

## **State Secretary's Message**

In his recent apostolic exhortation Amoris Laetitia, Pope Francis asks, "Who is making an effort to strengthen marriages, to help married couples to overcome their problems, to assist them in the work of raising children and, in general, to encourage the stability of the marriage bond?"

Hopefully, the Knights of Columbus can answer this question and say, "We are." Supreme Council has stepped up to Pope Francis' call through many of the new initiatives such as the Holy Family Prayer Program, Building the Domestic Church: The Family Fully Alive Program, and Building the Domestic Church While Strengthening Our Parish initiative.

State Council has encouraged all councils in Saskatchewan to participate in Building the Domestic Church programs and to work with their parish priest to implement many of these programs in their parishes. These programs can strengthen parish family life and make parishes more family friendly. Young fathers with families today have limited time because of work and family commitments, so it is important for councils to concentrate on parish family programs that include activities for the entire family.

Councils can have a positive presence in their parishes and communities by responding to needs of families. Recruiting new members will be much easier because these young men will see what the council accomplishes and will want to be involved. Catholic men can be given an opportunity to be evangelized not by a long philosophical conversation about the faith, but with an invitation to do something together as a group, especially through activities for the entire family.

When our parish priest looks for someone to help him revitalize his parish, he can look first to the Knights of Columbus because we are men who witness to our faith and because we conduct many programs to strengthen our families and our parishes.

#### RRSPs & TFSAs from the Knights of Columbus

It's that time of year and you are hearing a lot about purchasing your RRSPs before the deadline, which is 60 days after the end of the year (March 1). Many members and their wives contribute to Knights of Columbus registered retirement savings plans and for good reason. The Order provides competitive rates, strength, safety & stability and an ethical investment model so you know your money will be invested in the right places. Another popular registered savings vehicle is a Tax Free Savings Account (TFSA). Unlike a RRSP you do not receive a tax deduction when contributing, but like a RRSP the interest earned inside the plan grows tax free. One advantage over a RRSP is that you do not need to have earned income to contribute to a TFSA. The current annual contribution limit for 2017 is \$5,500. Since its inception in 2009 the TFSA has had various annual limits with an accumulated limit of \$52,000 including this year. That means if you've never contributed to a TFSA in the past you may catch up.

Three years ago the Order also introduced the Single Premium Whole Life Registered Retirement Savings Plan (SPWL-RRSP). The introduction of this product gives Canadian Knights and their families another quality option for their RRSP monies. The SPWL-RRSP is a hybrid product, allowing you to provide critical protection for your family, and grow your retirement savings at the same time. Blending the tax-deferral and guaranteed growth features of an annuity with the benefits and guarantee of a Knights of Columbus life insurance policy, results in a unique product that may be the right solution for you and your family.

For more information on which type of plan may be best for you I recommend that you schedule an appointment with your field agent as soon as possible. - All Star District 3 or more councils need to receive star council in your district. Number of stars on plaque correspond to number of star councils in district.
- Portrait of Mother Theresa if all councils in the district recruit at least 1 new member between Oct. 1st - Dec. 31st/2016, the D.D. will receive a portrait.
- Draw for an expense paid trip to the Supreme Convention - all DDs who achieve Star District are entered in a draw. Four DDs are drawn.
- K of C Jacket for achieving an All-Star District.
- Incentives for holding and reporting Admission Degrees - announcements are made throughout the year with the information sent to DDs. From Supreme.

March 25, 2017 is the date set aside as the 'Day of Prayer for the unborn child'. Knights of Columbus Councils and their members are encouraged to observe this day in any number of ways. Some suggested means are to have a special Mass said for the unborn; hold a prayer service; have a rosary led by Knights of Columbus members; fasting on that day or any other spiritual, educational, social or charitable pro-life activity one may deem appropriate.

May 11, 2017 is the date set for the 'March for Life' to be held at the Legislature Building in Regina. Planning for this is currently underway and as details emerge I will attempt to provide these to all through reports in the State Knightline Newsletter. This Event is being coordinated through the combined efforts of Pro-Life and the Knights of Columbus. Please attempt to ensure our Knights of Columbus are aware of this important Event and that they are encouraged to be in attendance on that day, if at all possible. A reminder that there is a subsidy provided for those who would travel by large bus or 15 passenger van. For details on this you may contact me by either email or telephone.

#### **Brothers Knights:**

We are 2 1/2 months away from our 2017 State Convention and only a few weeks away from March 1, 2017, the deadline for a number of key council reports that are due to State. These reports include:

- 1). Council Activity Program Description Form separate form for each of the ten categories describing the activity, a brief description on the purpose of the activity, the results achieved and the members involved in doing the activity. Plaques will be awarded to each council selected for best total activities in each of the ten categories. Certificates will be awarded to each 2nd place council selected in each of the ten categories.
- 2). Supreme/State Council Service Program separate complete Form STSP, one form for each of the following Service Program Categories - Church, Community, Council, Family, Culture of Life and Youth. Describe in great detail the Service Program activity you have chosen. Include pictures of Brother Knights and their families who were involved with the activity. The pictures should have a written narrative explaining what is contained in the picture. Councils can also include letters. newspaper clippings, pamphlets, etc.
- 3). Family of the Year Your council's nomination should be based on the criteria found on the Family of the Year form. This form is on the www.kofc.org website. The form will act as a cover sheet and one may attach additional detailed sheets as required. The State winner will be submitted to the Supreme competition.
- All above reports are due to State on or before March 1, 2017. Any reports received postmarked after March 1, 2017, will not be considered for the award competitions.

#### A few other reminders:

- 1). Form #FT-1 Free Throw Championship Participation Form – Council competition by end of January, District competition by mid-Feb. and Zone competition by March 1.
- 2). Form #4001 Substance Abuse Awareness Poster Contest Participation Form is due January 31.
- 3). Form #1728 Annual Survey of Fraternal Ac-

- tivity is due January 31. It is very important that all councils have this form completed and sent in before or by the due date. If you have not already done so, please send in your Form #1728 immediately. This form is a requirement for "Star Council" award.
- 4). Form 4584 Partnership Profile Report with Special Olympics is due January 31. If you missed this deadline, don't worry. Special Olympic forms will continue to be accepted throughout the month of February. Please make sure that your council reports all activities — including volunteer hours and dollars contributed — for calendar year 2016.
- 5). Form #1295-2 Semi-annual Council Audit is due February 15.
- 6). Day of Prayer for the Unborn Child takes place on March 25. All councils should begin organizing a pro-life Mass or prayer service for that day. For more information on the Knights of Columbus Day of the Unborn Child, visit kofc.org/prolife

Reminder that Supreme Council has announced changes to the Columbian Award for the 2016-2017 Fraternal Year. In order to earn the Columbian Award, councils need to meet the following:

- 1). Have completed and returned the Service Program Personnel Report Form (#365) to the Supreme Council office by August 1, 2016.
- 2). Have completed and returned the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity Report Form (#1728) to the Supreme Council Department of Fraternal Services by January 31, 2017.

This application must be received in the Supreme Council office no later than June 30, 2017.

3). Annually conduct and report at least four (4) major involvement programs in each of the following sections of the Service Program: Church Activities, Community Activities, Council Activities, Culture of Life Activities, Family Activities and Youth Activities AND at least 4 of those programs need to be designated as Domestic Church programs. Please visit www.kofc.org/DomesticChurch website to review the most up-to-date list of programs and activities.

## **Building the Domestic Church While Strengthening Our Parish**

- 1). One of the program initiatives and also a State Action plan for 2016-2017 is to sponsor a Family Day corporate communion celebration (Father's Day Affirmation of Wedding Vows) which is planned for the week-end of February 18/19. Work together with your Parish Priest to provide the opportunity for married couples to recall and affirm their wedding vows together with a special blessing during or after the Sunday liturgy. The www.kofc.org/DomesticChurch website provides two suggested programs you may want to consider. Option A - Affirmation of Wedding Vows (Pamphlet #30003) or Option B -Renewal of Wedding Vows (Pamphlet #30001). Copy of each program is provided in this newsletter (page 6-7).
- 2). Another featured program councils may consider is to partner with their parishes to sponsor a "Simple Supper and Stations" on every Friday during Lent. Ask your pastor's permission to serve a simple supper of meatless soup and bread to parishioners and attendees before or after the stations. This provides a communal opportunity for participation in the traditional Lenten observances of fasting and abstaining from meat. The prayers, mediation and hymns of the Stations of the Cross can be found in The Way of the Cross: Traditional and Modern Meditations (#363), available online at kofc.org/cis. Copies can be ordered at knightsgear.com . Councils should list "Simple Supper & Stations" as a Church program and new domestic church activity on their Columbian Award Application (SP-7).
- 3). Order enough copies of the newest edition of Family Fully Alive (#10162) for each of the families at your parish. Hand out copies to each family after Mass, inviting them to take it with them and begin the family prayer program at home.
- 4). To help your parish grow in the Faith Catholic Information Services has a special collection of popular CIS booklets that focus on family formation and spiritual life. The complete set is available to councils in Canada for the special price of \$150 (which includes shipping and handling) and

<u>Contingency Projects</u> - These are projects where funding is raised for a specific purpose in partnership with either the State, Chapter or Council. We have approved and initiated the K of C Monument Landscape 2017 project in January.

#### K of C MONUMENT LANDSCAPE 2017.

This project is presented by Resurrection Council 13214 on behalf of the Regina Chapter.

Columbus Park is a baseball park within the city of Regina that the Knights of Columbus have looked after for a significant number of years. It is their hope to have this monument as a means of creating a legacy to visually demonstrate this involvement and also as a means of creating a further awareness of the community involvement of the Knights of Columbus.

It will be situated on the edge of Columbus Park (Park Street near the Regina Airport) and be visible to walking and driving viewers. A small portion of this monument was constructed in 2005 in commemoration of Saskatchewan's Centennial. It is the intent to finalize this portion by July 1, 2017 in concert with Canada's 150<sup>th</sup> birthday celebrations.

The main structure will be completed with concrete and the design is meant to minimize vandalism. There will be a plaque on the base where any personal contributors presenting over \$50.00 will be recognized.

The budget to complete this project is \$15,000.00 - \$18,000.00. As a partner, we will have our name on the plaque together with the Knights of Columbus and the  $4^{th}$  Degree Assembly.

Donations will be accepted by the Sask K of C Charitable Foundation till June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

This will mean that there are now five Contingency Fund projects underway in partnership with Councils/State:

- Campion College Lift Regina Chapter assist in funding a lift for handicapped students. This is a part of a major fundraising project to upgrade the Campus facility
- Mark Banga Monsignor Gerein Council Regina assist in tuition and costs for his family while attending JP II Institute in Washington DC.
- Coats for Kids State Councils can order boxes of coats to distribute in their community or offer donations for distributions
- Wheelchair Donations offer assistance to those in need in less affluent countries
