State Deputy's Message

BROTHERS, ASH WEDNESDAY and Lent will soon be upon us. As we enter Lent, I encourage all of you to take time for personal Reflection and Renewal. Take time to seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; serve by giving alms; and practice selfcontrol through fasting. Take the time to not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. Personally, I plan to spend more time reading the bible, as well as finding more time for Morning and Evening Prayers.

In Fr. McGivney's time, Catholics had to choose between their faith and jobs. Are we running into a similar situation today, where is you stand up for what you believe in, you are called a hater and lose out on opportunities. It is time to band together, grow in our faith, and live our faith.

As many of you know, the Madison Diocese is in the middle of a major review of the current reality, and planning for the future called Into the Deep. As I learn more about this initiative, I was shocked by the statistics on the decline in mass attendance and participation in the sacraments:

- ► From 2010—2021, population has grown 8.5%
- ► Between 2013 and 2021, the number of registered Catholics declined 17.3%
- ► Between 2013—2019, Mass attendance declined 16.3% (Pre-Covid)
- ► Between 2013—2021, Baptisms declined 39%, First Communions declined 39%, confirmations declined 9%, and weddings declined 21%

- ➤ Between 1960—2021, baptisms declined 79%, and weddings declined 63%.
- ► We are having more funerals than weddings, despite the overall population growing.

I expect that the other Diocese's in Wisconsin are experiencing similar trends.

As a State Council that has seen a 20% decline in membership since 2000. Our Program Team is reviewing what it working and making changes to ensure we are able to focus on our mission going forward. Over the past few years, we have seen many changes at both the State and Supreme Council levels:

- ► Faith in Action replaced the Surge in Service Program (4 categories replaced 6 categories)
- ► Fraternal Benefits Nights
- New Exemplification of Charity Unity and Fraternity
- ► New Membership Cards
- ► Affiliate Membership Program
- ► Delta Church Drives
- ► ASAP Program
- ► COR Initiative for Faith Development
- ► Support for Persecuted Christians
- ► Coats for Kids Program
- ► Ukrainian Solidarity Fund
- ► State Mining of Form 10784 data, email acknowledgements
- Webinars for training and Fraternal Benefits Nights
- ► YouCat Bible program

When we invite men to join us, we promise to help them become better Catholics, better husbands, and better fathers.

It is important that Councils constantly assess their situation and



look to make changes when they are needed to better serve their parish. As we go through lent, and a season on renewal this spring, I challenge the leaders in Councils throughout the State to ask a few simple questions.

- ► What are the current needs of the Parish, and how can we best meet those needs?
- When Father needs something done, are the Knights his first call?
- ➤ Does the Council have programs that attract young men and their families? Are we using these programs to invite these families to join us?
- ► Is your Council somewhere that members grow in their faith and then putting that faith into action, or is it just another service organization?
- What changes can our Council make to be more attractive to young men and their Families?

Men need to grow in their faith, and then put that Faith into action. If your council is just a fundraising engine, you are missing a large part of the Mission. I pray that Lent is truly a time of reflection and renewal for each of you, and for the Knights of Columbus Councils in the State of Wisconsin. We can't do this alone, and we certainly can't do it without God. +

Nick became a Knight in 1936. Let's make an effort to sign up our sons and grandsons as new prospective Knights.

Now—this message hit me for a variety of reasons. First off, this family legacy within the Knights is soon to approach a Century! We truly offer a lasting impact for families and we all have a legacy to uphold for future Knights, such as our Kids and Grandkids. But do we offer them this opportunity? Do we remind our members to invite their family members or to sign up their sons into the Knights when they turn 17.5 years old?

Further—a few years ago now, the Supreme Council modified the Exemplifications to allow for these ceremonies to be 'open' to the public to view and attend. Could you imagine having a

family of 5 sons; or sons and fathers; or sons, fathers and maybe even grandfathers join the Knights today? In the presence of their entire family—seeing the commitment that they are giving to the Church and to the Knights? What an amazing opportunity that we have to provide this combined ceremonial families of our Parish—inviting the moms and daughters as well to attend to see how we are truly a family-centered organization.

Five Ways to Increase Social Media Engagement

One of the keys to growing your council is inviting families to join – wouldn't you agree? Well, how do we do that? One key to growing your council's social media presence is 'Engagement'. According to Angie Gensler a social media marketing coach and expert "When creating social media content, it's important to share content that will generate engagement. That's because engagement, which includes comments, likes, shares, and views, is the key to growing your business on social media." This is true not only in business but also in other sectors such as volunteer organizations as well. If you think about it aren't our councils both a business and a volunteer organization?

Angie goes on to say that "Not only does social media engagement let you know what type of content your audience likes, but it also lets the algorithm know that your content is valuable and should be shown more often. Without social media engagement, the algorithm (on any platform) will quit showing your content to your followers."

Engagement is key to growing your councils and for that matter your parishes presence on social media. Without engagement, the algorithm (on any platform) will quit showing your content to your followers as well as potential new followers.

So, how do we increase our followers to like and comment on our posts so you can grow?

- ▶ Always include an image—Facebook posts with images receive 2.3x more engagement than posts without images. Photographs and styled images and graphics work well. Use <u>Canva</u> to quickly and easily design good-looking graphics that grab viewer's attention!
- ▶ Ask questions—According to a social media expert, "Questions generate the most comments," which makes sense. They do not have to deep or even related to the Knights of Columbus, but do be careful of the types of questions you post. Refer to Supreme Council s Members Social Communications Policy & Guidelines. Remember the 80/20 rule: 80% of the content should be geared toward serving your customers (new members, your community, and your parish) while only 20% should be geared toward promoting your council.
- ► Use #hashtags Using hashtags is a quick and easy way to improve your social media marketing results, but use them wisely so people can easily find you.
- ► Share inspirational content—With so much negativity in the world, people want to see positive, inspiring, and uplifting content on social media. It's also refreshing to see a post that's meant to brighten their day, not sell them something.
- ► Celebrate Holidays—Not only do holiday posts tend to generate lots of "likes" but they're some of the easiest posts you'll create all year. Under this heading include, highlighting your councils activities, awards, events. 💠

REQUIREMENTS:

- Every man who joins online needs to access kofc.org/ joinus from a compatible device, personally complete the online application testifying to all the attestations, and submit the online application himself.
- When possible, the member should use his own compatible device.
- ► The member must use their own valid email address when completing the online application.

NOT ALLOWABLE:

- ► Completing the online application for a member even if they have asked you to do it for them.
- ► Collecting information from a proposed member on a form 100 or prospect card and using the information to sign the member up for online membership.
- ► Creating an email account for a member so they can complete the online membership process.

NEW MEMBER PROCESS:

Follow the standard procedures for a new e-member as with all new members:

- ► Completed Form 100, or assigned e-member status in Prospect tab of Officers Online (OO).
- ► Admission committee vetting.
- ► Council action (voting) see Guidelines for Online Voting - Motions if holding virtual meetings
- ► Degree Member must take the degree prior to being transferred into a council.
- ► Process the new 3rd degree member into your council via Form 100 submission or, Online form 100 using the Candidate tab data entry and transfer, or e-member transfer using the Prospect tab. **REMEMBER**: If you use either the Prospect tab or the Candidate tab to process your new members, do NOT submit a mailed paper or scanned pdf of the form 100. It just confuses the issue and might result in duplicate entries. Use only one of the available methods.
- ► Update degree status by entering degree dates for 2nd & 3rd degrees in Member Management. This is not an automatic process.
- ► Share this QR code with your prospects. +

THE UNITED STATES Conference of Catholic Bishops describes Lent on their website as follows:


For most councils Lent is the busiest time of year. Many councils support their parish communities by Leading Rosaries, Stations of the Cross, Eucharistic Adoration and Good Friday promotion. These are all wonderful ways for our parishes to witness first and foremost that we are men of faith. Many of these events are followed by fellowship opportunities.

Also, during this time, it is common for councils to host Friday Fish Fries. These events draw the entire parish community together for great food and fellowship. This is a great opportunity for Knights to connect with the parish community. During Fish Fries and other fellowship events most Knights are focused on preparing and serving the food. But, it is also important to

have someone to focused on hospitality. Hospitality is important because it directly impacts how we are perceived. As we endeavor to support the parish, we want them to support us. One of my mentors, Monsignor Robert Bergman, was the master of breaking the ice with "Dad Joke." We need Knights to strike up conversations with the people of their parishes. Knights need to "work the room." Ask how are things going? How's the food? Did you get enough? How about the weather? There is a hidden benefit. People are more likely to ask questions from someone that is approachable. Men or their wives may ask about Knights. When you get these questions take time to answer them. He may be interested in joining. If not right, then maybe in the future. Over time get to know him at future events. Seek him out start up a conversation. Mention what's going on in the council. When the time is right invite him to attend a meeting or help with a project.

As our brothers who focused on membership always say every program is a recruiting opportunity. I 100% agree with this statement. I encourage each council to assign someone to hospitality. Hospitality is a springboard to new members. One last thought: Take time to catch up with men who are no longer active. Strike up conversations with them. When the time is right let them know they are missed and invite them back. 🛧

BROTHERS, GIVEN THE weather I've just seen down here in Racine (11" of snow and bitter cold), there's still plenty of time to run a Coats for Kids Drive at your parish, school, community center, homeless shelter, etc. Not only coats but all sorts of winter clothing articles are welcome!

There's also a great opportunity to do at least 1 or 2 of the other 4 mainly adult-oriented Community programs between February and June. Join in on a local Habitat for Humanity project or do a fundraiser and donation to help them out or join in helping out at their "Re-Store" operation. Do a fundraiser in the parish or community for a few wheelchairs - \$150 each. Help the parish, Council, community with their Disaster Preparedness plans/preparation or help to set up or refurbish community supplies for disaster relief. Join together with other community groups to find and resolve a significant need at a park, recreational facility, local assistance or family/children's center, etc. Don't let February go by while not pursuing your goals for Columbian Award, Star and Outstanding Council Awards.

As to the Youth programs, the state-winning Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest entries will be announced this month. The Culture of Life Essay Contest entries are to be to the Councils by March 15 and to the DPCs by March 31. The Knowledge and Free Throw Contests should be well underway this month with Council-level contests and District Free Throw contests done by March 19, Diocesan (Regional) Contests done by April 15 and the State Contest at Assumption High School in Wisconsin Rapids on April 22. Free Throw registration and practice will be 10-11 AM with competition starting at 11:15 AM. Math & Spelling registration will be 10-11:15 AM with competition beginning at 11:30 AM. All contestants need

complete, accurate and legible travel cards (green for District and Diocesan Contests, Orange for State)! The Council-level tests (Math & Spelling) have been revised and can be downloaded from the State website. District Deputies, remember that you must order the Free Throw medals for District winners from Supreme (Officers/Supplies Online). Supreme pays for them, but they do not come to you automatically.

Soccer Contests can be run indoors in February or outdoors from March-May 31. Regional and State Contests will be held in June if numbers warrant. Information for the new Hockey Skills Challenge can be downloaded from the Supreme website.

Finally, be sure that your Fraternal Survey (1728) and Special Olympics Participation form (10784) need to be in now if not done already (were due January 31). History Books are due to DDs February 1 and to DPCs February 15. All Councils should choose their best activity in each of the FiA areas (Faith, Family, Community, and Life), fill out a State Service Program Award form with supporting evidence, articles, pictures, etc. They are due to the State Office or to State Program Director Ernie Reinhart by March 1. If you need help or guidance with them, feel free to let me know.

Also, remember to send in your Form 10784 whenever you complete any program to Supreme and the State Forms address – don't wait until May and June to send them all in en masse. Hope you have a great February, do something special for the lovely lady in your life. Thanks for all the good work you and your Councils do. +



State Registration Information

IT'S THE BEGINNING of State Convention season, which means it's time to send in forms before their deadlines and register for the state convention. There have been updates to the State Convention Site when it comes to registration. We'll look at these changes and some common mistakes people make when signing up.

- ► Go to the <u>WI State Council Website</u>.
- ► Click on the green registration button.
- From here, it is **preferred** that you fill out the online Pre-Registration Form, but you also print out the <u>Registration</u> Form to send into the office.
- ► Note the blue bar at the tops of each page: Agenda, Registration, Hotel. These are live links on the website that will help you plan your trip.
- ► On the registration page, you will notice a new "Restart Registration" button. If you started your registration but were not able to finish it, as long as you at least saved your email address, you will be able to continue where you left off. Just enter your email address and then click.
- ▶ If, however, you have completed your registration but want to make changes it will take you to a different page "Registration Change Request". This allows you to fill out a text box to tell the state office what you would like to change. That may be "I need another ticket for the State Deputy banquet", "I need two more working lunch tickets", or "I have to cancel as something unexpected came up". Please be detailed in your text as that will enable the state office to address your needs quickly. Farther down on this page you'll also see your initial registration, so you know what was originally chosen.

Why a text box? Simply put, once you submit your registration it cannot be modified online. However, notes can be added to your registration at the state office. With that, if you add meal tickets or activities, we'll ask you to send in a check to cover the cost. Or, if you cancel a meal ticket, the state office will then know to provide a refund. Please note that only the state office can see these notes, and your reservation page will not update. We will send you an email in reply to your Change Request, so you have a record. Please see the image for a reference.

- A common error on the first page of the online registration form is people fill out the information page but don't click on the gold CONTINUE button on the bottom. They then come to the State Convention and wonder why they don't have tickets. Be sure to enter the security code found in the box on the right, then click on "Continue".
- ► On page two you can choose some available activities. The Working Lunch is the business meeting lunch for the

delegates and other men attending this meeting. The women are welcome to attend the Ladies Brunch and Program. Once activities are chosen, they will appear at the top of the page and you'll see the total amount owed. Now choose the green COMPLETE MY REGISTRATION button for payment. Once everything looks good and you've chosen your payment type choose "If this is correct, "Click here to Complete Your Registration".
