

June 2018 Reflection

SHARE The Family as Domestic Church and as Missionary Disciples

Dear Brother Knights,

From the time you were a toddler, your parents wanted to teach you how to share. Perhaps it was toys, a blanket or food. All your life you have been asked to share. So, what are you currently sharing with others today? Is it your time, your money, your talents? If we stop to think about it, everything you share with others is because someone shared it with you. Of course, you purchase things, acquire property, work for stuff, etc. but ultimately, whatever the explanation might be, God shared it with you through others!

Among so many material things there are those things we share that are immaterial in a sense, like our time. High on the list of gifts from God is the faith he has given you. We are called, above many other things, to share our faith with others. That is the call each of us received at baptism and as members of a family, a church parish as especially as a member of the Knights of Columbus. We are called to evangelize.

Our Supreme Chaplain, Archbishop Lori comments on Pope Paul VI, St. Pope John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis when he says,

Drawing together the teaching of the council, **Paul VI** described evangelization as the Church's core identity and mission. In short, the Church "exists in order to evangelize" (14). This mission is directed both toward people who have not yet heard the Good News and those who no longer practice their faith. Pope Paul called on all members of the Church, not just clergy and religious, to open their hearts more widely to the Lord and to actively share the faith with the searching and the straying alike.

Following his predecessors, **St. John Paul II** called for a "new evangelization" — not new in content, for "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Heb 13:8) — but new "in its ardor, methods, and expression."

Pope Benedict XVI, like those before him, emphasized that evangelization entails an opening of the heart. It involves becoming agents of the Holy Spirit, helping people have a profound experience of Jesus and his love — a love that opens them to the Word of God, the sacraments, virtuous living and ultimately their vocation to holiness.

Evangelization is also clearly central to the pontificate of **Pope Francis**, who penned Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel). He speaks of the urgency of this mission and calls each one of us and our parishes and church institutions to "missionary conversion" (30). He challenges bishops and priests to take the lead in creating dioceses and parishes that are on fire with the mission of spreading the Gospel. He challenges religious women and men "to wake up the world" by their witness to the kingdom of God. And he challenges laypeople to engage robustly in this mission in their families and daily work.

This year as we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit will indeed fill you with more grace. Your spiritual growth and insights, your prayers and acts of faith, as modest as they may be, are something the Holy Spirit wants you to share with others. Share about your prayer life. Share about the joy you experience when you participate in the sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation. Share about your struggles and doubt, support from family, friends and parish, about your fears, about your successes, about reading scripture and about the spiritual food that sustains you – that ever precious relationship you have with Jesus. counting on you. Missionary Disciples that are formed in your parish and in your Councils are counting on you. The Holy Spirit is counting on you. As you share, you evangelize.

If you want to talk MEMBERHIP, not only is this an ongoing effort of Knights of Columbus for the order, but so too, it is the concern of every parish. Others in the parish are relying on you to show them how to invite others to be members of the parish as well as the order. Membership is not just a name on a roster. It is evangelization. It is an invitation to know Jesus. Being a member of the Body of Christ is really what membership is all about. It is everything!

- The SP7 also needs to be submitted to Supreme, the SD, to the DD, and to forms@kofcsask.com by June 25th. This is an award that most councils can achieve, but the form needs to be filled out and submitted to Supreme.
- I remind all Grand Knights to talk to your council Chaplains about the Priest's Sports Days in Muenster on July 16th and 17th. The council is asked to pay the expenses for the chaplain to attend and to accompany him to Muenster if you can.
- State Golf will be held in Spiritwood on June 22, 23 and 24. Please support the State Golf; come out for some fun and fraternity.

As one Columbian year comes to an end, we prepare for the next year.

- Remember the Summer Organizational Meeting will be held in the Battlefords on July 6th, 7th, and 8th. Registration forms have been sent out to all those who are required to attend. The focus of the meeting will be on District Deputy Training and on developing District plans for the 2018-2019 Columbian year. 
May 10- June 30th, 2018

REMINDER: Recruiter Incentive for the Year ending June 30th, 2018


Knights who recruit 8 new members between July 1st, 2017 and June 30th, 2018 will receive a Knights of Columbus watch or a jacket of equal value.

January 31 - Verify that your council has completed and submitted the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (#1728) to the Supreme Council office. If you have not already done so, send in your survey before it's too late! The form is available at kofc.org/forms or in the Council Reports Forms booklet (#1436). This form is a requirement for "Star Council" award. June 30 - Columbian Award Application (#SP-7), Annual Report - Knights of Columbus Round Table (#2630), Food for Families Reimbursement Program Refund & Plaque Application (#10057) and the Application for Refund Support Vocations Program (#2863). All forms are available on Supreme website kofc.org.

July 1 - Report of Officers Chosen (#185).

Columbian Award Application (#SP-7). To the councils that have already completed and sent this form into Supreme, Thank You very much. To all remaining councils, you should be working on completing and sending the form into Supreme in the next couple of weeks. Supreme needs to have received the form no later than June 30. Form SP-7 is available on the Supreme website - kofc.org/forms or through Officers Online. Copy of this form is also included in this newsletter.

In order to qualify for the Columbian Award, your councils must:

- 1. Annually conduct and report <u>at least four (4) major involvement programs</u> in each of the sections Church Activities, Community Activities, Council Activities, Culture of Life Activities, Family Activities and Youth Activities. **Additionally, a minimum of four (4) of these programs must be designated as Domestic Church activities.** Domestic Church activities can be attributed to any category and there can be multiple Domestic Church activities conducted in a single category. Make sure you check the box on the left hand side if it is a Domestic Church Activity. Please visit kofc.org/domesticchurch for a list of qualifying programs. **There are a total of 24 items to be reported.**
 - 2. Have had submitted the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (#1728), originally due January 31, 2017.
 - 3. Have submitted the Service Program Personnel Report (#365), originally due August 1, 2017.

If your council conducts a featured program in any category, ensure that the program's minimum requirements are met in order to receive credit for all four activities in that category. The minimum requirements for each featured program are located in the Surge with Service (#962) manual.

Faith in Action: A New Model for a New Age

Surge with Service was introduced as a program model nearly 50 years ago. Now a new program model called Faith in Action will take effect with the 2018-2019 fraternal year. The model is a simplified program structure that will help align and organize council programs, making it a more relevant model for every council. The updated program model will:

- Be the umbrella for all Supreme Council recommended programs.
- Consist of four categories: Faith, Family, Community and Life.
- Better integrate Domestic Church programs, making them foundational to council life. Reduce the number of programs required to earn the Columbian Award to 16 (four programs in four categories).
- Introduce nine new programs.

More detailed information will be available in the next issue of Knightline.

Building the Domestic Church While Strengthening Our Parish

Continue to promote this initiative through your Council programs. The goal in Building the Domestic Church is to strengthen our Parishes. The need for us to get involved in the renewal of parish and family life. There are many project ideas that can help promote council member fraternity and possibly attract new members to the Knights of Columbus. Continue to work on these Building the Domestic Church program initiatives throughout the year. Refer to the Supreme website at www.kofc.org/Domestic Church to review the most up-to-date list of programs and activities.

Summer is fast approaching and so are holidays and vacations. Think about how your council can help out in your Church and Community this summer. Your Parish Priest will continue with daily and weekly Sunday Masses, we as Knights should also continue our good works throughout the summer.






