approval and financing. We accomplished Circle of Honor for the nineth year in a row and together we can make it ten years in a row this year. Membership is just apart of COH and the other components are judged from reports turned in by the councils, completing Safe Environment Training and Fraternal Benefit Nights, just to list a few. People have asked why are you always recruiting men to join the Knights of Columbus. I explain to them how hard men have worked to do charitable works, host pancake breakfasts, serve our parishes, help our priests, Abbot, Bishop, and Archbishop, just to list a few of the things we do. Finding replacements to continue our good work is why we are recruiting. We lost about 175 Knights in Oklahoma this past year due to death. Without new members to continue our good work our councils will disappear.

Younger Men are looking for a place to grow spiritually. We need to add these programs to our council programs. We need to help men and their families grow in faith. On the Supreme website, you

will find a complete list of programs to utilize. The time is now to help men grow in faith.

The past two years we've taken part in the K of C Coats for Kids program and provided disaster relief in the Diocese of Tulsa and the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City, working with both Catholic Charities. And Tepeyac Hill is part of an ongoing fund-raising campaign of The Oklahoma Knights of Columbus, which means every Knight in Oklahoma. We are raising funds to pay for the statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe and St Juan Diego. I know brother Knights in the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City have been making payments on their five-year pledge for the shrine. The five years are now up and I am asking you to continue your pledge for one additional year. For those of you in the Diocese of Tulsa, please email MMireless@archokc.org to make your pledges and for those who did not make a previous pledge for the shrine, please go to http://rothershrinf.org/tepeyac. This will not go away until we have paid for the statues. Please pray about it and make a pledge today.

Now let's discuss how you can serve your council. Become active in meetings and consider becoming an officer in your council. All councils need new people to serve and help grow the council. How long should you be a Grand Knight? Two Years. If you've served more than two years, ask yourself if the council is growing? Remember, councils only grow when we allow new people to become involved

and endorse the projects and programs they would like to see the council perform.

## Joe Pierce dies

(Editor's Note: The following is an obituary notice for Joe Pierce, a longtime Knight who gave tirelessly to helping the Center of Family Love, which he helped to start in 1981.)

Gene Joseph "Joe" Pierce, passed away Thursday, April 6th, 2023 at the age of 94.

Born September 30th, 1928 in Welch, OK, he was raised during the depression with 9 siblings. He then moved to Miami, OK in 1961. He moved to Stillwater, OK in 1983 where he lived until his death.

Joe worked for B.F. Goodrich for 30 years and was also a house construction contractor. He served in the United States Marine Corp for several years. He was also a great fast pitch softball pitcher.

His true calling by God came after his son, Jody, was born in 1964. Jody was born with Down Syndrome and was blind. The birth of his child, Jody, transformed Joe from and ordinary good family man into someone along the lines of a saint.

Doctors in the early 60's advised him to abandon Jody to an institution where horrible conditions were known to exist. He instead chose to love Jody and take him with his family everywhere and to all events their lives presented. Joe, with inspiration from God, decided to devote and sacrifice most of his adult life to building greater, loving homes with facilities and workplaces for the developmentally disabled to live and lead productive, meaningful, independent lives. He succeeded way beyond his goals.

He, along with others, raised millions of dollars in donations, grants, and loans, that helped create the Center of Family Love in Okarche, OK. He also established the Stillwater Group Homes in Stillwater, as well as Group Homes throughout Oklahoma. These places thrive today and have become even greater, all thanks to his inspiration and never-ending hard work for over 55 years.

He was a member of the Saint Francis Xavier Catholic Church in Stillwater, OK. He has also been a member of the Knights of Columbus for 60 years.

He was preceded in death by his loving wife, Dorothy Ann and his son, Christopher "Jody" Pierce.

He is survived by his brother, Sam Pierce; a sister, Betty Chenoweth; his son, John Samuel Pierce; grandsons, John Samuel Pierce, Jr. and Zachary Bryan Pierce; and six great grandchildren.

A Rosary was scheduled for April 20th, at Saint Francis Xavier Catholic Church, 711 N. Country Club Road in Stillwater. Funeral Mass was set for April 21st, also at the church, with Rev. Brian O'Brien. Graveside service and burial will follow at 3:00 p.m. at the Welch Cemetery, Welch, OK.






## at the BLESSED STANLEY ROTHER SHRINE

## A few convention reminders from the SS

It seems like we just celebrated the birth of our Lord and just like that, it's State Convention month. Here are a few convention reminders:

## Registration

Everyone planning to attend the state convention should complete a registration form, even if you are not attending any of the events that have a dollar cost. This helps us better plan the event and keeps the host district volunteers from having to hand-write a badge for you at the door. If you are attending any of the paid events, registration and payment are required ahead of time to help us get the proper number of meals. Probably by the time you read this, package discounts will have expired meaning the price of the complete package will be \$140/person. And all event and package prices are per person meaning if your wife is coming along with you, you will need to purchase tickets for her as well, unless you intend to make her stay in your room during the events. Registration forms (green sheet) were sent to all Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries. The form is also available in downloadable format on the state website. And you can register online in the State Convention section of the state website as well.

## **Hotel Accommodations**

If you are wanting to stay at the NCED in Norman for some or all of the convention, you will need to make your own reservations – the State Council will not be making those for you. Information on this was sent out with the above-mentioned packets. There is also a link in the State Convention section of the state website that will take you straight to the hotel's registration page. If you book your reservation prior to April 17th, the room rate will be \$99/night plus tax. Booking after April 17th will incur the normal rate so book early!

## **Report of Delegates**

Some of you may be operating under the impression that registering as mentioned above gets you officially recorded as a delegate. This is not true. Delegate credentials are generated from the Report of Delegates sheet (yellow) that was included in the convention packets. If your council intends to send delegates to vote at the convention and has not submitted an official Report of Delegates, please make sure that gets sent immediately. It must be filled out, signed by your Grand Knight, Recorder,

and Financial Secretary, embossed with your council seal, and returned to me via snail mail. Scans cannot be accepted. This form is also available to download on the state website.

#### Credentials

Credentials will be snail-mailed to all delegates of record mid-April. To receive a delegate (i.e. voting) badge at the convention, delegates must bring their credentials with them and surrender them to the registration desk at the state convention. Any non-delegates attending the convention will be issued a non-delegate badge provided you registered ahead of time, otherwise, you get one of those handwritten ones I mentioned earlier. Also, remember to bring your Knights ID card – Third Degree, not Fourth – regardless of your delegate status.

## **Per Capita**

This brings me to Per Capita. Your council must be in good standing with both the State Council as well as Supreme in order for you to receive your delegate credentials. I will be sending reminders to councils who registered delegates and who are not in good standing. However, you might want to check with your council officers to ensure your council is current.

## **Deceased Brothers**

If you have not attended a state convention or Memorial Mass, you may not be aware that at the Memorial Mass on Saturday, April 29th, we will be reading a list of names of brothers who have died since last year's state convention. These names have been accumulated throughout the year from Memorial Mass reguests and email notifications. The current list is on the state website. Please review it to see if your deceased brothers are already on the list. If not, you can email me with their names prior to the convention or you can update the last-chance list that circulates during Saturday's business session at the convention. All I ask is that you not put your own name on it thinking it's the daily sign-in sheet.

## **Candidacy**

Any Third Degree Knight is eligible to run for state office and/or Supreme Convention delegate. In this state, brothers interested in state office usually declare for State Warden and stair-step through the offices from there. However, there's nothing in the bylaws to prevent a candidate for declaring for any office.

Supreme Convention this year is in Orlando, FL. Delegates at the Supreme Convention are designated Insurance Delegate or Associate Delegate. As the name implies, you can only declare for Insurance Delegate if you are an Insurance member in the Knights. Only Insurance delegates get to vote but the overall experience is pretty much the same for both levels. I highly recommend it as it is always a lot of fun. In any case, if you intend to run for anything, you will need someone to nominate you and tell us why you deserve to be on the ballot, and someone to second your nomination. Candidacy declarations for either state officer or Supreme Convention delegate should be submitted to me ASAP. This way I can deliver all declarations to the host district ahead of time to be printed and included in the packets given to all attendees. This way, they can get to know you in advance and not have to make up their minds at voting time.

Well, I know that's a lot of info, but thank you for reading this far. As always, I'm happy to answer questions. My contact info is on the second page of this publication. See you in Norman!
