

We have much to be thankful for this year with hundreds of new men coming on board to ensure our state and our Order continues to grow and can maintain our good works for many more years to come.

Thanks to all of you, the Wisconsin Jurisdiction is having a record-breaking start to the first half of the new

fraternal year. Through your efforts history was made for the first time, Wisconsin exceeded its first and second quarter goals back-to-back adding 608 new members. To my knowledge this has never been done before and is a noteworthy achievement that you should be proud of.

In my article last month, I mentioned we needed 74 men by the end of December to achieve our second quarter goal. As of December 22, you delivered the 74

We also held our Winter District Deputy Organizational meeting Dec 5-7 in Stevens Point where we officially installed our new and continuing District Deputies. Your District Deputies will be sharing some of these changes with you when they hold their individual District meetings. Please ensure your council officers attend their meetings in the near future.

But remember you also need to complete your Safe Environment and Fraternal Benefit requirements to achieve Star Council status. These are simple tasks that should be easy and done early.

THE IMPORTANCE OF FORM 365

Safeguarding Our Community & Fraternal Order

AS WE STRIVE TO SERVE our communities and uphold the values of the Knights of Columbus, I want to highlight the vital significance of completing Form 365. This form is not just a bureaucratic obligation. It is essential for ensuring the safety and well-being of our most vulnerable members and for maintaining the integrity of our fraternal order.

WHAT IS FORM 365?

Form 365 is mandatory for all councils and outlines the officers leading our councils throughout the year. It is crucial to provide detailed information for the Program, Family, and Community Directors. This data go beyond administrative functions and ensures our leadership is properly prepared to engage with the community safely and effectively.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?

➤ *Safe Environment Training:* Completing Form 365 accurately is crucial for qualifying for Praesidium's Safe Environment Training. This training equips our leaders and volunteers with the knowledge to protect our programs and initiatives. Well-trained leaders can identify potential risks and take proactive measures to ensure the safety of all participants in our gatherings and activities.

- *Background Checks:* The form is also essential in the background check process. By providing accurate and comprehensive information, we can streamline this process and verify that individuals working with our vulnerable members have undergone the necessary vetting. This is vital for safeguarding our children and those who need extra assistance.
- *Community Trust:* Protecting our most vulnerable members is part of our commitment to charity, unity, and fraternity. Having responsible individuals in leadership roles reinforces community trust in the Knights of Columbus. Families need to feel assured that they can rely on us not only for support but also for a safe environment where their loved ones can thrive.
- *Protecting Our Fraternal Order:* These actions protect individuals but also preserve the essence of our fraternal order. The Knights of Columbus is founded on mutual support and shared values, which must be reflected in our actions. Scandals or breaches of trust could have serious repercussions, undermining our mission and our ability to serve.

Let us continue to serve our communities with pride and responsibility, working together to create a safe and welcoming environment for everyone.

DECEMBER WAS A SLOW MONTH FOR Online Membership. As of December 20, 30 e-members joined the order in Wisconsin during the month of December. This is about half of what we would normally expect. Since July 1, we have brought in 378 e-members in Wisconsin. This is an increase of about 90 e-members compared to the same time last fraternal year.

Thank you to all of the Councils that are using E-membership to bring new men into the order. During December, Councils did an outstanding job of welcoming assigned e-members into their Councils. Since July 1, we still have about 114 e-members that have been assigned to a Council but have not yet taken an Exemplification or joined a Council. While in person exemplifications are preferred, if schedules are not working out, please use the On-Demand Online Exemplification to get these brothers into your Councils and then invite them to get involved.

Cards with the QR Code to join online are available from Supreme. These can be very helpful when inviting men to join. Your Diocesan Membership Directors and District Deputies should be able to help you get these cards if you need them.

WGK & WFS please frequently review your councils **Prospect** tab and if you are having difficulty in making contact, or any other issue, please email me regarding these outstanding assigned e-members and I will gladly assist you with reaching a remedy.

Supreme presented a Webinar in December on Transferring online members to council membership which you can access [here](#).

Do not send Form 100's to Supreme for new members, keep them for your council's records. If you must use a Form 100, scan it and email it to Supreme, keeping the original for your council records. Since Form 100's must be manually processed at Supreme, they can lead to data entry errors and delays. Utilizing e-membership or the **Candidate** tab for new members are the preferred ways to bring in new members. **The date field is the date they were exemplified by your council. Once you enter those dates in either tab, the members will be automatically transferred to your council's roster within the next week.**

PROSPECT TAB

Shows you e-members that have joined online via the Supreme app. The date field is used to transfer them into your council when they have completed their exemplification. With e-membership, new members enter their own data and confirm their membership, and then they receive an e-mail from Supreme. These e-members are then part of the state council, and get assigned to a local council. Until the local FS enters the exemplification date, these members remain part of the State Council. Local councils get credit for them when the exemplification date is entered by the FS to transfer them into your Council.

Clicking on this blue box will take you to the Prospect training.

CANDIDATE TAB

Used when you recruit a member locally or are handling a member transfer request or a reinstatement of a prior member. The Candidate tab can best be described as an online Form 100. The candidate tab training covers new members and transfers into local councils.

Clicking on this red box will take you to the candidate training.

POWER OF PATRIOTISM

Building Tomorrow's Leaders. Together.



AS WE TRANSITION INTO the 126th year of the 4th Degree of the Knights of Columbus and the 250th year of the United States, consider joining the Patriotic Degree in 2026. The Patriotic Degree is the more visible arm of the Knights of Columbus that helps support the growth of the entire Order. Examples of where the 4th degree can assist our Councils by being visible is at our Brother Knights funeral wakes and masses, being available to our Bishops and Priests when they request us, participating in parades and Honor Flights as well as Special Olympic events across the state.

I marvel at the events that we can participate in and see the faces of the families and people who are watching us. We have been present for confirmation masses, ordination masses, Chrism Masses to name just a few. We have participated in parades for the 4th of July, Memorial Day, Veterans Day and special Eucharistic processions like Corpus Christi, the Eucharistic revival, and Marches for Life. We are also visible to the public when we are not in uniform doing good deeds such as serving meals for the homeless, assisting veterans by going to veterans' centers to push wheelchairs, fundraising events to raise funds for Ultrasound machines, baby diaper drives, etc.

There is a story that I would like to repeat to you that comes through Brother Sir Knight Greg Cemke from the Wausau Assembly who also runs a charity called Christmas in July which assists the Children in the hospital at the Marshfield Clinic (among other things). He got to play Santa Claus in the Wausau Christmas Parade and at the completion of the parade, a young girl came up to him and asked if he could help grant her wish.

She didn't ask for toys or candy or friends. Her request: Santa, I want my mommy and daddy to get back together so we can be a family again! What a touching moment and locally, we have all said a prayer to help that little girl with her Christmas Wish. What this proves to me is that we—as Brother Knights and as Sir Knights—do make a difference in the lives of others.

Remember that we have an upcoming Patriotic Exemplification on January 17 in the Manitowoc Area on the Eastern side. Please recruit Brother Knights to become Sir Knights. There will be additional Patriotic exemplifications in April in De Pere (April 11) and in Marshfield (April 25). There may also be some local opportunities to become a Sir Knight. Please reach out to the Masters of your District.

Remember that the Patriotic degree is not separate from the Third Degree. We are all one body of Catholic men with a common purpose. The 4th degree is the Patriotic Degree, and we are watched over by District Masters at the state level. We are all under the jurisdiction of the State Deputy Patrick Reiff. Our message to the District Deputies to bring back to you the membership was this: We need all of you to consider joining the 4th degree. We have had over 500 men join the third degree since July 1, 2025. Let us now work to get these new Brother Knights to join the Patriotic Degree! And Sir Knights – please recruit men to join your local Councils!



HAPPY NEW YEAR! As we begin 2026 let's continue strengthening our Family through all our Family Programs. Please remember that while there are ten featured programs, a Council can submit their own versions of a "Family Activity." The key component is **family**.

To start the year out, the District Deputies who have received entries from Councils who are active with the "Keep Christ In Christmas" Poster Contest (entries were due from Council's by December 31). Please send all your 1st place entries to your Diocesan Program Director by January 15. Each Diocesan Program Director has to submit their 1st place winners from their Diocese to the State Family Director by January 31. To reiterate, there are five different levels of entries and they are as follows: Kindergarten, 1st & 2nd grade, 3rd & 4th grade, 5th & 6th grade and 7th & 8th grade. Remember to label each entry for proper evaluation. The Boys & Girls of Wisconsin have some fantastic art skills and I compliment all the entries for this very special youth-orientated program.

Moving along, please keep sending in your "Family of the Month" entry whenever it works for your Council. There are many wonderful families within our Parishes living their faith. Let's show them that their efforts are truly appreciated. A little bit of recognition goes a long way!

On a side note, continue planning and submit your "Family of the Year" entries ASAP. The cut-off date for a "Family of the Year" entry is **February 15**. 
Brother Knights I hope you all had a Holy and Merry Christmas and are enjoying the New Year. With the new year we historically make resolutions that some of us keep for the year but too often slip on as we return to our new ways. Allow me to make a few suggestions for resolutions for us as Knights:

1. Remember to fill out form #10784 within a week of completing a program.
2. Add one new Faith Program to your Council's Schedule.
3. Invite a non-member to every program your Council performs.
4. Make an effort to attend every Faith Program, your Council Sponsors.
5. Bring in one new member in the next fiscal year.

SILVER ROSE

I normally put this is at the bottom of the list since it is a Life Program, but I was just notified of the Changes for this year. The first big change is the new schedule gives us the Silver Rose from **Sunday, March 15**, where we receive it from Minnesota , until **Saturday, April 12**, when we transfer it to Iowa. This gives us only 2 ½ months to prepare for the Rose which I have already started. The other change is there is going to be an optional Tilma for each Jurisdiction, which I have requested. I will have more information on the Tilma next month.

The important point is the schedule is moving forward so I need requests from Councils that wish to support this program ASAP to create the new schedule. We have roughly 310 Councils in our State, yet last year we only received 36 requests with only 4 requests from Councils that did not have it the prior year. Where are the other 88% of our Councils? Get you request in to me ASAP send it to [me](#). I need your requests by February 1 st or sooner so I can email a rough schedule to you by February 15. This will hopefully allow the final schedule to be printed in the March newsletter. This is crunch time for us this year.



SACRED HEART OF JESUS ICON

Every District Deputy should now have a copy of the Icon schedule in his Diocese. We need to think ahead with this program. Review and estimate the material your council will need. Contact the Council before your council on the schedule as well as the one you will transfer it to at least a month in advance. Go to the Supreme Web site and review the detailed information. If you still have questions ask your DD for help. If he cannot help you either you or he should call me at 262-470-4477 or preferably email me.

If your Council did not get the Icon when you were scheduled or simply want it for another service please [email me](#). We will start a second rotation for councils that requested it right after this rotation is completed. Do not forget to fill out not only a #10784 but also the log book. Per a report I received, roughly a dozen 10784's were received for the Icon from Wisconsin. If the log book is missing, it can be printed from the Supreme Web site.

FEATURED FAITH PROGRAMS

There are Four Featured Faith Programs which give you double credit if you complete all the necessary requirements for this program. Details for these programs can be found on the Supreme web site.

Refund Support Vocations Program Councils are required to donate at least \$500 to an individual seminarian or religious aspirant. For every \$500 donated, Supreme will refund the council or assembly \$100, with a maximum refund of \$400 per individual supported. Report activity using the RSVP Refund Application (#2863).

Holy Hour Councils are required to hold at least four Holy Hours quarterly or organize and support two Holy Hours and at least one Eucharistic Procession. Report activity using the Program Report Form (#10784).

Into The Breach Councils are required to hold eight sessions to discuss the content of the original Into the Breach video series or apostolic exhortation (#340) or five sessions of Into the Breach: The Mission of the Family video series. Report activity using the Program Report Form (#10784).

Spiritual Reflection Councils are required to host or attend a Spiritual Reflection for the men of the council and the parish that is at least a day long and is attended by 10 men or 10% of your council, whichever is fewer. Report activity using the Program Report Form (#10784).

NEW FAITH PROGRAMS

Supreme is looking for new ways to not only attract more Religious Catholics to our Councils but to Spread our Faith and allow more options for our members to become closer to their Faith. One way of doing this is by introducing more programs encouraging our members. Details on these great programs can be found on the Supreme web site.





ON THE COVER: OUR LADY OF KNOCK

Almost one hundred and fifty years ago, fifteen villagers in Knock, Ireland, saw an altar with a cross and a Paschal Lamb surrounded by angels. Next to the altar was Mary along with St. John the Evangelist and St. Joseph. For two hours the apparitions stood there in silence. They didn't speak a single word. The witnesses of this apparition stayed there to pray a rosary. During that time, a storm passed through, but the area with the altar and the apparitions stayed completely dry. The Knock Shrine has since become a major pilgrimage site.
