A Message from State Deputy Timothy L. Genthe



My Brother Knights, As the State Membership Coordinator, Jon Olson's report will tell you, we have a good month of recruiting in January with the Wisconsin Jurisdiction achieving 127% or our monthly quota. I would like to extend my thanks to the councils and coordinators of the La Crosse diocese for achieving 260%, Green Bay diocese for achieving 142% and the Milwaukee Archdiocese for achieving 100% of their monthly quotas. But the membership in Wisconsin jurisdiction shrunk by 8 members from the month of December and now stands 36,737 Knights of Columbus in the Wisconsin.

We need each diocese performing above their quota for rest of this fraternal year for the Wisconsin Jurisdiction to be successful. If your council needs help with recruitment contact your General Agent or Field Agent for your council or the Diocesan Membership Coordinator and State Membership Director Jon Olson. These gentlemen are here to help your council to be successful. It saddens me to report that we have 117 councils that have yet to bring in a member this year. "ONE MEMBER, PER COUNCIL, PER MONTH" If your council is one of these councils please ask these gentlemen to help your council develop a solid recruitment program. Your council's Semiannual Council Audit is due on February 15th. At this time we have 153 councils that have not completed the audit for the period ending December 30, 2013. Just a reminder to Financial Secretaries and Council Trustees if your council fails to submit an Audit for 2 consecutive periods the Financial Secretary will lose his Supreme Bonding. Let's not put your council's financial secretary in that kind of predicament.

I feel one of the most important reports is the Fraternal Activity Report. From this report Supreme gathers information needed to document hours and time councils spend doing charitable work. The IRS would just love to be able to tax organizations like the Knights of Columbus. This report was due on January 31st and at this time we still have 55 councils that have not submitted the Report of Fraternal Activity. A list of councils not submitting this report can be found in this newsletter. It is goals of the State Officer team to have every council submit the report of Fraternal Activities. If your council has not submitted their report the State Officer in charge of your diocese will be contacting your District Deputy or the Grand Knight of the council.

With the State Convention of the Wisconsin jurisdiction fast approaching, we have some due dates for some award applications that are getting close. State Program Director Don Schoenherr is collecting the Supreme Service Award Applications. The deadline date for this application is March 1. Remember there are two Convention forms that need to go to the State Office, the Convention Registration Form and the Delegate Registration Form. If your Council is not participating in anything at the convention please submit the forms stating this. Councils that have not submitted their Delegate Registration Form will be receiving their second notice in mid-March. Be sure to make your hotel reservation early if you would like to stay at the Radisson Paper Valley in Appleton.

Please do not forget bring the new Council Charity Grant Request form with your delegates to the State Convention. I am hearing, some of the councils feel that this form is too restrictive in what needs to be recorded as Charity Raffle donation. I would like to take this opportunity to quote from the Mission Statement of the Charity Fund in the Wisconsin Book.

"Grants from the Charity Fund will help alleviate sorrow, ease financial burdens and restore hope to families and victims of accidents and illness. This fund will also be the source of funding for vocations by the State Council."

I would be the first to agree with the membership that there are many other charitable needs by your churches, communities, youth and individuals, but these Raffle fund moneys need to be used within the mission statement of the program. We are called to be "True Knights" and raise funding for every project and charitable request what we receive.

ARE YOU READY TO RECRUIT???

February is the shortest month of the year. So in order to be able to accomplish something in it, we need to have a plan. A plan on what to do and how to act with potential members that you are recruiting this month. The items to have ready are where to recruit, members in place to recruit, and a schedule to implement the recruiting process. Let's break these down.

Where to recruit sound easy enough, at church right? But you are limiting the amount of people you can draw from if you recruit just in the back of Church. There should be some kind of recruiting in ALL your programs. There areas in Wisconsin where the area you live in is not always the area you go to church. This is due to a variety of reasons too numerous to mention here. Continue to promote and recruit at Church, but also promote and recruit other places that you know where eligible men are around.

Encourage ALL members to recruit. The more members recruiting, the recruits we can expect. The single man membership team cannot keep the flow of new members coming in to compensate for the amount lost in suspensions and death. Spread the word with every member saying it. This also may help a prospect hear the same message from different people. The more people prospects hear the good works, deeds, and fun things we do, the more they will want to be a part of it.

Have the schedule in place. A schedule of what is suppose to happen helps everyone including the recruit on the steps that need to be done and what needs to happen in the future. From the initial contact of the recruit all the way to the 3rd and 4th degrees scheduled. Grand Knights, you can print off a page of your fraternal activity planner, to map out your schedule and have it posted for ALL the members helping the council recruit new members.

Keeping these three items in mind will help guide you and your council in the quick pace you need to have in order to keep up with the **ONE MEMBER, PER COUNCIL, PER MONTH** goal expected by every council.

Message from State Treasurer Ron Faust

In the last couple of weeks I have received three questions about the administration of the State Charity Raffle Funds.

1) What is the due date of the Council Charity Request Form?

The date listed on the form, May 1, is correct. That is also the date listed on the FAQs. If you have been told a different date the person who told you is mistaken. Please don't hold it against them! This is new for all of us and it would not be the first time that the written communication did not match the oral communication. Many councils are planning to bring this form with them to the State Convention at the Radisson Paper Valley Hotel April 26 in Appleton, where they will turn it in to the State Charity Committee along with their tickets.

2) For what purposes can councils use funds that they receive from the State Charity Raffle? The purposes listed on the form (vocations support (RSVP), disaster relief for individuals, and relief of financial hardship due to accident or illness) seem to be rather narrowly defined.

The purposes listed on the form are the same ones listed in our standing rules as the intentions for the formation of the program. This is the same information furnished to the State Gaming Commission when we apply for our raffle license. Your State Charity Committee holds itself to these intentions for all of the money which it distributes. We are well aware that every council performs corporal acts of mercy far and above what they are able to perform with the money they receive from our State Charity Raffle. For that you have our very sincere admiration. But when it comes to the money you receive from the State Charity Raffle, we ask that your use it according to the publicly stated purposes for which it was raised. Please do not, however, for privacy reasons, list the names of the individuals or families which you help. For example, it is enough to say that you used the money to help families in need in your community.

3) If our council already has access to an account that is used for charitable purposes, and is separate from the one used for our general fund, can we also use that account for the funds received from the State Charity Raffle? The answer is yes. However, when you file your application please only report on the funds received from the State Charity Raffle. Thank you.

Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Run

The Running of the Rose is a huge program. Think of it. Every day from April to December 12th, 6 Silver Roses are being brought to people throughout the United States and Canada and prayers are being offered in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe and for her intercession.

I am asking is that you as a District or as a Council take a couple hours to receive the Rose and hold a prayer service. The prayer service can be at a church or council home. The service must NOT be associated with Mass. There is a prayer brochure. Local councils are responsible for the publicity in their area, conducting the prayer service and transporting the Rose to the next site. The Rose should be welcomed to the next site by officers and 4th Degree. Since the Squires initiated the Silver Rose in 1960, we should try to involve them in this run. The final route and schedule will be developed based on the response. We will develop information articles for the dioceses.

The planning guide map is a way to cover the entire State and to minimize driving distances on snow and ice and in the dark. All councils in the State are part of this run. Please respond as soon as possible. I know it is 3.5 months away, but we need a commitment now. Please let me know if you would love to have the prayer service. Maybe hold a reception and transfer the Rose to the next prayer site the next day.


A week or two before, publish a notice of the event in local church bulletins and newspapers. It is not restricted to Knights. It is not restricted to Catholics. In June we have daylight savings time, allowing more time for a service, unless it snows. You will be required to fill out the log with number of prayer services and people attending. If you use a blue vehicle for transporting, you don't even have to wash off the white salt. The colors are good for our Lady.

Based on the response, the route will start at La Crosse on 9 June, drive to my Council home, hold a prayer service and drive to the Illinois State line on the 29th. The route is flexible. As GK, I would not need a vote in the Council, just inform.

My problem is that Supreme has told me that they want a route plan and a list of local chairman in two weeks (exact date varies with form). Each site needs a local chairman. Supreme wants name, council #, city/jurisdiction, day or cell phone and e-mail address. I also need the exact location of the service (name and address) and estimated time (weekday vs weekend).

It would be super if we covered all five dioceses with 21 sites.
