It is goals of the State Officer team to have every council submit the report of Fraternal Activities. If your council has not submitted their report the State Officer in charge of your diocese will be contacting your District Deputy or the Grand Knight of the council.

The Semiannual Council Audit is due by February 15. Just a reminder to Financial Secretaries and Council Trustees if you have failed to submit an Audit for 2 consecutive periods the Financial Secretary will lose his Supreme Bonding. I surely would never want to be in that predicament.

With the State Convention of the Wisconsin jurisdiction fast approaching, we have some due dates for some award applications that are getting close. The Family of the Year and the Medallion Award applications are due by February 15. The Family applications send to Larry Julson and the Medallion application send to Daniel Hull. Both of these awards are a great honor to the people you have chosen to honor. State Program Director Don Schoenherr is collecting the Supreme Service Award Applications. TIME TO START THE BLITZ

I am sure the Grand Knights and District Deputies have checked the Fraternal Activity Planner and noticed that there is a order wide Church drive coming up on March 15 and 16. What you say? Why are you talking about a March Church Drive in January? The reason for bringing up the March Drive now is that Preparation is the first step for a successful drive. There is plenty to get organized.

First step is to talk to the parish Priest to see if you can hold the drive on that date. If you are told yes, congratulations on the first step completed. The Priest on board with a drive is a major step in the right direction. Please work with your parish Priest on alternate weekends if you are unable to hold it the drive weekend. Remember you Priest guides your parish and can be the council's best recruiter. See if he would allow someone to speak before mass starts about what the Knight do in your local area. If he says yes or no remember to be polite and thank him for his time.

Next step is to get the members excited about the drive. Promote the drive as a positive activity in your council. Get members that are positive to be at the church about 20 minutes before mass. "Are you a member of the Knights of Columbus?" You should say this while shaking the man's hand. If the man says yes, respond "Thank you for being a Knight" If the man responds no, say "would you like hear more about the benefits of being a Knight?" The phrase is a passive question that the man can respond to quickly. If the man says no, respond "thank you for your time." If the man responds yes, you say "we would like you name and phone to set up a time to talk to you about it. The point is to greet EVERY man into church. S you need enough Knights to handle the crowd and you cannot spend too much time with just one man. About 5 minutes before the start of Mass the person (or persons) that are selected to speak before Mass (if allowed) should do their speech. Please keep the speech brief, positive, fun, and informative. When the crowd thins at the entrance of Mass, group all the contact names and phone numbers and give them to one person.

Message from State Treasurer Ron Faust



Brother Knights,

When it comes to evangelizing through Charity, as usual, you are way out in front setting the bar very high. For that I thank you and I am happy to serve you in some small way to protect our sterling record of Charity. In that regard I will focus the main of this month's article on best practices for the administration of Charity funds; but first a word about per-capita dues.

As of this writing 43 councils, approximately 15% of our number, have not remitted payment for the per-capita dues billing they received in October. Please, if you are reading this, verify that your Council is current. Thank you!

Now let us move on to talk about those Charity funds. It is interesting that we have the then Supreme Treasurer, Logan T. Ludwig, who is now the Deputy Supreme Knight, issuing standards for the administration of Charity funds at the same time that we find ourselves responding to an audit of our Annual State Charity Raffle. Here is what Brother Roger Gorst, Chairman of our Financial Review Committee and Vice President of Wisconsin Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc., wrote in the November issue of this newsletter regarding those standards issued by Brother Ludwig.

Recently, the Supreme Treasurer, Logan T. Ludwig issued Charitable Giving Accountability Standards. One of them indicates that Knights of Columbus affiliated entities, should distribute at least seventy-five percent of funds dedicated for their purposes. This entity's board of directors are available to consider qualifying grant requests in meeting those needs.

Regarding that audit, by now you have received the new <u>Council Charity Request Form</u>. This form was developed as a response to that audit and is designed to insure that our State Charity Raffle will survive and thrive well into the future. Please, bring your completed form to your State Convention in Appleton and apply for your share of the funds raised. This year, as a commitment to all of you, 65% of the net proceeds raised from the Charity Raffle will be set aside to satisfy the requests you make with the submission of your form. This is up from the 62% of the net that was disbursed to councils from last year's Charity Raffle.

We are licensed by the State of Wisconsin to conduct this raffle to raise funds for the purposes enumerated in our application, and on your request form. The form will be used to verify that the funds are being thus used.

For as long as I can remember, the State Council has been urging all councils to segregate Charity funds in a separate account from their general funds. This "best practice" should be followed to protect the integrity of this vital program.

Finally, listing the balance in their account on the form will help councils to track how well they are following the common sense standards issued by Supreme.

- Please don't expect the family to fill out and prepare their own nomination.
- Last year one diocese did not participate in the Family of the Year program.
- Last year many nominations consisted of only 2 sheets of paper.
- Take some time in your council meetings to talk about the Family Programs.
- Ask your Family Committee how they are doing on their nominations for Family of the Month and Family of the year.
- Honoring families and publicizing who they are and what they do will encourage other families to become Knights of Columbus families.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS - TEAM WISCONSIN 2014 BE A FAN OF OPPORTUNITY, MAKE DREAMS COME TRUE

As of Jan 10th, 2014 we are gaining on our goal of \$100,000.00. We have received thru Council Donations, Tootsie Roll Funds, Recycling, Foundation Grants, Private Donations, and Supreme Council Grants \$78,721.56. This leaves us \$21,278.44 short of the goal. The end of this drive will be at the opening of Wisconsin Knights of Columbus convention, April 26, 2014 before the opening business session.

I would encourage all Council's to review what they have donated. Many Council's have met their goal of \$3.00 per member over the 4 year period. Some Council's have exceeded their goal and others have made no donation.

The money is to fund the cost of sending the team to Newark, NJ in June 14 thru June 21, 2014, for the Special Olympics National games. There will be 70-80 athletes and 20-30 coaches taking part.

There are many ways in which Councils can raise these funds.

Applying to Foundations for grants.

Resolutions - Gordy Kremer, State Advocate

Resolutions for the 113th Annual Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus Convention

Resolutions are due into the State Advocate by Feb. 1, 2014.

Each council can propose a resolution. The resolution must be adopted at the respective council meeting. Then the resolution must be signed and submitted by the Grand Knight to the State Council.

It is through the Resolution Process that the State and Supreme Programs and Bylaws are changed.

Strategies for writing a Resolution

Reference: Robert's Rules in Plain English (Second Edition)

Author: Doris P. Zimmerman

A resolution is a main motion submitted in writing.

A resolution consists of two parts:

The **preamble**, which begins with "Whereas"—providing the reasons and background information for support.

The second part begins with "resolved"—containing a motion to be adopted.

Keep the resolution brief and well-written.

Punctuation of a properly written resolution is a high priority. Each clause is written as a paragraph that is punctuated with a semicolon. No matter how lengthy the resolution is, the only period appears at the end. The first word of each clause in the **preamble** and "That" in the resolved section are capitalized.

Acting On A Resolution

The resolves of a resolution are stated (by the presiding officer) and acted upon like any other motion. They are also open to amendment. When it is adopted, the preamble is presented. Presenting the preamble last allows for any amendment of the resolves, which may also require amendment of the preamble.

We are tentatively planning the State Competition for these events at Assumption High School in Wisconsin Rapids on March 22 but this is subject to change.

I trust all of you are active in promoting the sale of our State Charity Raffle Tickets. This fundraiser is a very important event in seeking funds for those in need over the year. Keep in mind that the Second Chance portion no longer exists due to the ruling from the State of Wisconsin.

History books are required in order for your council to qualify for the State Complete Council award. It is a great record of your Council's activities and a good marketing tool for your membership. These are due shortly so please complete them and get them to your District Deputy.

The State Convention is just around the corner once again. As you know we are returning to Appleton at the Paper Valley Hotel. 
