

Final Incentives	3 & 4 5	OUTGOING STATE DEPUTY MESSAGE	

My two years as State Deputy has come to an end. I remember how thrilled I was ten years ago, at the State Convention in Regina, that the Knights of Saskatchewan would place their confidence in me by electing me to the State Board. It has truly been an enriching, life changing journey for Connie and me.

We have made many friends and we have come to know many fine people in Saskatchewan, Canada and in every country where there are Knights of Columbus. The



culmination of this journey has been my two years as State Deputy. I will treasure every day, every banquet, every degree exemplification and every conversation I had with and about the Knights of Columbus, and every message I had the privilege of writing and delivering. In short, I loved every-thing about being State Deputy. There are, of course, many people whom I want to thank and I will be busy doing that during the next few days.

Last year we welcomed 360 new members and their families to the Knights of Columbus. We finished the year with 56 more brother Knights than when we began the year. 26 councils earned the Star Council award. A total of 60 councils earned various awards. We finished 13th in the entire order and first in Canada in terms of growth. We continued to be very active in our programs and in our charitable giving.

This year, we are presently 4th in the entire order. Unofficially we've brought in 382 new members and this year we will have grown by approximately 100 members. In addition we have established 60 Round Tables and we've reactivated 2 councils: Radville, and Whitewood. We also established a new council, the Sacred Heart Chaldean council. 23 councils will have achieved the honour of Star Council. Of those, two earned 5 stars, one 4 stars, one triple star and one double star. In short, we not only met our jurisdiction goals, we exceeded them. I need to acknowledge the invaluable help that I received from Mark Lewans and his team of Field Agents. I can assure you that, without their help we would not have finished with 23 star councils and Saskatchewan would not be celebrating another Circle of Honour.

When I began my term as State Deputy, I knew that I had a two year window. On June 30th the window will be closed. We all have windows of opportunity and for the past two years this was mine. I have been very fortunate to have had the support of many brother Knights throughout Saskatchewan. This was definitely a demonstration of the power of unity. Together, all working towards a common goal, we can accomplish anything that we deem is worthwhile. We proved that. Now we need to continue the good work we have been doing so that the Knights of Columbus will be a strong and proud brotherhood in Saskatchewan for many years to come.

This is my final message to you as State Deputy. Connie and I want to thank all of you who have contributed to making these two years so enjoyable and gratifying. We look forward to getting to-gether with many of you whenever possible.

Final Incentives

Thanks to our good work, Supreme Council provided us with a substantial amount of money which we were asked to use for our own incentives program. Congratulations and thanks to all the brother Knights and councils who will be receiving incentive awards. You earned them and I so hope you will enjoy them. The recipients will be announced later in July as soon as the numbers have been officially finalized.

Here is the list of State Incentives that will be awarded to deserving recipients.

MEMBERSHIP INCENTIVES

1. INCENTIVES FOR RECRUITERS A. MONTHLY DRAWS

- i. July to April, we have awarded \$100.00 for each of those months.
- ii. For May and June, we will be making 20 draws of \$75.00 each.

B. TOP RECUITERS AWARDS

i. The twelve top recruiters for the year will receive a beautiful Skagen watch.

C. COUNCIL INCENTIVES

- i. Star Councils will receive a \$4.50 credit from Supreme Council for every regular billable member in their council.
- ii. Star Councils will also receive \$1.00 per regular billable member from State Council. Double, triple, and quadruple Star Councils will receive an additional dollar for each Star they achieve.
- iii. The Council with the highest net gain in membership on June 30, 2016, receives \$200.00.
- iv. The Council with the highest percentage net gain in membership on June 30, 2016, receives \$200.00.
- v. The Council who sponsors a Round Table between April 1 and June 30 will be entered in a draw for \$100.00. Note that the Council will be entered each time they register a Round Table.
- vi. Councils who bring candidates to 2nd and 3rd Degrees from January 1 to June 30 will be entered in a draw for \$200.00.

D. DISTRICT DEPUTY INCENTIVE

i. District Deputies achieving Star District this year will be awarded \$200.00.

E. SHINING ARMOUR INCENTIVE

i. Members earning the Shining Armour Award during the 2015-16 Columbian Year will be entered in a draw for \$100.00. Please contact State Deputy Denis Carignan to inform him of those earning the Shining Armour Award. The SD also has pins and certificates to present to all the recipients of the Shining Armour Award.
