District #16 Report - 2020

District #16 consists of four councils in Oklahoma City: #1038 meets at the Santa Fe Family Life Center, #4601 is at St. Francis of Assisi, #10822 is at St. Eugene and #12669 is at Christ the King.

Council #1038 – Most of the volunteer hours worked by the Council are in support of the Santa Fe Family Life Center through their home corporation (Columbus Corporation of Oklahoma City). The center hosts athletic and family oriented activities for Knights and the larger community. They are currently remodeling the center to improve accessibility for those with limited mobility. The SFFLC supports many charitable events for the disadvantaged community, both adult and youth at the facility. Through the council's efforts over \$256,000 was donated both monetarily and in-kind through donations for the worthy programs provided at the SFFLC and over 1600 volunteer hours given. Events for a variety of charitable organizations including Special Olympics and OKASA wheelchair basketball are held at the SSFLC.

The council also holds breakfasts at Our Lady's Cathedral with proceeds supporting the Parish and youth group. The council is supporting two seminarians through the RSVP program and makes monthly donations to several local charities. They sponsored a Halloween Party for the residents of the Center of Family Love. They also held a Super Bowl party for council members and family and friends.

This council has recruited two new members and is current with all reports and State and Supreme assessments.

Council #4601 – This council supports activities at St. Francis Parish and Rosary School. Activities which they supported at the parish included Trivia Night, chili cook-off and Octoberfest. Breakfast with Santa was served after Saturday morning Mass on December 7 with proceeds going to The Christmas Connection. Prayer services were held for the Silver Rose and the Marian Icon. They also held the "Into the Breach" program.

They held the Free Throw contest for the youth of the parish and school. The cost of flu shots for the teachers at Rosary School was covered by the council. A Simple Supper was planned to be served after Stations of the Cross but was not able to be served due to large gatherings restrictions.

The council is current on all State and Supreme assessments. They have recruited one new member this fraternal year.

Council #10822 - This council has been active in all four areas of the Faith in Action programs. They held a Rosary service with the Marian Icon, have placed the Building the Domestic Church kiosk in the parish and keep it stocked. A large number of their members attended the Catholic Men's conference in February. They held Family events including a dinner out together with families, a chili cook-off and Breakfast with Santa after Sunday Mass on December 15. Community events included an underwear and clothing drive to support Sr. B. J.'s Pantry, distributing "Coats for Kids" and work days for Habitat for Humanity. Life projects included volunteer service to The Center of Family Love, financial support to the Willow Pregnancy Center and donations to the "Protect Life" billboard campaign.

There were two major events that the council sponsored this year. On February 1, the council served a spaghetti dinner in support of the Bolivian Medical Mission which is organized by one of the council members. More than \$2500 was raised. During Lent a fish dinner was served after Stations of the Cross. Proceeds went to support the parish youth group for their trip to the Steubenville Youth Conference. Only two dinners were served due to the restrictions on Parish activities, but attendance was very good and attendees were generous.

This council is current with all reports and State and Supreme assessments. Their membership gain stands at 208% of goal and insurance gain is at 250% of goal. This council will likely attain Star Council status.

Council #12669 – Support for Catholic education is a strong point of this council. They made significant financial donations to Christ the King Elementary and Bishop McGuinness and Mount St. Mary's High Schools. Family activities included supporting Christ the King school run, the Parish Fall Festival and Breakfast with Santa. In support of the parish they replaced the damaged kitchen countertop and assisted in the veneration of the St. Padre Pio relics. A prayer service was held while the Marian Icon was in the parish.

The major event for this council is their annual Valentines Dance which has been an excellent fund raiser for several years. This year's event was another success.

This council is current on all State and Supreme assessments. They have recruited no new members this fraternal year.

Oklahoma Knights of Columbus 115th State Convention District 19, Reactivation and Online Membership Report

Worthy State Deputy, Worthy State Chaplin, Worthy Supreme Representative, State Officers, District Deputies, Delegates and Brother Knights:

District 19 is comprised primarily of inactive councils, with one exception: Council 11648, Purcell, is active, alive and well, being in good standing with the Supreme office. All of these inactive councils, as well as others throughout the state, have been inactive for quite some time, with the average being well over 10 years. Given these long "droughts" for the parishes being void of the Knights of Columbus, this means that the growth potential for these areas is quite high. But it also means that the once strong parish relationships with priests, staff and parishioners must be reestablished.

This past year, this reestablishing of relationships has been my primary activity as both District Deputy and Reactivation Chairman. For inactive areas like Ardmore and Tulsa University, this has meant identifying Knights within the area that are interested in reestablishing councils. It also means connecting with the priests to help identify where the Knights of Columbus could help, not hinder, their mission to the church and their parish family. In areas such as Medford and Chandler/Meeker, it means not only working to reestablish relationships, but trying to identify if a council is sustainable. It would be amazing to have a council in every parish, yes. But in truth, this is not a possibility in some areas. It means that perhaps these areas need to be treated as more of a round table until such time they can sustain themselves. With all of that said, gains are still being made in areas like Poteau, where membership drives continue to take place and council leadership has been identified, with continued hopes to achieve full reactivation.

With respect to online membership, we have achieved strong gains month after month. Oklahoma continues to be a leader among the Order with online membership intake. Even at this moment, I write this report with 4 new online members joining just today. Online membership is working! Our Order is finding new avenues in which to bring young, Catholic men, and their families, into the vision that is the Knights of Columbus. But most importantly, online membership is working for the councils in our state. For the second straight year, the average age of our state membership has dropped. For the second straight year, well over 1/3 of our councils have had the majority of their new members come from the online platform.

But there is still a key, critical action that each of your councils can do to ensure your ability to utilize this online tool effectively: converting online members to your councils via an Admission Degree. As of the writing of this report in early April, we have 121 online Knights that have identified an interest in joining a local council. That's right...there are 121 men that have put their money where their mouth is and have said, "I want to join a council." We must answer that call. My Brother Knights, know this: men are looking; men are longing; men are acting. If we, the Knights of Columbus, do not answer their call, they will find someone or something

else. As we embark on this final quarter of the 2019-2020 fraternal year, I ask each council to accept this challenge: Contact every man on your online prospect list, if not done so already. Obviously, it is our sincere hope that these individuals will make the time to attend an Admission Degree and join your councils. However, as with our suspended councils, it starts with the foundational relationship. A short phone call, a friendly visit, or just a quite written note to remind them that we are here and we are ready for them to join us at the council level when they see fit to do so. With the limited activities that councils are able to do at the present moment due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the online membership tool, along with continued outreach to these, and all our Brother Knights, is the best option at this time.

Thank you to State Deputy Matt Maly for his appointment for this past year and to the State Officers for their continued help and support. Thank you to the various Knights throughout the state that have aided in rebuilding relationships within inactive council areas. I especially wish to thank the members of Council 11648, Purcell, in working with me during this very unique time. I thank them for being open and willing to discuss the various issues affecting their members. This level of openness and dialogue will be the key attributes that help drive their membership in the future.

I respectfully request that this report be submitted to the official minutes of the Oklahoma Knights of Columbus 115th Annual State Convention.

It is my pleasure to report that District 20 is alive and well. District 20 consists of Council 4804 St. Patrick's in Sand Springs, Council 9333 at Sacred Heart in Sapulpa, 13313 St. Mary's in Tulsa, and 15834 at the Church of the Resurrection in Tulsa .All for councils are in good standing.

4804 St. Patrick's in Sand Springs is a fairly new council but has quickly become a vital part of their parish. They have begun a luncheon for seniors once a month and leads the Rosary before the Mass every weekend. They enjoyed a Mardi Gras dinner with their families. This council also provides the ushers for Sunday Mass.

9333 Sacred Heart in Sand Springs is becoming the heartbeat of their parish. They have hosted multiple breakfasts for the parish and well as dinners. They hosted a Back to School BBQ and an Epiphany Dinner. Council 9333 has modified their 40 Cans for Lent food drive to be a drive up drop and go. The grand Knight is leading a Rosary every Friday on Facebook live during the Covid-19 shelter in place order. They also participated in the RSVP program and clean and wax the floors at the church

13313 St. Mary's is vibrant and active. As leaders in their church, they have become a go to group for their Priests and others in the parish. They provided two chefs for the MaryFair banquet fundraiser as well as chaired the picnic the following day. They provided a Mother's Day brunch that brought in money for Birthright of Tulsa and Go Life Mobile. In conjunction with the Keep Christ in Christmas, council 13313 sold Finley the Fox plush animals. They raised enough money to donate \$300 and 50 additional fox plush animals to the St. Francis Children's Hospital. At Christmas time they collected and delivers Christmas gifts for the residents at the Center of Family Love. Recently, at the request of the Pastor, they converted their Friday fish fry to a grab and go and served over 500 meals over two Fridays in Lent. With this, they also delivered fish dinners to the elderly that were not able to leave their house.

15834 Resurrection earned Star council for the 2019 and is on track for it again this year. This council runs the food pantry at their church and serves meals at the day center for the homeless twice per year. They have bilingual meetings and have built strong relationships between Hispanics and non-Hispanic members of their parish. Council 15834 supported the RSVP program, 40 Days for Life, the Tulsa March for Life, and their Deacons with the purchase of vestments. This council is active in hosting events for St. Patrick's Day, Columbus Day, and Epiphany.
