
I am also reminded of the Gospel Reading:

As a state, we need approximately 125 members each month these next four months to reach our goal for a third consecutive year—which to what we all recall has never been accomplished in Wisconsin history.



A huge mountain to climb—but not too different from what we overcame in 2021-2022 Fraternal Year to achieve COH that year and rank in the top 25 of the order in percent to goal!

What I am asking of each council is simply the following:

- ► Host two Exemplifications for your Council between now and June 30th.
- ► Conduct at least one Recruitment Event/Drive between now and June 1st (to allow for you to do an exemplification before June 30th).
- ► Reach out to your Parish Office and priest this upcoming week to 'ask' for the contact information for the RCIA Candidates and send each a personalized invite and 'congratulations' to them on joining the Church

Taking this a step further—I would love for each council to do a 'celebration' event—something small, such as coffee and donuts, etc.

BISHOPS, PRIEST, & Deacons, state families and membership, my brothers and sisters in Christ, greetings and blessings from the Nowak Agency.

I would like to share a short story. After hearing a Homily this week of Lent, I wanted to share the passage from Matthew 25:31-46. You all know the story- when did we see him hungry, thirsty or in jail? Then Father said something that I thought was profound and that I had not heard. He said that there are two kinds of Hate, Animosity and Apathy. I guess I want to expound on this thought with you for a couple of paragraphs if you will let me. First, I had to think about this in the matter of truth. Is there truth in the statement: "There are only two kinds of hate?" If you Google it, it says there are four kinds (I don't agree). Then if you look at your own likes and dislikes, that is not the same as hate is it? So, it is back to truth. It seems to me that it is true. Most people would not expect animosity to be the word most associated with Hate or Apathy for that matter.

So, Jesus Christ's deepest teaching on what Heaven is like, discuss the separating of the goats and sheep, is based on how they treated those who were in need. It is also going to happen based on how we were or weren't indifferent to those around us. This topic is not to make us feel bad or point fingers in any one direction but is to be a topic of discussion at your council level and maybe your small group level. Let me start with what I thought: Is my apathy really hate or something more or less? Then I move to Jesus's discussion - when I was thirsty, when I was naked, when I was hungry -I could have done more than I had done in all these areas. Okay, then I need to create a plan to not have as much apathy in my life.

Let me start again, animosity, by definition is a strong feeling of dislike or hatred or hostility and resentment. For example, I use Webster and absolutely hate Wikipedia—I'm almost even hostile toward them! The discussion should not surprise us. That we don't like some things or persons or behaviors is a lot like a house divided that Past Supreme Knight Carl Anderson wrote about. I would say voting for None of the above sounds about right. However back to us, for a minute. I have been at council meetings when discussing to have a fund raiser for someone's needs, a member asked " is he even a Knight?" That, my friends, is not a good question. I was with a family who had a child with cancer. As we talked, she had lived 5 years longer than expected, and was still fighting hard. I asked her dad when did he became a Knight? His name was John. He looked me right in the eye and said, "the day we went to the church for the spaghetti dinner that the Knights put on for us. I will never forget when we arrived the line went all the way around the church and weaved inside and out. I wasn't even a very good Catholic at the time" he said, "but Man was I a believer in the Knights of Columbus doing charity for my baby girl. I am a little better Catholic today but I am a Knight so I can do the same for the next family, no matter the need and no matter the race, religion or nationality. Yes, I am a Knight for life" he told me, and gave me a hug as I left his home that day. Our councils have to know we are needed today just as much or maybe even more than 30 years ago, one generation. We need more to see Jesus in all of those in need and do something - a lot of somethingsbecause at the end of the gospel reading it says " and these will go off to eternal punishment, but the

righteous to eternal life". I don't know much about goats and



sheep but I don't know about good works and what we are capable of doing. So let's commit this Lent to be driven by Charity in 2024.

STATE TREASURER'S REPORT

Brothers, Last month I encouraged you all to become a STAR Council and to make sure your Council was in good standing. Please remember, each Council must file an IRS Form 990 for the 2023 tax year. As a tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(8) of the Internal Revenue Code, compliance is essential for maintaining your tax exempt status.

Filing Requirements:

- ► Councils with gross receipts under \$50,000 and assets less than \$200,000: File Form 990-N (e-Postcard).
- ► Gross receipts between \$50,000 and \$200,000, with assets under \$500,000: File Form 990-EZ.
- ➤ Gross receipts \$200,000 or more, with assets \$500,000 or more: File Form 990.

Electronic Filing: All filings must be electronic through the IRS online system (E-Services). New users need to register or sign in with LOGIN.GOV or ID.me.

Deadline and Extensions: File by the 15th day of the fifth month after your accounting period. Extensions are available for Forms 990-EZ and 990 using Form 8868.

Penalties: Late filings may incur penalties of \$20 per day, up to \$11,000 or five percent of gross receipts.

Where to File:

- ► Form 990-N (e-Postcard): File online.
- ► Forms 990-EZ and 990: File online with instructions on the IRS website.

For issues with Form 990-N, contact the Knights


of Columbus Legal Department or IRS customer service if unable to e-file.

Resources: Utilize IRS resources and consult the Compliance Guide for Tax Exempt Organizations for guidance on maintaining tax-exempt status.

Please ensure timely compliance to avoid penalties and maintain your tax-exempt status.

If you are unable to e-file, please contact the legal department at Supreme by email. It is important to remember that each Council and Assembly fall under the Supreme tax ID and they can usually help get you answers


GUIDELINES FOR RAFFLES

Federal law prohibits depositing, sending, or delivering raffle tickets by United States mail. The law is designed to protect the integrity of raffles and other gambling activities, and to guard against illegal gambling schemes that may be carried out through the mail. Many states have similar laws. It is legally permissible to advertise raffles or send out promotional information by mail, but the raffle *tickets* should be delivered in person. Ideally, raffle tickets should be distributed to members during a council meeting or related council event.

Before conducting a raffle, the council should review all relevant laws and regulations and should take steps to ensure compliance.

We appreciate your patience during this time when you are attempting to complete your emembership transfers and new year membership billings, etc.

WGK & WFS please frequently review your council's prospect tab and if you are having difficulty in making contact, or any other issue, please email me regarding these outstanding assigned e-members and I will gladly assist you with reaching a remedy.

Remember:

- The PROSPECT tab shows. you e-members that have joined your council online via the Supreme app. and the date field is used when they have completed their exemplification.
- ► The **CANDIDATE** tab is what you use when you recruit a member locally or are handling a member transfer request or a



reinstatement of a prior member.

Again, the date field is the date they were exemplified by your council. Once you enter those dates in either tab, the members will be automatically transferred to your council's roster within the next week.

Do not send Form 100's to Supreme for new members, keep them for your councils records.

If you do not remember your log on credentials, click "Account Assistant" or "Password Reset" on the sign in page and follow the instructions. If additional assistance is required contact our Customer Service Department at 800-380-9995, option 2 and provide your membership number and role.

Currently there were 26 Silver Rose reports turned in to Supreme compared to the numbers I received from Supreme in November claiming only 8 councils reported having a service. We had 89% of the Councils that were scheduled host the Silver Rose send in a #10784 Thank You.

On the other end of the spectrum since July roughly 175 councils should have had the St, Joseph Icon available to them for having a service, yet only 26 form #10784's were filed with Supreme as of February 1st. Now the question arises are only 15% of the Councils having services with the St. Joseph ICON? Are the district Deputies making sure all their Councils have an opportunity to have a service with the ICON? Is my route planning that difficult that are numbers are this low? Please if you have any suggestions how this program can be improved send me a note so the next rotation starting July 1st will be able to run more smoothly.



NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION




With so many Councils operating or assisting with Fish Frys, pancake
