From the State Deputy

My Brother Knights,

The fraternal year is a little over halfway done and many Councils have already done so much work. The State Council aligns with our recruitment goals for this part of the year. Almost two-thirds of the active councils in the State have recruited one new member. I have witnessed the success that some of these councils have experienced in gaining new members and council leadership. For those Councils who have been unsuccessful, please know that your District Deputy, State Officers and State Insurance team can assist your council with Church and Membership drives. Don't hesitate to contact Worthy Membership Director Mark Paul if you have any questions or need help with your next drive. Remember that this is not a numbers game. We need to recruit new members to have vibrant and active councils with a continuity of new leadership. New membership provides for more hands to accomplish more good works. The new member provides for the next leaders of our councils. Does your council know who your next leaders are? Unfortunately, the answer is no for most councils that have recruited any members this year. Please do not lose hope if you are having difficulties recruiting: I have seen many councils this year that have been successful even though they have gone many years with little growth. In addition to the successes of our various Council's membership goals and program activities, there have been many exciting milestones this year. We have seen a change in our State Council Chaplain. We welcome Fr. Gadoury and we are inspired by his leadership and words of inspiration. We wholeheartedly thank Fr. Joe for his unwavering pastoral dedication and friendship to the members of this order. We have also seen a change in our Diocesan leadership as well. Most of you have likely heard that Bishop Tobin has submitted his resignation to the Pope (as required in that he turns 75 in April 2023). Bishop Tobin has stated that he expects his resignation to be accepted in the Spring. Toward that end, Pope Francis appointed Bishop Richard Henning to the position of Coadjutor Bishop alongside Bishop Tobin beginning in January. As Coadjutor Bishop, Bishop Henning will automatically succeed Bishop Tobin. Bishop Henning is also a Knight of Columbus. Let's welcome

Brother Knight, Bishop Henning, and support him throughout his tenure as our Shepherd. And also thank Bishop Tobin and Auxiliary Bishop Evans for their service to God and His people.

There is so much more information I would like to share with you, Brothers, and I believe the best opportunity for that would be at our next State Meeting held on February 23rd at Cranston Council #1738 (70 Pettaconsett Ave., Cranston, RI). This will be a Thursday night state meeting which we are trying out for a few of our state meetings this year. The State meetings, whether held on Friday or Thursday this year, will start earlier at 7:00 pm. We value your time and will make every effort for the business portion of the meeting to last one hour so we can get on to the better part of the meeting, the sharing of fraternity. Several of these State Meetings were held very close to this time, only going a few minutes over, and many members stayed after the meeting for the collation. Like last month, the State Officers and District Deputies will be available after the business portion to answer any questions and/or offer advice or guidance.

Lastly, brothers, The Supreme Council is actively promoting that the membership strengthens themselves in faith and virtue by drawing them into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ through praver, formation, and fraternity. The Supreme Council is piloting a program called the COR MEETING, a separate meeting open to knights and non-knights alike that focuses on praver, formation and fraternity. Supreme also recommended partnering with established Men's groups that conform to these goals. In the State of Rhode Island, another group organizes their meeting just for such a purpose. That group is the Men of St Joseph International. Brothers, I consider this timing so providential as many of our leadership have joined them and their leadership has become knights in the past two years. The notion that they are the men of faith and we are the men of action is now gone. We now see each group striving to be men who put their faith into action. I have spoken to the Supreme Knight and shared the possibility of working with the Men of St Joseph International and he wholeheartedly agreed that we should work together. I would strongly recommend you consider attending the Men of St Joseph International's Men's Conference on Saturday, March 25th at St. Philips in Greenville and joining a local chapter. This event will be a great showing of this partnership as one of the

Diocese of Providence

Membership News
