If you have not yet done so—we need your council to submit ASAP the 12 month calendar of your planned church drives, exemplifications and programs/ events. This will allow our State leaders to properly assist and track the progress of each of our councils and successfully—we will reach membership heights we haven't seen in roughly a decade!!

To help incentivize membership growth and a 'FAST START' the State Council and Supreme have a few incentives to offer:

The award can be used at membership drives and other council events.

FIRST QUARTER RECRUITER INCENTIVE

Every individual recruiter who recruits 5 new members by September 30, 2023 will receive a limited-edition recruiters' lapel pin to show his pride in growing the membership of the Order.

KEY SUMMARY POINTS OF THE TRAINING

The following criteria must be met for a council to be Safe Environment compliant:

- ► The four positions listed in red below are required to complete the training once you receive the email from <u>Praesidium Academy.</u>
- Email addresses are mandatory to appoint members into ALL roles that have safe environment requirements. Emails must be unique to the member, NOT <u>gkcouncil123@XYZ.com</u> to ensure that members retain credit for completing their training and background checks. This training must be completed within 30 days of receiving email confirmation of appointment to a youth leader position. Grand knights and faithful navigators must ensure that youth leaders complete all training within the 30 days.
- ► 3) There must be a Grand Knight assigned via Form 185 through Member Management.
- 4) The council must have submitted Form 365 Report of Program Personnel or named program personnel via online Member Management. <u>Watch this</u> video to learn how to submit online.
- On the 365 Report, there must be three different members assigned to:
 - Program Director
 - Community Director
 - Family Director Grand Knights may only hold one of the additional director roles listed above.
- All roles above must complete the Safe Environment training. The Community Director and the Family Director must also provide consent for a background screening (criminal and motor vehicle records).

The Supreme Office conducts background checks on each applicant for youth leader positions that may include, among other things, the following:

- State and federal criminal background check.
- National Sex Offender Registry check.
- ▷ Social Security number trace.
- ▷ Alias search.

Youth leaders must complete their background check authorization within 30 days of appointment.

Child abuse is a complicated issue with many facets. Child abuse is a serious moral and criminal offense that, although sometimes difficult to detect, is a real and pervasive problem in all parts of the world. Among all forms of child abuse, sexual abuse may be the most easily hidden and yet be in plain sight. Here are some sobering statistics:

- One in four girls and one in six boys are abused sexually before age 18.
- ► Three out of four adolescents that were abused knew their abuser well.
- Parents, family members, friends of the parents and other caretakers can all be abusers.
- ► Thirty-two percent of perpetrators who were returned to the streets abused again.

State Online Membership

Financial Secretaries, Worthy District Deputies, having just completed my first 30 days as your State Online Membership Chairman, I wanted to stress the importance of at least the Financial Secretaries reviewing the PROSPECT tab in Officer Officer's Online on a daily basis, and the Grand Knight's checking the same on a weekly basis.

You are the only two Officers who can update the Prospects to members of your council.

District Deputies should be reviewing their assigned councils Prospects prior to attending a council meeting so that any lingering members can be discussed as to what action is being taken.

In reviewing my ASSIGNED Emembers reports, I find that there are assigned new e-members still showing up from 2022 and the early part of 2023.

These men are already Knights, and just need to be welcomed into you council and partake in the exemplification process to be full-fledged 3rd degree knights.

These programs were specifically selected because they give us the best opportunity for growth. The word growth can mean many things. The intended meaning in this case is that we can have a positive impact on the most people.

It is also important to point out that all these programs provide opportunities for councils and brother Knights that opportunity to put our found principles of Charity, Unity and Fraternity in action. Most importantly they give us the opportunity to grow as Catholics by helping others.

You will be seeing and hearing more about this program in the coming year. Please consider including one or more of them in your council program plan.

HISTORY BOOK

The Wisconsin State Council has received numerous requests to reduce the administrative burden of local councils. The annual History Book (HB) competition was identified as an area that should be reviewed. Councils identified that many HB inputs are also reported to Supreme in a different format.

To reduce the council administrative burden the History Book format is being updated for 2023.

The new format will leverage Supreme Forms whenever possible. The updated available on the state website. The format also outlines the scoring that will be used for the History Book Competition. It is anticipated that these updates will encourage more councils to participate in the annual competition.

The due dates for the HB competition will remain consistent from previous years.

- ► Feb 15 Councils Submit to District Deputies for scoring (DD)
- Mar 1 DD submit to Diocese Program Coordinator for scoring (DPC)
- Apr 1 State Level Judging (Meeting Date TBD)

To assist councils with the new format two documents are available on the Wisconsin State website.

- History Book Format this is an outline of the new format that includes scoring.
- History Book Layout this is an example of how the new format.

District Deputy (DD). If the DD is unable to answer the question, they will contact the DPC. *Vivat Jesus!*



BROTHERS, HERE IN August, I remind you that the 2 Community Programs the State Team is asking every Council to focus on this year are Coats for Kids and Habitat for Humanity. Once again, I ask you to aim to increase your number of volunteers involved and number of coats given out this year by at least 10%. This can also go for other items given out as well (boots, hats, mittens/gloves, scarves, snowpants, etc.).

<u>Coats are now available and ready to order</u>. This year a limited supply of toddler coats will be offered, allowing Councils to provide coats to children ages 1-high school. <u>Click here</u> for more information.

Though the weather outside is warm or hot, it's never too early to start looking for sites in major need of coats, especially those in minority and high poverty areas. If you know of such, places where there could be good exposure and prospects for new Knights of Columbus, let your DPC, Diocesan Director or State Officer in Charge, or me know the details. You may well qualify them for matching numbers of coats or funds for the annual "Black Friday" distribution program supported by State and Supreme. Proposals for such are usually needed to be to Supreme by mid-October, so put your ideas in to State soon!

Visit <u>Habitat for Humanity</u>'s website to learn more about a Habitat project close to you. We'll be trying in the months ahead develop a listing of Habitat contacts for all Wisconsin State Councils and Districts. Hopefully, all Councils can get involved or expand their activities in working on projects, holding fundraisers to make donations to Habitat projects, working at Habitat Re-Store, assisting with other Habitat operations, etc.

Also, here in August, get your youth programs organized. Hold your PPK and fall Soccer Challenge competitions. Work with your schools, DREs and CCD coordinators, homeschool parents and organizations, to make preparations for the Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest (October-November), Christmas Poster Contest (November-December), Knowledge and Free Throw Contests (December-March).

All the materials for the Citizenship Essay Contest (grades 8-12) can be found at www.kofc.org/essay. The 2023-24 Essay topic is now available on the Supreme website.

The Supreme Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest has now changed to a grade level instead of an age level competition. Kindergarten will have its own category, only for kindergarten students. <u>Click here</u> for more information. *NOTE:* These changes may allow us to merge the older State "True Meaning of Christmas" Contest and the Supreme Contest together to eliminate conflicts. ANTI-TRAFFICKING AWARENESS

IF YOU HAVEN'T seen <u>Sound of Freedom</u>, you should. The movie resonated with me right away, as the first scene takes place in Tegucigalpa, Honduras. My father and I traveled to Trujillo, Honduras in 1996 to help build an orphanage. We lived there for six months to help with the construction of the buildings throughout the Farm of the Child. We drove a donated Ford E-450 van from Burlington, Wisconsin to Trujillo, Honduras, and the orphanage we helped to build has saved hundreds of Honduran children from extreme poverty, starvation, and neglect. But more than that, it protected them from being swept up by child traffickers.

Most of the children who were brought to the orphanage were called "abandonados"— abandoned by their parents. Many were brought in through the Catholic Church or from a Honduran social service agency without even so much as a birth certificate. In the eyes of the government, they didn't even exist. It would have been very easy for a child trafficker to abduct these children at the city square; instead, many of them were found there by the Catholic Church. I helped retrieve one of the "abandonados" from a faroff pueblo high in the mountain range in the State of Colon, Honduras. His name was Eddy. His stomach was distended from malnutrition and his hair was falling out. He was three years old. At the Farm of the Child, Eddy went to school every day. Eventually, he graduated high school and now has his own family and a good job, thanks to those who made Farm of the Child possible. His story is one of many happy endings. Yet some are not so fortunate.

I walked out of the Sound of Freedom movie angry and sad, but inspired. In recent weeks, so many people have been contacting me, asking what they can do about child-trafficking. You can do something about it. A pregnant sex-slave completely useless to a sextrafficker—so abortion is the answer to that "problem." You can help those moms who were being trafficked by donating funds to your local pregnancy resource center! And then, you can apply for an ASAP Grant for any donation between \$500 and \$2,000. Anything above \$2,000 is completely appreciated, but Supreme Council will only match funds between these amounts, making their grant limit \$400, essentially (\$100 ASAP funds for every \$500 up to \$2,000).

Thanks for all you do to end abortion! *Vivat Jesus*! Dan Miller


