

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS UNIVERSITY -- PART 10 A LEGACY OF LEADERSHIP

(Some excerpts from the *Columbia Magazine* and *Fraternal Advisor*)

The Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus (simply referred to as the Supreme Knight) is the title of the chairman of the board and chief executive officer of the Knights of Columbus.

Since its founding in 1882, there have been thirteen Supreme Knights. A chapter in Knights of Columbus will soon come to a close with the retirement of the 13th Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson, who has held that position since October 1, 2000. Reaching the mandatory retirement age of 70 for Supreme Officers, he will retire at the end of February 2021.

Supreme Knight Anderson has brought a wealth of gifts and perspective to his leadership of the Order. Carl Anderson joined the leadership of the Knights of Columbus after a distinguished career as a public servant and educator. He served as vice president for public policy and supreme secretary before taking office as the 13th Supreme Knight. Under his leadership, the Order surpassed two million members and \$100 billion of life insurance in force, and expended internationally for the first time in a century. His signature initiatives have included the Saint John Paul II National Shrine, the Ultrasound Initiative, Building the Domestic Church, and a landmark campaign in support of persecuted Christians.

Supreme Knight Anderson has led the Knights of Columbus to new heights of charity, membership and insurance growth to further the Order's founding mission and legacy of servants to Catholic families, the church and society.

The Supreme Directors met virtually and announced that Deputy Supreme Knight Patrick E. Kelley was elected to succeed Supreme Knight Anderson as the 14th Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus and will assume leadership of the Order as of March 1st. Supreme Knight Anderson offered the following comments on his successor: "We will be truly blessed to have Patrick Kelly assume leadership of the Order. His knowledge, experience and devotion to the faith make him exceedingly well-suited to continue our mission in these challenging times. I could not be more enthusiastic about transferring my duties to Brother Kelly."

On January 29, 2021 Supreme Knight Carl Anderson was honored with the 2021 Pro-Life Legacy Award during the 39th annual March for Life Rose Dinner, which was held virtually this year. The award recognizes the Supreme Knight's lifetime of leadership in defense of the unborn.

For the past two decades, Supreme Knight Anderson has been an ardent and articulate advocate for religious freedom, both nationally and internationally and has authored a book entitled *These Liberties We Hold Sacred: Essays on Faith and Citizenship in the 21st Century*, which is a collection of his most compelling speeches, essays and articles in defense of this "first freedom" and about the role of faith in public life. The book is available at knightsgear.com.

Our appreciation and best wishes to Supreme Knight Anderson for a happy, healthy retirement, and congratulations and best wishes to the new Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly.
