



2013 Religious Affiliation of Hispanics


Using Pew Research's standard survey question about religion, % of Hispanic adults who identify today as ...

Fraternal Benefit Society

- Officially chartered in 1882 as a fraternal benefit society, rooted in the principles of charity, unity & fraternity.
- The Order was formed to render financial assistance to members & their families.
- Thanks to the initial mission & vision of Fr. McGivney, the Order has achieved so much to date.



A Place for Protection

- In 1882, all members were "insured" and all paid into that coverage for their brothers and their families.
- When a Knight died or became sick, money was available.
- From this simple system, our Order grew by leaps and bounds because Catholic men saw the value in it.
- They could not get this type of protection anywhere else.



Global Mission

- The Order's mission remains that same: protect members and their beneficiaries.
- The success in this mission allows the Order to support Catholic and other charitable causes worldwide.
- Without the insurance program, none of this would be possible.



Membership Retention: Follow the Process

- 1. First and Second Billing Notices are sent to members
- 2. Financial Secretary sends delinquent list to retention committee
- 3. Retention Committee assigns member to contact
- 4. Retention committee compile report (using form on State Website)
- 5. Financial Secretary sends Knight Alert letter to all delinquent members
- 6. District Deputy is notified of Retention results and of all documentation of used by Retention Committee



Membership Retention: Follow the Process

- 7. DD notifies State Retention Chairman and conduct due diligence
- 8. State Deputy reviews recommendation to determine concurrences
- 9. DD provides feedback to Council on next action, either:
 - a. Process Intent to Retain on all or some delinquent members; or
 - b. Correct identified deficiencies as directed by the District Deputy and State Deputy
- 10. Council completes requested action based on feedback
- 11. If Intent to Retain are files with Membership Records mandatory 60 day hold is in place, meanwhile council/district continue to work delinquency list







Food for Families



- Contact your local parish food pantry, community food bank or soup kitchen to ensure they will be able to receive food donations and inquire if they have any specific needs.
- Obtain permission from the appropriate person (pastor, business owner(s), etc.) to set up the food drive at the church or store and to display posters.
- Ask nearby retail stores for empty boxes so there is a place to store donations.
- ➤ If the council is conducting the Food Drive at the parish, have flyers available for distribution or placed in the pews announcing the details of the Food Drive.
 - Ask the pastor for permission to make an announcement before or after Mass about the Food Drive.
 - Be sure to include a written announcement in the parish bulletin.
 - For monetary donations, be sure to have a secure receptacle in the collection area for cash and checks.



Rhode Island Right to Life's mission is to advocate for a state, nation and world in which the innocent lives of the unborn, the disabled, the elderly, and the ill are cherished by the citizenry and protected by civil law.

Each year, since 1970, we lobby for legislation that advances the cause of the Sanctity of Human Life at both the state and federal levels.

POLITICAL ACTION

RIRTL has state and federal political action committees. This allows us to identify, support, and endorse pro-life candidates for our membership.

RIGHT TO LIFE EDUCATION

RIRTL holds conferences and gives talks to groups from churches and other organizations that have an interest in the pro-life issues. Through our Education Fund, we maintain a comprehensive library of books, pamphlets, and videos on pro-life issues.

The "Knights of Columbus Baby Bottle Campaign" (also called a "Baby Bottle Boomerang") is a drive to collect funds to support culture of life initiatives at the local level. In this program, empty baby bottles are distributed to individuals or families to deposit their loose change, checks, or paper money, and the filled bottles are returned after a set period of time, such as a few days or several weeks.

Suggestions on how to conduct a "Knights of Columbus Baby Bottle Campaign are on the KofC.org website.

Ask the organization you are donating to permission to send a photo and press release about the donation to the local media. Try to avoid a "grip and grin" type presentation photo. Instead, send a photograph of people at the center sorting or using the donated items.

Return the bottles to the pregnancy care center or store the bottles safely for use during your next campaign.

Best Practices for Council Compliance with Diocesan Safe Environment Programs FINANCIAL SECRETAIES SHOULD:

- Create and maintain a current list of all members who have completed diocesan safe environment requirements
 Be prepared to share these lists with the diocesan/parish safe environment coordinators upon request.

Best Practices for Council Compliance with Diocesan Safe Environment Programs

- Being a member does NOT constitute volunteer activity.
- Membership does NOT require volunteer activity on parish property.
- Council meeting on parish property are limited to catholic men over the age of 18 and are NOT a parish ministry.

- Members in certain youth leader roles who do not comply within 45 days are deemed ineligible to serve as a youth leader and will be removed.
- Grand Knights will be advised of the ineligibility and will have the option to appoint a new member to the role.
