STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE—August 2018

Dear Brother Knights of Saskatchewan,

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drive will collect the names of prospective knights and create visibility through a message to the parishioners.

- 4. Meet with your parish priest to discuss the Faith in Action Model and plan to conduct several activities from now till Christmas.
- 5. Order your Soccer Challenge kit if you plan to conduct the Youth Soccer Challenge.
- 6. Ensure that the required council officers complete the 'Safe Environment Training'. Required Councils Officers are the Grand Knight, Council Program Director, Council Family Director and Council Community Director.

This program is not difficult to complete. It protects you and the council as well as children. It is also a requirement for the Columbian and Star Council Awards.

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

September 2018 State Newsletter, Chaplain's Message

At the recent Supreme Convention, the State Chaplains of the Order were given an in-depth introduction to the new "Faith in Action" program which expresses the Order's new focus for the coming years, replacing the "Surge with Service" program. The "Faith in Action' program is aimed at building a deeper spirituality: a deeper closeness to our faith, for our members, and in my mind I see this change as a recognition that what the Order needs today is a deeper relationship with our God and a better understanding of the teachings and history of the Church.

Interestingly enough, the Supreme Convention occurred just over a week after the 50th Anniversary of the Papal Encyclical of Pope Paul VI, *Humanae Vitae*, which was promulgated on July 25th, 1968. In the past *Humanae Vitae* has often been attacked as 'Pope Paul banning the Birth Control Pill,' but it is actually a celebration of the sanctity of life which was being endangered by societal attitudes toward life issues. It is a reminder to the world that its move toward abortion, birth control and a culture of death is in opposition to the principles of Christianity, and Pope Paul wrote it so that Catholics would be reminded of the principles of life which are central of our Faith.

And so, this 50th Anniversary of *Humanae Vitae* is a good time for us to make the effort to better understand this document and how central it is to our Faith. It is a short Encyclical and I encourage everyone to take the time to read it (easily found on the internet) so as to better understand it, our Faith and our Church. After all, to study *Humanae Vitae* is to be in tune with the aims of the Order's 'Faith in Action' program, to serve the Church and Family while growing in our Faith.

He enjoyed planting the crops in the spring, and then harvesting his rewards in the fall, plus being around cattle, but especially loved being around horses. He often reminisced about driving a team of horses on a sleigh in the winter with the bells on their harness ringing. In his younger years Jerome played baseball and hockey with the Windthorst Pirates, and then later in life he coached both sports at the minor and senior level. In addition to farming, Jerome drove a school bus route for many years and later sold Knights of Columbus Life Insurance for 13 years. Both gave Dad opportunities to do what he loved best, connect with people, young and old. Church Recruitment Drives: --For 2018

- 1. Contact your pastor for permission to hold a drive on a particular week-end. ***It is a good idea to complete a prospect list of prospective knights in the parish in consultation with the pastor.
- Provide an announcement for the parish bulletin 2 weeks before the drive. Go to kofc.org/drive for sample announcements.
- 3. Prepare a council pamphlet of council's charitable programs and member benefits.
- 4. Before each Mass, post teams of two to distribute the pamphlets, invitation cards and prospect cards (#921A) to each prospective member.
- 5. Arrange for your pastor, grand knight or membership director to make a brief announcement prior to or after Mass explaining the charitable works conducted by your council.
- 6. Encourage men to complete the prospect card and hand it to the grand knight as they leave church.--- names and phone numbers only.
- 7. After Mass, post teams of two at the exit to answer any questions from prospective members, assist with membership documents and collect completed prospect cards.
- 8. Assign recruiting teams for personal follow-up with prospective members. Invite prospective members and their families to participate in upcoming charitable programs, and invite them to an admission Degree which should be held within 2 weeks of the Church Drive.
- ** Councils can hold Church Drives in any month. It is important, however, for each Council to hold at least two church Drives in each Columbian Year. Statistics show that Councils that hold Church Drives are very successful in recruiting new members and usually meet or exceed their membership quota.

 Also, church drives bring the visibility of the knights to the parishioners and all the inactive knights in the parish.

22 RECRUITMENT PROJECTS THAT WORK

- 1. Church Drives—We ask that each council hold a church drive in Oct. and one in March. (or other suitable months for your council)
- 2. Grand knights should have ordered the kits and made all necessary arrangements. Hold a church drive in another month if it is more suitable for your council.
- 3. Compile a prospect list---assign a knight and his wife or teams of knights to each prospect couple and arrange visits.
- 4. At one of your monthly meetings, each knight could invite a prospect to attend a meeting where information can be given to the prospect. Be sure to follow up with the prospect on joining the council.
- 5. Free Test Drive----Invite prospects to assist with Knights of Columbus Projects. ---Concentrate on youth projects for younger prospective knights.
- 6. Schedule Admission Degrees-----There should be 1/ month in each district. All councils in the district work towards bringing candidates to the degree. If there are no candidates, hold a practice.
- 7. Show recruitment videos on successful recruiting techniques at meetings.
- 8. Invite State officers, District Deputies, Field Agents, SPDs to visit your council to talk about recruitment strategies and techniques.
- 9. Emphasize why we recruit- we recruit to save lives and souls by bringing families closer to the Catholic Church which is the body of Christ. Incentives are tokens of appreciation for good recruiting.
- 10. Pulpit Announcements- Use the Supreme samples available. Go to kofc.org/drive as well as the "Father Needs You Letter".
- 11. Communicate the State, Supreme and Council incentives to members. Give all council members a list.
- 12. Keep the Membership Personnel motivated through the VIP Club, incentives, certificates, or thank you letters from the Grand Knight, State Deputy, or Membership Director.
- 13. 'Father Needs You Campaign'—send a letter from your parish priest which explains why the parish

- priest needs men to join the Knights of Columbus.—follow up with a visit to each recipient.
- 14. Member Reactivation of Inactive Insurance Members---contact them and welcome them back to your council. They would count for an insurance and membership addition.
- 15. Check your Former Members List which is available from Supreme. Invite all former members back to your council with a 'Welcome Back' letter. Follow up with a personal visit.
 - a. Readmissions- termination has been for more than 3 months but less than 7 years--council vote, does not take degrees over
 - b. Reapplication-termination has been for more than 7 years—reapplies to a council, does not take degrees over.
 - c. Check for Honorary Life Members who are suspended. Any member who had 25 consecutive years of membership before being suspended and is now over 70 years of age would qualify for an honorary life membership in the council. Explain this to him and fill in a form 100 with him.
- 16. VIP Club----Very Important Proposer's Club program has a pin and certificate for 2, 5, 10, 15, 25, 50, 75, 100, etc. level of recruitment. Recruitment statistics are kept by the Supreme Membership Department. Financial secretaries must submit forms for recruitment levels and order awards.
- 17. Appoint all council membership personnel: membership director, retention director, insurance promotion, admission committee. Also set up recruitment teams of proven recruiters. Conduct a membership meeting and plan a yearly plan of membership activities and inform all the council members.
- 18. Set membership quotas for Star Council and involve the whole council in achieving the goal.
- 19. Hold a Council Open House which will include invitations to prospective knights, program of activities for the children, and a program of activities and information for the prospective members and their wife.
- 20. Be visible in the church---if members of your parish see what the knights are doing and like what they see, they will more likely join.
- 21. Ask your Parish Priest to talk briefly about why he needs more knights in the parish as well as about how the knights help the parish.
- 22. We suggest that Admission Degrees can be held each month in honor of the following:

Membership Recruitment Ouick Start Plan--2018

 Recruitment Incentives for July, August and September, 2018 will be provided for RECRUITERS as follows:

Recruiter Incentives

- Each recruiter who recruits 2 members between July 1st September 30th, 2018 will receive a Father McGivney or Our Lady of Guadalupe Rosary.
- b. Each recruiter who recruits 3 members between July 1st September 30, 2018 will receive a Rosary and a Golf Shirt.
- c. Each recruiter who recruits 4 members between July 1st September 30, 2018 will receive a Rosary and a K of C Watch.
- d. Each recruiter who recruits 5 members between July 1st September 30th, 2018 will receive a Rosary, a watch, a 50 dollar Gift Card for Knights Gear (Supreme Incentive) along with free shipping and a 25 dollar gift card for Knights Gear from Saskatchewan State Council.

District Deputy Incentive:

e. Each District Deputy who promotes and works to hold a church drive with one of his councils between July 1st - September 30th, 2018 with a minimum of 2 members recruited will receive a golf shirt.
Each district Deputy who promotes and works with 2 of his councils to hold 2 church drives between July 1st. September 30th, 2018 with a minimum of 5 members in total will receive a K of C watch.
Districts with no DD- The cluster leader will receive the same incentive as the DD if he works with the councils to promote and organize the church drives.

State Leadership Incentive:

- f. Each state leader (state officers, district deputies, state program directors, state program chairmen, agents, charitable foundation members, Grand Knights) will enter their name into a draw, for each member recruited, for 1 of 5 golf shirts.
- g. Each fraternal leader who recruits 3 members between July 1st- Sept. 30, 2018 will receive a green tie compliments of the State Deputy.

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2. Communication for the July, August and September Quick Start Membership Action Plan:

- a. State Membership Team will design an attractive poster of information about the 2018 July, August and September Quick Start Incentives with copies distributed to DDs at the Organizational Meeting July 6-8th.
- b. The State Deputy and State Membership Director will send a joint communique to Council GKs, Council Membership Directors, DDs, State Officers, Charitable Foundation Members, Agency, and State Program Directors and Chairmen announcing the Sask. State Quick Start Action Plan in the July Knightline. The poster of information will be included. Grand Knights will be encouraged to post the poster on their Parish Bulletin Board and send it to their members.
- c. The communications team will place the Poster and Quick Start Plan on the State Website and Social Media.
- d. Following the State Organizational Meeting, DDs will contact all councils in their District to review with the GK the Quick Start information, and the church drive schedule.
- e. Progress Status will be reviewed at the District Meetings and follow up phone calls to DDs will be made by the State Deputy and/or State Membership Director.
- f. Progress REPORTS, PHOTOS, and a list of CHURCH DRIVES and RECRUITERS reaching targets will be posted on the State Website and in the monthly Knightline.
- The Roundtable Chairman will renew all Round tables in Sask. by Mid-October and will encourage all roundtables to participate in the Recruitment Ouick Start Program.
- The Shining Armor Award will be promoted at the Organizational Meeting, as well as by the DDs, by the GKs and by mentors during all degrees.
- The Recruitment Mentorship Program will be implemented by the GK each time a new member is recruited.
- Insurance Promotion and Reactivation will be emphasized at the Organizational Meeting.
- 7. The State General Program Director will work with the State Program Directors to come up with some ideas for "Family Parish Faith In Action" programs that can be conducted during the months of July, August and Sept. These events will provide opportunities to recruit volunteers and parishioners.
- A schedule of all degrees, summer quick start information, Supreme Recruitment training accessibility and pertinent information on membership

- delivered at the Organizational meeting will be available on the State Website.
- During the Organizational Meeting on July 6th, 7th and 8th in the Battlefords, the DDs will be informed of the Strategic Action Plan for Membership and Programs and how they align with RECRUITMENT.
 - The DDs will schedule a District meeting in their District preferably no later than Aug, 15th.
 - The DD will deliver the membership goals and recruitment initiatives to the councils ASAP after the Organizational Meeting.
- The Retention Chairman will work with DDs and Councils to retain all members.
- 11.A list of Former Members of each council will be provided to DDs who will work with the councils on inviting these members back to the Order. A Welcome Back Letter signed by the State Deputy and Membership Director will be made available to DDs and councils to deliver to members who they feel would be reinstated or reactivated. (Sept. Initiative)
- Generic "Father Needs You" Letter will be provided to DDs at the Organizational Meeting. DDs will pass the letters to the Grand Knights at the District Meetings.
- Admission Degrees will be scheduled in each District and will be posted on the State Website.
- 14. Pairs of "Two Man Recruiting Teams" will be established at the Organizational Meeting with a minimum of one scheduled Church Drive in each District.
- 15. The Canada Cup Canadian Challenge will be promoted at the Organizational Meeting, in Knightline Monthly Editions, by the DD and State Officers when visiting councils, and on the State Website.

Brothers Knights:

Faith in Action: A New Model for a New Age

July 1st, the new program model "Faith in Action" came into effect bringing a new focus on programs in four categories - Faith, Family, Community and Life. Faith in Action is straightforward and easy to implement. When we come together as Knights, we accomplish great things. Each task we undertake makes a difference in the lives of everyone involved. It answers people's prayers. It changes you, and everyone you encounter, forever. With our new programs, we'll keep making a difference, touching hearts and together bringing the joy of Christ to the world.

Your council should have now appointed individual faith, family, community and life directors. There will no longer be a need to appoint a youth or council director. All Youth and Council categories have been consolidated into the Faith, Family and Community categories. No programs have been eliminated.

Yes, there now is a change to the SP-7 - Columbian Award requirements. Councils now have to complete 4 programs in 4 categories instead of 4 programs in 6 categories. That means completing only 16 programs instead of 24 programs as in previous years. Supreme has introduced 9 new programs. Four of these are required programs - in each category there is 1 required program to earn the Columbian Award. With the 4 required programs - 1 in each category, councils now only have 12 more programs to do - 1 program/month. Supreme has kept all 8 featured programs as in previous years. Featured program used to count for the entire category in the SP-7, now it counts as 2 credits or 1/2 of the category.

Each year, the Activity Program Awards recognizes those councils conducting outstanding activities in each of the ten category activities: Faith Activity, Family Activity, Community Activity, Life Activity, Council Activity, Youth Activity, Young Adult Activity, Membership Activity, Special Olympics Activity and PR/Communications Activity.

Activity has to be submitted on the Council Activity Program Description Form and forwarded (electronically preferred) to the State General Program Director with copies to District Deputy and Council file no later than March 1, 2019.

Copy of the form can be located on the State website, www.kofcsask.com.

Councils can submit their reports to me, whether it be in electronic format or a hard copy. E-mail address is <u>programs@kofcsask.com</u>.

Activity Program Awards will be based on three levels:

- 1. Large Council over 80 members
- 2. Medium Council 51 to 80 members
- 3. Small Council under 50 members

Awards will be based upon the council that conducts well-rounded Faith in Action programs. Programs need to be conducted in each of the ten categories by the council from March 1, 2018 to March 1, 2019.

Judging will be based on:


- 1. Activity originality was this a new Faith in Action activity for the Council.
- 2. Nature of the activity was it a faith-filled program that attracted men and their families.
- 3. Participation of members in activity how many members and percent of membership participated?
- 4. Results what was the purpose of the activity? Did the results affect the Faith, Family, Community or Life aspect of the Church and/or community?

ACTIVITY PROGRAM STATE-WIDE RECOGNITION

Each individual State Program Director (SPD) will be responsible for selecting the single best Faith, Family, Community, Life, Council, Youth, Young Adult, Membership, Special Olympics and PR/Communications total activities conducted by an individual council in the twelve month period between the state conventions. Each SPD will review their respective category Council Activity Program Description Form for completeness and accuracy. Each SPD will have control over what activities councils can claim on reports for their respective categories. Each SPD must establish a reason for disallowing an activity claimed in their respective category.

Plaques will be awarded to each council selected on the program effectiveness of the faith-filled program in each of the ten categories. All plaques will be handed out at the annual convention of the State Council.

SUPREME/STATE COUNCIL SERVICE PROGRAM AWARDS:

Form STSP - State Council Service Program Awards Entry Form for Faith, Family, Community and Life. Complete and submit one form per entry per program, along with supporting documentation for each entry.

State/Supreme Council is looking for one activity that best exemplifies the best program conducted by the councils in each of the four categories - Faith, Family, Community and Life. Entries are judged first and foremost on program effectiveness. Award application content is also extremely important in conveying the effectiveness of the program. Submitting a quality entry will improve your council's chances of being selected as a State or Supreme winner. Describe in great detail the Service Program activity that you have chosen. Include pictures of Brother Knights and their families who were involved with the activity. The pictures should have a written narrative explaining what is contained in the picture. Councils can also include letters, newspaper clippings, pamphlets, etc.

The completed STSP form, with all supplementary material, can be submitted at any time during the year to the State General Program Director. State Council must receive the completed STSP Form no later than March 15, 2019.

To assist your council in preparing the STSP, please refer to the Service Program Awards Booklet (#10173). The booklet contains helpful suggestions and examples of how your council should submit its entry.

OVERALL PROGRAM AWARD - ONE PER CLUSTER AREA

Council must fulfill all 8 of these requirements to be eligible of consideration for this award:

- 1. File Form 185 Report of Officers Chosen for the Term by June 30, 2018.
- 2. File Form 365 Service Program Personnel Report by August 1, 2018.
- 3. File Form 1728 Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity by January 31, 2019.
- 4. File Form 1295A Semi-Annual Council Audit Report for period ended June 30, 2018 by August 15, 2018.
- 5. File Form 1295B Semi-Annual Council Audit Report for period ended December 31, 2018 by February 15, 2019.
- 6. All State and Supreme bills paid.
- 7. Show membership increase.
- 8. Conduct at least four programs in each of the four major categories (Faith, Family, Community and Life). Four of these activities must be designated as a Supreme required program in each category.

OVERALL PROGRAM STATE-WIDE RECOGNITION

One council in each of the six (6) State Cluster Areas will qualify for this award. The council must meet all 8 of the above listed requirements to be selected for the award. The State Deputy and State General Program Director will be responsible for selecting the Overall Program Award for each of the six cluster areas.

Plaques will be awarded to each council selected in each of the Cluster Areas for meeting all of the necessary requirements. Plaques will be handed out at the annual convention of the State Council.





FAITH IN ACTION

A place for youth in Faith in Action

The Knights of Columbus Faith in Action program model is designed around Faith, Family, Community and Life. Each of these four categories include opportunities for youth involvement. The vision for this program model is for our brother Knights to serve in an inclusive way, to strengthen the bonds between faith and family, to grow deeper in parish life and to be a beacon for our community. Youth are an essential part of our mission.

To serve the youth of our community, we must move beyond the Columbian Squire Circle and instead offer your council's leadership and skills to an existing parish-based youth group. If a parish-based youth group does not exist, consider working with your pastor to start a new group sponsored by the parish and supported by the Knights of Columbus.

- Working with your pastor, obtain his permission and recommendations on working with a youth group in concert with parish life.
- Check with your pastor about safe environment training such as VIRTUS* training. It's vital that all adults,
 Knights or otherwise, be aware of best practices when working with youth.
- Knights are welcome to serve as a volunteer in support of the parish youth group under guidance of the parish and other Knights.

The Faith in Action program model has many programs that can be adapted for youth moving through parish life. Below are several examples of how Faith in Action can work within the context of church-based youth groups.

- Food for Families Kids can help gather canned goods for your Food for Families program.
- Special Olympics Children in the youth group can volunteer for Special Olympics event(s) in your area.
- Habitat for Humanity Volunteering for Habitat for Humanity is both an opportunity to help your community directly and also a chance for youth to learn practical skills for home ownership.
- Rosary Program This program provides an opportunity for youth to serve directly as leaders in the parish.

Please visit kofc.org/faithinaction for a more comprehensive look at Faith in Action and to see other programs that might work in your parish-based youth group.

Faith Program Director Report

The new Faith in Action model is being rolled-out, Order wide, effective July 01, 2018 Columbian year. Incorporated into this new model are four main programs areas - Faith, Life, Community & Family.

I have been appointed by SD Chris to be director for the Faith program. Within this program are eight 'sub-programs' or categories which align under the Faith program. These are – RSVP (feature program), Spiritual Reflection Program (new & required), Into the Breach, Marian Icon Prayer Program, Domestic Church Kiosk & Series, Rosary Program, Holy Hour (new), Sacramental Gifts (new).

As you will note, a number of these programs will be familiar to Councils & are being done currently. A Council meeting the criteria for the RSVP program (featured) would have two credits for reporting on the SP-7 for Columbian Award. The Spiritual Reflection Program is a required program to qualify for the Columbian Award. Your Council's participation/ attendance at the Spiritual Enrichment Weekend (meeting criteria) would be a great way to complete this required program.

The new Faith in Action model is new to all & there will be continual learning as we proceed throughout the year. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to contact me. I do thank you for your patience as I may not be able to provide the information immediately, but I will get back to you. Father Michael J. McGivney Guild

August 12, 2018 is the 166th anniversary of the birth of Father McGivney.

August 14, 2018 is the 128th anniversary of the death of Father McGivney.

As a parish priest, Father Michael J. McGivney developed a spirituality suited to the hard lives and open hearts of his parishioners. The eldest of 13 children of Irish immigrant parents, Father McGivney had a practical, workaday attitude. Confident that a religious vocation need not separate him from others, he resolved to serve God amid the cities and factory towns of Connecticut.

Following ordination in 1877, Father McGivney was assigned to St. Mary's Church in New Haven. There he founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882, in part to keep Catholic men from joining secret societies and to provide for their families in the event of the breadwinner's death.

Whether serving in the shadows of Yale University or in the heart of a working-class community, Father McGivney exhibited the same simple spirituality coupled with an innovation vision that sought hands-on collaboration with laypeople, who knew his love for them and returned it in full.

Worn down while tending to a large flock, paying down a parish debt, and venturing into unsanitary conditions to minister to the ill and dying, Father McGivney eventually contracted the flu, which soon turned into pneumonia. He died peacefully on Aguust 14, 1890, two days after his 38th birthday.

For 128 years since his death, Knights have expressed their appreciation for Venerable Michael McGivney's life and legacy, inspired by his practice of humility and charity, and by his pastoral efforts that have changed millions of lives for the better. To this day, a growing number of people across the world pray for the cause of Father McGivney's canonization and seek his intercession.

This devotion is clearly embodied by the Father McGivney Guild, which promotes his canonization, publicizes facts on his life and legacy, and documents favors received through his intercession.

Membership in the Guild is free and open to all individuals and households, but not groups. Members of the Knights of Columbus are not automatically Guild members and must elect to join the Guild. All members can join online at this address:


Upcoming Events (Pilgrimages) to consider attending as Brother Knights include:

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




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

- Elementary School Relays 2500 3000 young athletes on relay teams from all Saskatoon and many district elementary schools will be running in three age group categories.

 will compete in a variety of events.
- Paralympics A category for wheelchair athletes.
- Special Clympics A category for athletes with special needs.
- Masters A category for master's athletes showing you can compete well into your golden years.

The budget for the 2019 games will be in excess of \$125,000. Over the past two years we have been able to realize a small profit after a number of years of deficits. 

Others might prefer to pray in front of churches (or inside), in their homes with families, at hospitals or nursing homes, in parks, on sidewalks, or other such public places, etc. Permissions may be needed from the local City Hall, or permits for assembly from the local police department.

THE MAIN THING IS TO PRAY THE ROSARY, WHEREVER YOU ARE!

HOW?

Along with reciting the Rosary, some of the following options may be added (but not necessary): hymns, (musical instruments), reflections, prayers for protection, signs eg CANADA COAST TO COAST, ROSARY RALLY, PRAYING FOR PEACE.

In addition, those who desire to do so, are encouraged to pray a 54 day novena for the success of the Rally, in advance, in preparation for the event.

Sask K of C Charity Appeal versus Sask K of C Charitable Foundation

There are a number of members who confuse the annual State Charity Appeal with the Sask K of C Charitable Foundation. The Sask K of C Charity Appeal is a State annual fundraising project through the sale of Charity Appeal tickets. A portion of the proceeds from the sale of tickets is returned to each of the Councils responsible for the sale to donate to qualifying charities of their choice. The State Board provides an annual grant to Teen Aid and Special Olympics from proceeds with the remaining earnings allocated to State Board expenses.

The Sask K of C Charitable Foundation Ltd is a separate organization owned by the Councils. The purpose of the Charitable Foundation is to raise funds for the purpose of providing financial assistance to individuals and organizations in need and those organizations that support and promote our Catholic values.

We raise funds through donations from Councils and their members and allocate the earnings to qualifying applicants.

There is a separate Board of Directors responsible for the decisions made by the Charitable Foundation. The Sask K of C Charitable Foundation Board of Directors has members appointed by the State Board as well as members elected by the Councils at the Annual General Meeting.

Grants to qualified Charities are allocated through an Annual Grants application process in January of each year.
