The District Deputies were sent home with the minute books from last year's state councils meeting, State Directories for each council and a Fraternal Planner (sort of a K of C day planner) for each Grand Knight. We installed State Officers and newly appointed District Deputies.

District Deputies will be holding their District Organizational meetings in the next few weeks. All Grand Knights, Deputy Grand Knights, Financial Secretaries, Program and Membership Directors should attend.

We did a lot of preparation this time last year and had a good year. This year we are very well prepared and should have a great year!

Supreme set aside Round Tables last year. This year they want a Round Table for each parish where a council supports more than one parish, or for each ethnic group if a council supports more than one ethnic group. Round Table paperwork (two different forms) has to be filed out annually, and the Priest must sign it. Please send your paperwork in to Supreme!

Remember we have only until November to finish the four requirements for the "Year of the Family Icon" for your council. Every council in Arkansas should be able to earn one of these beautiful Icons to hang in their council meeting place.

Based on a percentage glide path your membership goal accomplishment should be the following: July 8%, August 17%, and September 25%. Maintain this glide as your minimum goal and recruit too always be ahead of the glide path because catching up is a struggle.

Retention is a key to success for membership accomplishment. When you drop a member you then have to recruit additional members to meet your goal. Have a good retention committee on your Team.

All Council Officers should be leading by example and have an active role in Recruiting.

OWNERSHIP: When you recruit a new member it is important that you take ownership of him. Be a mentor; take him to the 2nd and 3rd Degree's. Get him involved in activities. Everyone can't do everything but they can be involved some activities. Involvement of members keeps the Council growing.

GRAND KNIGHTS USE YOUR SUCCESS PLANNER THAT YOU HAVE BEEN PROVIDED. MAKE THIS INFORMATION AVAILABLE TO ALL YOUR MEMBERS BECAUSE THIS WILL KEEP THEM INFORMED OF UPCOMING EVENTS. REMEMBER A KNIGHT WILL BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IF THEY HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO PLAN FOR EVENTS.

September: Plan an Order your Recruiting Blitz material for the State Wide Church Drive coming in October, this is a great recruiting activity, plan well.

20th Annual "Just Ask" Fund Raising Campaign

The Knights of Columbus membership in Arkansas gave generously to the 2012 "Just Ask" Fund. Last year \$32,737.98 was donated and distributed to the following Diocesan Ministries: Catholic Charities, The Arkansas Catholic, Council of Women Religious, the Vocations Ministry, and the Respect Life Office. Other beneficiaries of your generosity were: the Director of the Cory House at Subiaco, Hispanic Community Encounter, and the Seminarian Fund.

The Bishop of Little Rock, the Most Reverend Anthony B. Taylor is very appreciative of this financial support from the Arkansas State Council of the Knights of Columbus, especially our support for financing the Chapel in the Discernment House now under construction on the site of Our Lady of Good Counsel in Little Rock. Our financial help is needed by the Bishop, the Diocesan Staff, Priests, Seminarians, Deacons, and Lay Ministers who serve the people of God and the many needs of our Catholic Community. The Knights of Columbus HAVE and DO make a difference to the Church.

As a Catholic layman you may be contributing to the Diocesan Ministry CASA and the "Taste of Faith" events, however, your modest donation for the "Just Ask" campaign as a Knight of Columbus will reinforce the Knights of Columbus in Arkansas are very active and physically supporting the Bishop.

STATE CHAIRMAN - ARKANSAS SPECIAL OLYMPICS DUB GREEN

From the feedback received from the Arkansas Special Olympics Board of Directors, our volunteers and many of the athletes and their families, Olympic Town at the 2013 Special Olympics State Competition was a rousing success. We are extremely grateful to, and proud of, the 42 volunteers from Hot Springs Village and the 8 others from throughout Arkansas, plus the walkons who helped work at Olympic Town. Many of our volunteers said the time spent in Searcy was not nearly long enough and have already signed up for the 2014 games.

Update: Part of the basketball game had to be repaired. A Sacred Heart council member has made those repairs. We have also modified the 2 bean bag throw games (to make it easier for our volunteers to retrieve the bean bags). Additionally, I have purchase another game for next year. It consists of 2 boards (very much like the Washer Game boards) but using bean bags, which are included with the game. I feel it will be a big hit with the athletes and will help accommodate the large crowds that visit Olympic Town (approximately 1300 this year).

David Minster, a brother Knight from the Horseshoe Bend council, was a volunteer this year. He is so enthusiastic about the experience that he has invited myself and my wife, Geri, to attend their meeting in September. He has also invited members of the Cherokee Village council to attend that meeting, hoping to get those councils involved in this worthwhile effort. I will give a video presentation and Geri will meet with the ladies and show them how she paints the beads, which they offered to assist in painting.

We have also been invited to Fairfield Bay, where the ladies have asked that Geri give them a demonstration in bead painting. They hope to assist with painting up to 5000 beads (of the 10,000 needed each year).

I feel it is a privilege and a blessing that the Knights of Columbus have entrusted me to lead them at Olympic Town.

The start of the New Fraternal Year is here: Some very important things to note!

This is a second and a very rewarding time for Msgr. Friend, our Diocesan Vocation Director. He has accomplished his long term GOAL! We now have 40 plus seminarians. I am not exactly sure of the final number, as assignments are still in progress. I should know by the middle of August. Forty plus - This number represents the need for more of our Councils and Assemblies to join the effort to support ALL our seminarians thru the RSVP.

The FINAL TOTAL of our support for last year was 61 awards, That's an increase from the year before and an excellent showing of support for the RSVP. However, I would point out – that number (61) results from Councils and Assemblies providing multiple awards, i.e. a couple of councils supporting 4 or more and several Councils and Assemblies supporting 3. We have –53 active Councils in the State and we have 27 councils participating in the RSVP. We have 31 Assemblies and 8 are participating. As you can see, we can and should have more participation from Councils and Assemblies. Please review your resources at the start of the Fraternal year, perhaps your Council or Assembly could make a commitment to join the effort to support ALL the seminarians. Keep in mind, several of our Past State Deputies and our current State Deputy have made promises to Bishop Taylor to support each seminarian with 2 Awards.

Coordination is of the utmost importance to see that our combined efforts are shared equally among our seminarians. Please contact me to avoid some seminarians getting multiple awards (3 or more) and some get none.
