is when it rains right after you had your car washed.

However, over time your car starts to collect dirt and grime anyway. Little by little, the things that seemed really big slowly become little. You grab some books from the library and put them in the back seat. You end up leaving them in the car, saying "I'll take care of it later." Likewise, it's Sunday morning and you grab the church bulletin. You give it a quick skim and toss it on the floor, thinking you will take care of it later. Meanwhile, napkins, food crumbs, money, and all sorts of items get tossed in the back and left for later.

This doesn't bother you at first

because it happens little by little. However, one day, you look back there and are blown away that it has become so messy. What do you do?

You take it to the car wash and start the process all over again.

Matthew Kelly was drawing a parallel to the sacrament of confession. When we go to confession, we are extra cognizant of our actions, but over time we become lackluster in our steadfastness. We start to slip into sin. One sin doesn't seem like much so we "leave it for later." Over time the sins grow until we feel a heaviness in our hearts that we can no longer endure and go to confession. We need to clean our souls once again.


