From January 18th to January 25th the Catholic Church will be joining other Christians in observing the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The week is timed to begin on what was formerly the feast of Chair of St. Peter and ends on the still observed feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. This observance is co-sponsored by the World Council of Churches and the Vatican's Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity.

Churches in different parts of the world prepare the theme and the texts each year. The 2012 materials were prepared by Churches in Poland, including beside Roman Catholic, the United Methodist, Evangelical Lutheran, Polish Catholic, and Polish Orthodox Churches. The theme for 2012 is: "We will all be changed by the victory of Our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor

Each day of the week (or octave) has a particular expression of the overall theme:

January 18: Changed by the Servant Christ to be servants.

January 19: Changed through patient waiting for the Lord.

January 20: Changed by the Suffering Servant into solidarity with all who suffer.

January 21: Changed by the Lord's victory over evil to combat forces of evil.

January 22: Changed by the peace of the Risen Lord.

January 23: Changed by God's steadfast love.

January 24: Changed by the Good Shepherd to seek and support the weak and the lost.

January 25: United in the Reign of Christ.

The Week of Prayer began in 1908 as a Catholic prayer for Church unity. It was approved in principle by Pope Pius X and endorsed for the whole Church by Pope Benedict XV. In 1941, other Christians joined the observance and it received the approval of the World Council of Churches in 1948.

It is also possible to pray using the daily intentions from the earlier phase of the observance, when it was called the Chair of Unity Octave:

January 18: The Uniate Churches
January 19: The Oriental Churches
January 20: The Anglican Communion

January 21: European Christians January 22: American Christians

January 23: Spiritual renewal of Catholics January 24: The Jewish Faith Community

January 25: The Unity of all the Christian Churches.



OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE FRAMED IMAGE TOUR

Cardinal James Francis Stafford, Major Apostolic Penitentiary Emeritus, and archbishop of Denver emeritus, was the principal celebrant at Votive Mass of Our Lady of Guadalupe on



Wednesday, August 3rd, at the Supreme Convention in Denver, Colorado. Knights of Columbus state deputies stood before the altar at the end of the Mass holding their jurisdiction's framed image of Our Lady of Guadalupe, as Msgr. Eduardo Chavez explained the new Marian Prayer Program in which the images would be hosted by local councils worldwide during prayer services. The Guadalupe images were blessed by Pope Benedict XVI and touched to the tilma of Juan Diego which bears the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. In addition, the frames of the images were sealed with soil from Tepeyac hill in Mexico, where Our

Lady's appearances took place. The new Knights of Columbus Marian Prayer Program will take place throughout the Order and lead into the second international Guadalupe Festival to be held at the Los Angeles Coliseum the weekend before the 2012 Supreme Convention. Supreme has blessed our state with two Our Lady of Guadalupe images and prayer books. Our jurisdiction has been separated by districts into two, East and West. The East District's (ED) consist of District's 03, 01, 13, 11, 07, 02 and 05. The West District (WD) consists of District's 10, 04, 08, 14, 09, 12 and 06. Our Lady of Guadalupe image will pilgrim through each district for at least one month starting with District 03 in the ED and District 10 in the WD. Each case containing the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe has a LOG BOOK in the side cover of the casing. This log must be filled out each time you have a prayer service/rosary and/or any gathering honoring Our Lady of Guadalupe. Please ensure the log book is kept with each image. We must return both set's at the end of the pilgrimage.

The District Deputy's will be responsible for ensuring the Our Lady of Guadalupe image pilgrims through their district. The District Deputy's coordinate with each Grand Knight the dates their council will have the image in their parish. Each Grand Knight will need to coordinate with their parish pastor's to ensure the image is displayed, at least one prayer service with the accompanied prayer books is made at each parish, one Rosary is said by the Knights and it is kept safe. Again, please ensure the log book is filled out for each event. The host council will then contact the next visiting council for date and time of delivery of Our Lady of Guadalupe image, prayer books, and log book. Please follow up with each Grand Knight receiving the Our Lady of Guadalupe image to ensure they are on schedule. Once the last council in your district is concluding their time with Our Lady of Guadalupe image, the DD will be responsible for contacting the next District Deputy to coordinate hand off.

I will be following up with each District Deputy at the beginning and end of each month to ensure we are on schedule. Our mission is to have both Our Lady of Guadalupe image's at our State Convention in April, at which a prayer service will be held on Sunday morning.

Please ensure all the prayer books are placed back into the traveling case with each Our Lady of Guadalupe image for the use of the following council. There are prayer cards which may be given to those who attend a prayer service, although limited. One of the follow up questions during my call will be the quantity of prayer cards left. I pray we can receive more from Supreme. We will see.

May Our Lady of Guadalupe keep you safe and watch over our pilgrimage of her image throughout our Arkansas Jurisdiction.
