AMI Pilot: What it does

- Engages valued members who are on the periphery due to:
 - pandemic
 - personal or other reasons
- Retains these members and transfers them State councils

- Manages and engages them from Supreme and State
- Allows councils to better focus on growth and engagement



AMI Pilot: How it works

Council identifies affected members

 Council requests they be designated as Affiliate Members and transferred to State

 District Deputy reviews the list and forwards it to Supreme for action or returns it to the council for corrections

Supreme manages the engagement of Affiliate Members



AMI Pilot: Benefits

- Better engagement of Affiliate Members
 - More suited to their circumstances

Reduced admin work and financial strain on councils

- Increased council focus on engagement and recruitment
- Retention of valuable members



AMI Pilot: Schedule

- Supreme to give training in August
- Limited Pilot scheduled for September October
 - College councils
 - Military councils
 - Tentative states: CT, NC, DC, TN, NM, AZ

Implementation of the Affiliate Member Initiative requires Board approval



AMI Pilot: Impact on current suspensions

- Continue to follow existing process (forms 1845, 100)
- Supreme will retain the members and transfer them to State
- Supreme will engage the members as Affiliates

Temporary measure recognizes financial stress and other difficulties imposed by the pandemic on members



AMI Pilot: Summary

This takes nothing away from traditional council members

Councils will be more effective with better morale

Members will be retained and engaged
