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## STATE CEREMONIAL COORDINATOR MESSAGE JULY 2018

Ceremonials play an important part in building the fabric of our Order. They have since our founding in 1882. They teach the candidates important lessons. They also showcase what the Order is about, our principles, our symbols, and our laws and rules.

Ceremonials must be professionally presented. There is only one opportunity to make the intended impact upon the life of the candidate. What a candidate sees, on his degree day, is his first impression of the entire Order. The candidate sees activities and programs of his local council and comes to know the Council. When he comes to the Ceremonial, he learns who we really are. The Exemplification of our Ceremonials is like professional golf, we don't have Mulligan's or do overs. We only get one opportunity so, we need to take our best shot.

We are fortunate in Saskatchewan to have very dedicated and competent ceremonial teams. Our ceremonial teams compare favorably with the best teams in Canada. However, we need more teams. Candidates should not have to wait an extended amount of time for their degrees or need to travel long distances to attend a degree. We also need to advance First Degree members to their Second and Third Degrees in a timely manner.

We also need to advance more First Degree members to full Knighthood. Only 48% of the new members went on to take their Second and Third Degrees last year. It is a fact that the majority of members who are either suspended or withdraw from the Order are First Degree members.

SOLUTION:

- 1. One Admission Degree team for every district. These teams would either memorize their parts or work towards memorizing them.
- 2. Each Council would learn how to use the First Degree DVD. They would have the necessary First Degree paraphernalia and candidate kits and would practice delivering the Admission Degree effectively with the DVD.
- 3. One Formation team per Cluster. The teams would memorize and/or work towards memorizing their parts. They too would need to have the equipment and candidate kits for the Formation Degree.
- 4. Two more Conferring Officers. (A total of four in Saskatchewan.) Preparation for this role takes time so a prospective CO would need to begin preparation now.
- 5. Two more Presenters of the Fraternal Charge. (A total of four for Saskatchewan).

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To meet our membership goal for this year, we need a certain number of degrees. The number of degrees is directly proportional to the number of new members. This year, our membership goal has been increased to 325. We average 5 members per Admission Degree. Hence, we need to hold 65 Admission degrees this year, or 2.3 degrees per district and 5.4 degrees each month. To advance these First Degree members to Full Knighthood, we need to hold 38 Formation Degrees and 33 Knighthood Degrees or an average of 1.4 degrees per district and 3 degrees a month. Details of how I arrived at this calculation are found below.

## **Recruiter Incentives**

- Each recruiter who recruits 2 members between July 1<sup>st</sup> September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018 will receive a Father McGivney or Our Lady of Guadalupe Rosary.
- b. Each recruiter who recruits 3 members between July 1st September 30, 2018 will receive a Rosary and a Golf Shirt.
- c. Each recruiter who recruits 4 members between July 1<sup>st</sup> September 30, 2018 will receive a Rosary and a K of C Watch.
- d. Each recruiter who recruits 5 members between July 1<sup>st</sup> September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018 will receive a Rosary, a watch, a 50 dollar Gift Card for Knights Gear (Supreme Incentive) along with free shipping and a 25 dollar gift card for Knights Gear from Saskatchewan State Council.

## **District Deputy Incentive:**

e. Each District Deputy who promotes and works to hold a church drive with one of his councils between July 1st - September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018 with a minimum of 2 members recruited will receive a golf shirt. State Quick Start Action Plan in the July Knightline. The poster of information will be included. Grand Knights will be encouraged to post the poster on their Parish Bulletin Board and send it to their members.
  - c. The communications team will place the Poster and Quick Start Plan on the State Website and Social Media.
  - d. Following the State Organizational Meeting, DDs will contact all councils in their District to review with the GK the Quick Start information, and the church drive schedule.
  - e. Progress Status will be reviewed at the District Meetings and follow up phone calls to DDs will be made by the State Deputy and/or State Membership Director.
  - f. Progress REPORTS, PHOTOS, and a list of CHURCH DRIVES and RECRUITERS reaching targets will be posted on the State Website and in the monthly Knightline.
- The Roundtable Chairman will renew all Round tables in Sask. by Mid-October and will encourage all roundtables to participate in the Recruitment Quick Start Program.
- The Shining Armor Award will be promoted at the Organizational Meeting, as well as by the DDs, by the GKs and by mentors during all degrees.
- The Recruitment Mentorship Program will be implemented by the GK each time a new member is recruited.
- Insurance Promotion and Reactivation will be emphasized at the Organizational Meeting.
- The State General Program Director will work with the State Program Directors to come up with some ideas for "Family Parish Faith In Action" programs that can be conducted during the months of July, August and Sept. These events will provide opportunities to recruit volunteers and parishioners.
- A schedule of all degrees, summer quick start information, Supreme Recruitment training accessibility and pertinent information on membership

delivered at the Organizational meeting will be available on the State Website.

 During the Organizational Meeting on July 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> in the Battlefords, the DDs will be informed of the Strategic Action Plan for Membership and Programs and how they align with RECRUITMENT.

The DDs will schedule a District meeting in their District preferably no later than Aug, 15th.

The DD will deliver the membership goals and recruitment initiatives to the councils ASAP after the Organizational Meeting.

- The Retention Chairman will work with DDs and Councils to retain all members.
- 11.A list of Former Members of each council will be provided to DDs who will work with the councils on inviting these members back to the Order. A Welcome Back Letter signed by the State Deputy and Membership Director will be made available to DDs and councils to deliver to members who they feel would be reinstated or reactivated. (Sept. Initiative)
- Generic "Father Needs You" Letter will be provided to DDs at the Organizational Meeting. DDs will pass the letters to the Grand Knights at the District Meetings.
- Admission Degrees will be scheduled in each District and will be posted on the State Website.
- Pairs of "Two Man Recruiting Teams" will be established at the Organizational Meeting with a minimum of one scheduled Church Drive in each District.

#### Faith in Action: A New Model for a New Age

Starting on July 1st, the new program model "Faith in Action" will be in effect bringing a new focus on programs in four categories - Faith, Family, Community and Life. Faith in Action is straightforward and easy to implement. It provides all Knights the opportunity to do what they do best; stand shoulder to shoulder as a force for good in their home, parish, community and the world. Each council should appoint individual faith, family, community and life directors. There will no longer be a need to appoint a youth or council director. All Youth and Council categories have been consolidated into the Faith, Family and Community categories. No programs have been eliminated. Yes, there now is a change to the SP-7 - Columbian Award requirements. Councils now have to complete 4 programs in 4 categories instead of 4 programs in 6 categories. That means completing only 16 programs instead of 24 programs as in previous years. Supreme has introduced 9 new programs. Four of these are required programs - in each category there is 1 required program to earn the Columbian Award. With the 4 required programs - 1 in each category, councils now only have 12 more programs to do - 1 program/month. Supreme has kept all 8 featured programs as in previous years. Featured program used to count for the entire category in the SP-7, now it counts as 2 credits or 1/2 of the category.

### Safe Environment - Office of Youth Protection:

Under Faith in Action, certain state and council officers/chairmen are required to take the safe environment training and may also be required to provide authorization for a background check. In past years, the GK and Youth Director were the only ones who had to take the safe environment training. Now there are 4 people who need to be trained and 2 background checks. Safe environment training will be done by the GK, Program Director, Family Director and Community Director. Background checks will be done on the Family Director and Community Director. Please make sure you fill out your Form #365 correctly with names in these positions and with correct e-mail addresses. Supreme has put this training and background checks in place to protect the youth in our parishes and communities as well as the Knights in our councils. Let us all get our councils compliant early in order to continue our good works.

## STATE COUNCIL RECOGNITION PROGRAM

### ACTIVITY PROGRAM AWARDS:

Each year, the Activity Program Awards recognizes those councils conducting outstanding activities in each of the ten category activities:

Faith Activity, Family Activity, Community Activity, Life Activity, Council Activity, Youth Activity, Young Adult Activity, Membership Activity, Special Olympics Activity and PR/ Communications Activity.

Activity has to be submitted on the Council Activity Program Description Form and forwarded (electronically preferred) to the State General Program Director with copies to District Deputy and Council file no later than March 1, 2019.

Copy of the form can be located on the State website, <u>www.kofcsask.com</u>.

Councils can submit their reports to me, whether it be in electronic format or a hard copy. E-mail address is programs@kofcsask.com.

Activity Program Awards will be based on three levels:

- 1. Large Council over 80 members
- 2. Medium Council 51 to 80 members
- 3. Small Council under 50 members

Awards will be based upon the council that conducts well-rounded Faith in Action programs. Programs need to be conducted in each of the ten categories by the council from March 1, 2018 to March 1, 2019.

Judging will be based on:

- 1. Activity originality was this a new Faith in Action activity for the Council.
- 2. Nature of the activity was it a faith-filled program that attracted men and their families.
- 3. Participation of members in activity how many members and percent of membership participated?
- 4. Results what was the purpose of the activity? Did the results affect the Faith, Family, Community or Life aspect of the Church and/or community?

### ACTIVITY PROGRAM STATE-WIDE RECOGNITION

Each individual State Program Director (SPD) will be responsible for selecting the single best Faith, Family, Community, Life, Council, Youth, Young Adult, Membership, Special Olympics and PR/Communications total activities conducted by an individual council in the twelve month period between the state conventions. Each SPD will review their respective category Council Activity Program Description Form for completeness and accuracy. Each SPD will have control over what activities councils can claim on reports for their respective categories. Each SPD must establish a reason for disallowing an activity claimed in their respective category.

Plaques will be awarded to each council selected on the program effectiveness of the faithfilled program in each of the ten categories. All plaques will be handed out at the annual convention of the State Council.

## SUPREME/STATE COUNCIL SERVICE PROGRAM AWARDS:

Form STSP - State Council Service Program Awards Entry Form for Faith, Family, Community and Life. Complete and submit one form per entry per program, along with supporting documentation for each entry.

State/Supreme Council is looking for one activity that best exemplifies the best program conducted by the councils in each of the four categories - Faith, Family, Community and Life. Entries are judged first and foremost on program effectiveness. Award application content is also extremely important in conveying the effectiveness of the program. Submitting a quality entry will improve your council's chances of being selected as a State or Supreme winner. Describe in great detail the Service Program activity that you have chosen. Include pictures of Brother Knights and their families who were involved with the activity. The pictures should have a written narrative explaining what is contained in the picture. Councils can also include letters, newspaper clippings, pamphlets, etc.

The completed STSP form, with all supplementary material, can be submitted at any time during the year to the State General Program Director. State Council must receive the completed STSP Form no later than March 15, 2019.

To assist your council in preparing the STSP, please refer to the Service Program Awards Booklet (#10173). The booklet contains helpful suggestions and examples of how your council should submit its entry.

## **OVERALL PROGRAM AWARD - ONE PER CLUSTER AREA**

Council must fulfill all 8 of these requirements to be eligible of consideration for this award:

- 1. File Form 185 Report of Officers Chosen for the Term by June 30, 2018.
- 2. File Form 365 Service Program Personnel Report by August 1, 2018.
- 3. File Form 1728 Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity by January 31, 2019.
- 4. File Form 1295A Semi-Annual Council Audit Report for period ended June 30, 2018 by August 15, 2018.
- 5. File Form 1295B Semi-Annual Council Audit Report for period ended December 31, 2018 by February 15, 2019.
- 6. All State and Supreme bills paid.
- 7. Show membership increase.
- 8. Conduct at least four programs in each of the four major categories (Faith, Family, Community and Life). Four of these activities must be designated as a Supreme required program in each category.

### **OVERALL PROGRAM STATE-WIDE RECOGNITION**

One council in each of the six (6) State Cluster Areas will qualify for this award. The council must meet all 8 of the above listed requirements to be selected for the award. The State Deputy and State General Program Director will be responsible for selecting the Overall Program Award for each of the six cluster areas.

Plaques will be awarded to each council selected in each of the Cluster Areas for meeting all of the necessary requirements. Plaques will be handed out at the annual convention of the State Council.

## Father Michael J. McGivney Guild

Father McGivney's most dramatic response to the call for pastoral help was the founding of the Knights of Columbus, a fraternal benefit society that provided a haven for men who were looking for financial protection for their families and support in their faith. From the beginning Fr. McGivney encouraged his Knights to take a united stand in the public square that would not compromise their faith and help to support the common good. Led by the young parish priest, their concern was to carry out works of charity and to strengthen the fabric of family and community.

The Knights of Columbus founded the Guild in 1997, with the opening of the Archdiocesan phase of Fr. McGivney's cause for canonization.

The purpose of the Guild is to inspire greater personal holiness and cooperation with God's grace by sharing information about Fr. McGivney. The Guild's goal is to "spread the good word about Fr. McGivney's holiness of life, to encourage devotion to his memory, and to seek his intercession before the throne of God."

The Father McGivney Guild serves as a source of information about the life, works and spirituality of Fr. McGivney.

Membership in the Guild is free and open to all individuals and households, but not groups. Members of the Knights of Columbus are not automatically Guild members and must elect to join the Guild. All members can join online at this address:

Through his intercession, grant the favour I now present (here make your request). Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

These Brothers will be doing up monthly reports / reminders about each of their programs and what councils are asked and expected to do. These will be in the monthly Knightline under the Community heading.

This will be a learning process for me and guite possibly some of the chairmen. I know we will be doing the best job we can to help councils be as successful as they can.

I will try to give guidance where I can and assist to the best of my abilities. Supreme has deadlines for a large number of the programs and I will try to keep chairmen aware of what I know.

Below I will share some of the information that I put forward at the State Organizational meeting.

SOME UPCOMING IMPORTANT DATES TO NOTE FOR CHAIRMEN AND COUNCILS: Need to order your soccer challenge kits by the beginning of August. It is important to have your Youth Director contact the schools within your council's jurisdiction as soon as school starts in the fall so teachers will get a jump on getting their school's winners for the district competition. Be sure to set a date as soon as school starts for your district's competition and then also your regional competition. Coordinate with your fellow DD's within your region to set the regional date.

Soccer Participation form is due Dec. 1<sup>st</sup>.

To order the Knights of Columbus Soccer Challenge kit (#SC-Kit) use the order form on page 3 of the Council Report Forms Booklet (#1436). Complete and submit the form to the Department of Fraternal Services, 1 Columbus Plaza, New Haven, CT 06510-3326; Telephone: (203) 752-4016; Fax: (203)752-4108. This kit can also be ordered online at www.kofc.org/forms. You can also download the K of C soccer guide at https://www.kofc.org/un/en/forms/ programming/soccer-challenge4576.pdf

When you do your regional competition – be sure to have your winners kick off state kicks as well. And email the program chairman your results soon thereafter. He needs your different categories' winners; their mailing addresses and the parent or guardian's name. He also needs their council number and district number. State winner information needs to be off to Supreme by mid December.

Basketball Free Throw – be sure to order your kits by November 1<sup>st</sup>. Again, this kit can also be ordered online at www.kofc.org/forms.You can download the basketball free throw guide at <a href="https://www.kofc.org/un/en/forms/programming/free-throw-competition-guide1928.pdf">https://www.kofc.org/un/en/forms/programming/free-throw-competition-guide1928.pdf</a>

Again, it is important to have your Youth Director contact the schools within your council's jurisdiction as soon as you get the kits after Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> so teachers will get a jump on getting their school's winners for the district competition. Be sure to set a date ASAP for your district's competition and then also your regional competition. Coordinate with your fellow DD's within your region to set the regional date.

Just a side note – you can run more than one district competition at the same time – just takes some coordinating.

When you do your regional competition – be sure to have your winners throw state free throws as well. And email the chairman your results soon thereafter.

At both the BBFT and Soccer Competitions – be sure to have juice and donuts (or goodies) for the participants as well as your volunteers.

For both competitions, you will need assistance with set up, take down, judging.

For the BBFT I have a script that I read at the start of the competition to all of the participants and parents, etc. that are present. Just to ensure you don't have some irate people. If you want the script – email me and I will email it to you.

Design Against Drugs Poster Contest (formerly known as Substance Abuse Awareness Poster contest) - Need to order by September 1<sup>st</sup>. Again, all kits can be ordered online at <u>www.kofc.org/forms</u>

The Essay contest kits need to be ordered by September 1<sup>st</sup>. Again, all kits can be ordered online at <u>www.kofc.org/forms</u>

Participation forms for all the different programs are listed at <u>www.kofc.org/forms</u> and give their due dates. Please be mindful of that.

Coats for Kids is ongoing. You would want to order as early as possible so children get the coats prior to the winter. The State Board encourages all councils to order their coats through the SK State Charitable Foundation at <a href="http://www.saskkofcfoundation.com/category/coats-for-kids/">http://www.saskkofcfoundation.com/category/coats-for-kids/</a>

I am not sure if this is operational right now though. By ordering through the foundation – State is able to track the number of coats being ordered and councils also work towards fulfilling their Foundation obligations.

These are the programs I know about. As for the other ones in this directorship – I need to do more research on and ask the chairmen in those programs to send out the necessary information when required and seek assistance from the State Board and anyone else that may have the information.
